ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

New standards arrangements were introduced by the Localism Act 2011. The new regime made changes to the way that members' interests are registered and declared.

If you are present at a meeting of the Council, of its executive or any committee of the executive, or of any committee, sub-committee, joint committee, or joint sub-committee of the authority, and you have a **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest** (DPI) relating to any business that will be considered at the meeting, you must not:

- participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your Disclosable Pecuniary Interest during the meeting, participate further in any discussion of the business, or
- participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

These prohibitions apply to any form of participation, including speaking as a member of the public.

You must:

- leave the room (in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct)
- make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of any DPI at any
 meeting at which you are present at which an item of business which affects or
 relates to the subject matter of that interest is under consideration, at or before
 the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes
 apparent.
- declare it to the meeting and notify the Council's Monitoring Officer within 28 days, if the DPI is not already registered.

If you have any of the following pecuniary interests, they are your **disclosable pecuniary interests** under the new national rules. You have a pecuniary interest if you, or your spouse or civil partner, have a pecuniary interest.

- Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain, which you, or your spouse or civil partner, undertakes.
- Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from your council or authority) made or provided within the relevant period* in respect of any expenses incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

*The relevant period is the 12 months ending on the day when you tell the Monitoring Officer about your disclosable pecuniary interests.

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- Any contract which is made between you, or your spouse or your civil partner (or a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest) and your council or authority -
 - under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and
 - which has not been fully discharged.
- Any beneficial interest in land which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, have and which is within the area of your council or authority.
- Any licence (alone or jointly with others) which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, holds to occupy land in the area of your council or authority for a month or longer.
- Any tenancy where (to your knowledge) -
 - the landlord is your council or authority; and
 - the tenant is a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest.
- Any beneficial interest which you, or your spouse or your civil partner has in securities of a body where -
 - (a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of your council or authority; and

(b) either

- the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or
- if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

Under the Council's Code of Conduct, members must act in accordance with the Seven Principles of Public Life (selflessness; integrity; objectivity; accountability; openness; honesty; and leadership), including the principle of honesty, which says that 'holders of public office have a duty to declare any private interests relating to their public duties and to take steps to resolve any conflicts arising in a way that protects the public interest'.

If you attend a meeting at which any item of business is to be considered and you are aware that you have a **personal interest** in the matter which does not amount to a DPI, you must make verbal declaration of the existence and nature of that interest at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent. You should leave the room if your continued presence is incompatible with the 7 Principles of Public Life.

You have a personal interest where –

- a decision in relation to that business might reasonably be regarded as affecting
 the well-being or financial standing (including interests in land and easements
 over land) of you or a member of your family or a person or an organisation with
 whom you have a close association to a greater extent than it would affect the
 majority of the Council Tax payers, ratepayers or inhabitants of the ward or
 electoral area for which you have been elected or otherwise of the Authority's
 administrative area, or
- it relates to or is likely to affect any of the interests that are defined as DPIs but are in respect of a member of your family (other than a partner) or a person with whom you have a close association.

Guidance on declarations of interest, incorporating regulations published by the Government in relation to Disclosable Pecuniary Interests, has been circulated to you previously, and has been published on the Council's website as a downloadable document at -http://councillors.sheffield.gov.uk/councillors/register-of-councillors-interests

You should identify any potential interest you may have relating to business to be considered at the meeting. This will help you and anyone that you ask for advice to fully consider all the circumstances before deciding what action you should take.

In certain circumstances the Council may grant a **dispensation** to permit a Member to take part in the business of the Authority even if the member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest relating to that business.

To obtain a dispensation, you must write to the Monitoring Officer at least 48 hours before the meeting in question, explaining why a dispensation is sought and desirable, and specifying the period of time for which it is sought. The Monitoring Officer may consult with the Independent Person or the Council's Standards Committee in relation to a request for dispensation.

REPORT OF THE CHIEF LICENSING OFFICER, HEAD OF LICENSING TO THE LICENSING SUB COMMITTEE.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT 1982 STREET TRADING - MOBILE

Raja Rafaqat Khan - MOBILE STREET TRADING CONSENT.

