ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS



CONSENT SITE - Sheffield Wednesday Football Club - Leppings Lane

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the renewal of a consent to street trade.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council as a Licensing Authority have power under the provision of the 1982 Act to regulate Street Trading in the City.
- 2.2 A Street Trading Consent is required to trade on any Street (which includes roads, footways, forecourts, or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City Boundary.
- 2.3 The Licensing Committee at it's meeting of 29th January 2002 passed the following resolution:
 - 1. That under the provisions of schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982:
 - all streets (which includes roads, footways, forecourts or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City boundary, shall be designated consent streets and;
 - (b) such street trading designation shall take effect as from the 1st April 2002; and
 - (c) all previous designations in relation to street trading will be rescinded as a result of the designation set out above.
 - The effect of this resolution is that from 1st April 2002, it will be an offence to
 engage in street trading in any street or any other place identified in the above
 resolution without being authorised to do so by consent from the City Council.
- 2.4 A Local Authority may attach conditions to a Street Trading Consent. The conditions may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street and danger to persons using the street or nuisance or annoyance.
- 2.5 A Street Trading Consent may only be granted for a maximum period of twelve months.

2.6 There is no appeal procedure against the refusal or revocation of a consent. An applicant may, however apply for judicial review of the Council's decision.

3.0 THE APPLICATION

- 3.1 The applicants are Mr and Mrs Judge and a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 'A'.
- 3.2 The application is to sell hot and cold food and hot and cold drinks during Sheffield Wednesday 1st team home fixtures, friendly's and internationals.
- 3.3 The applicants trade from a site on Leppings Lane. A copy of the location of the site is attached at Appendix 'B'.

4.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL





Andy,

I have been asked to make some comment in relation to the siting of a burger van on Leppings Lane, adjacent to the area we call the "apron" during football fixtures at Hillsborough Stadium from a policing perspective.

To support the comments I am making here I can say I am both Initial Public Order Commander and Advanced Public Order Commander accredited through the National Policing Improvement Agency. This effectively means I am qualified to act as a Bronze and silver Commander at public events. In addition I am qualified in the NPIA Policing Events course and have attended to the Operation Planning Course for Police officers.

I have extensive experience in policing football in the City of Sheffield and have performed the bronze role both inside and outside Hillsborough stadium on many occasions in recent years.

The Apron at Leppings Lane has particular challenges in relation to the policing of football at Hillsborough. The geography relating to access and egress of supporters attending the fixtures means that the apron area and the Leppings Lane area immediately adjacent to the apron is a particular point of potential conflict between rival fans due to the home fans using this route to both the north and south stands and the away fans accessing the west stand of the stadium. These points are particularly notable at the times just before kick off and post final whistle when all fans tend to leave and mix in this area which forms a funnel as the supporters enter onto Leppings Lane.

In lower categories of fixtures this is a concern but as the threat of public order rises this area requires large numbers of uniform police officers to ensure that violence does not break out at this location. This is to such an extent that CBRN barriers were deployed in this area last season to assist keeping the rival factions apart at some fixtures. With the promotion of the club we anticipate there will be a higher likelihood of threat this season tan last season.

The issue is compounded due to the fact the only viable place to put the away fans coaches is on Leppings Lane opposite the Apron which also require higher levels of policing as the threat from the fixture rises.

Our primary tactic at this area post match is to try maintain the peace where the fans are highly concentrated at the exit to the apron through the deployment of uniform police officers. This is with the intention of allowing all fans to move away form the area so that they are less likely to come into contact and conflict, to load the away fans as quickly as possible and remove the coaches form the Leppings Lane area. As the threat lowers on Leppings Lane we can then redeploy police resources to other potential hotspots such as the tramstops and Hillsborough Corner for example.

The presence of a burger van on Leppings Lane near to the Apron has the potential to frustrate these tactics in several ways:

Firstly it limits the space available for fans to move away from the area and I would not want the exit of the apron to be narrower in any way.



Secondly the presence of a burger van will naturally attract people who want to buy burgers thus creating a large grouping of fans who whilst may be of low threat create a blockage on the road whilst impedes free flow and restricts some police deployments.

Thirdly it slows down the loading of the away coaches as people wait to buy and eat burgers etc before they board the coaches which means we would have to police that area longer than necessary in some instances.

In light of the above issues it would be my preference if any burger van, or other service that delayed people leaving this area, was further away from the point where the apron meets Leppings Lane. In some ways this would assist by giving some people an incentive to move away from the area quicker.

In making these comments I am aware that at many fixtures I have policed there has been a burger van in this area and often there have been no issues, however given a preference particularly with the new season approaching in the Championship division this would be my preference from a policing perspective.

Steve,

I understand that a Street Trading Consent application meeting is taking place on 16th August 2012 in a committee room at the Town Hall.

As you are aware this matter was a discussion item at the last SAG meeting on 13th July, and both the club and SYP raised concerns for public safety on match days regarding the site for this unit.

During last season the club installed additional CCTV cameras on the Wet Stand to provide better coverage of the Leppings Lane apron and views down Leppings Lane where visiting supporters coaches are parked on match days.

However, we have established that with this unit in place camera views are obscured which may interfere with the police and club match day safety operation.

Further, with the promotion to the Championship we are anticipating much larger visiting supporters groups with, in some cases, a likelihood of disorder in this area and we feel that the unit in this pitch will create problems for the stewarding and policing of the area.

I would therefore raise an objection to this unit in this position.

APPENDIX 'F'

STREET TRADING CONSENT APPLICATION

SUB-COMMITTEE HEARING PROCEDURE

This procedure has been drawn up to assist those parties attending Street Trading Consent Committee hearings.

- 1. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.
- 2. The Chair will ask the applicants and interested parties to formally introduce themselves.
- 3. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 4. Hearing Procedure:-
 - (a) The Licensing Officer will introduce the report.
 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
 - (c) The applicant/consent holder (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (d) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the applicant and/or his/her representative.
 - (e) Consultees / interested parties will be invited to present their representations or elect a spokesperson (which may be a Councillor) to speak on their behalf. New representations must not be raised.
 - (f) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the consultees / interested parties.
 - (g) The consultees / interested parties will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (h) The applicant will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for Members to take legal advice and consider the application.
 - (k) Once a decision has been reached, all parties will be invited to return. The Sub-Committee's decision and reasons will be announced by the Chair.
 - (I) The Sub-Committee's decision will be confirmed in writing to the applicant and those parties who made representations.
 - NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
 - 2) The Committee Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.

There is no right of appeal against the Council's decision to refuse to grant or revoke a Street Trading Consent.

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