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider a Mobile Street Trading Consent following several breaches of the conditions by the consent holder, Raja Rafagat Khan.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council have power under the provision of the 1982 Act to regulate Street Trading in the City.
- 2.2 A Street Trading Consent is required to trade on any Street (which includes roads, footways, forecourts, or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City Boundary.
- 2.3 The Licensing Committee at it's meeting of 29th January 2002 passed the following resolution:
 - 1. That under the provisions of schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982:
 - (a) all streets (which includes roads, footways, forecourts or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City boundary, shall be designated consent streets and;
 - (b) such street trading designation shall take effect as from the 1st April 2002; and
 - (c) all previous designations in relation to street trading will be rescinded as a result of the designation set out above.
 - 2. The effect of this resolution is that from 1st April 2002, it will be an offence to engage in street trading in any street or any other place identified in the above resolution without being authorised to do so by consent from the City Council.
- 2.4 A Local Authority may attach conditions to a Street Trading Consent. The conditions may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street and danger to persons using the street or nuisance or annoyance.
- 2.5 A Street Trading Consent may only be granted for a maximum period of twelve months.

3.0 THE CONSENT

- 3.1 Raja Rafaqat Khan is the holder of a Mobile Street Trading Consent, to trade city wide.
- 3.2 A copy of the consent and Mobile Street Trading conditions are attached at Appendix 'A'.

4.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 4.1 Raja Rafaqat Khan has on three separate occasions been observed breaching the conditions of his mobile street trading consent, by both officers from the Licensing Service and by a local Councillor.
- 4.2 Raja Rafaqat Khan has received warnings from the Licensing Service regarding the breaches of conditions.
- 4.3 Licensing Officers have been required to spend a considerable amount of time investigating the complaints and seeking evidence to support the complaints.

5.0 BACKGROUND

- 5.1 Members should note that the Sheffield City Council Street Trading Policy has been amended following a full consultation and there are now additional conditions, which have been added to the Street Trading Policy in relation to Mobile Street Trading Consent holders for fruit/vegetables and other traders and which are now in force. Condition 2 of The Mobile Street Trading Consent Conditions Fruit / vegetables and other traders states that;
 - 2. Mobile consent holders are not permitted to trade within an 800 metre radius of any static traders, other mobile traders, or shops, trading in similar goods / articles.
- 5.2 A copy of the Council's Street Trading Policy is available via the following link; https://www.sheffield.gov.uk/business-economy/licensing/general-licensing/retail/street-trading.html. Members should note that the age restriction of 5 years for motorised vehicles is under review and is not presently being enforced.
- 5.3 Officers from the Licensing Service observed Raja Rafaqat Khan street trading from his vehicle on South View Crescent on 10th April 2013, within an 800m radius of shops selling similar articles to him such as fruit and vegetables. Officers from the Licensing Service spoke with Raja Rafaqat Khan, whilst he was trading on South View Crescent and also wrote to him of which a copy of the letter is attached at Appendix 'B'.
- 5.4 The Licensing Service received a report from Councillor Nikki Bond on 1st May 2013, detailing that Councillor Nikki Bond had observed Raja Rafaqat Khan street trading on Glover Road on 1st May 2013 at 4.45pm, within an 800m radius of shops selling similar articles to him such as fruit and vegetables. The Licensing Service wrote to Raja Rafaqat Khan on 7th May 2013, informing him of the report made by Councillor Nikki Bond and to also invite him into the Licensing Service to discuss the matter further. A copy of the letter sent to Raja Rafaqat Khan and the report received from Councillor Nikki Bond are attached at Appendix 'C'.

- Raja Rafaqat Khan attended the Licensing Service on 14th May 2013 to discuss the above further and during which Raja Rafaqat Khan agreed to sign a caution, which would be placed on his file. A copy of the caution is attached to the report at Appendix 'D'. Officers explained to Raja Rafaqat Khan at the meeting on 14th May 2013, that should he be observed again breaching any of the conditions relating to his Mobile Street Trading Consent, then his Mobile Street Trading Consent would be placed before the Licensing Committee of the Council for the members of the committee to consider the breaches of the conditions and whether to take any action with regards to the future of the consent.
- Officers from the Licensing Service observed Raja Rafaqat Khan street trading on Ferras Road on 17th June 2013, within an 800m radius of shops selling similar articles to him such as fruit and vegetables, during which officers again spoke with him, and following which a further letter was sent to Raja Rafaqat Khan on 19th June 2013. A copy of the letter is attached at Appendix 'E'
- 5.7 Raja Rafaqat Khan and Councillor Bond, have been invited to attend the Licensing Committee hearing. Copies of the invites are attached at Appendix 'F'.
- 6.0 APPEALS
- 6.1 There is no appeal procedure against the refusal or revocation of a consent. An applicant may, however apply for judicial review of the Council's decision.
- 7.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS
- 7.1 There are no financial implications for the Council arising from this report.
- 8.0 RECOMMENDATIONS
- 8.1 That members consider all the relevant information.
- 9.0 OPTIONS OPEN TO THE COMMITTEE
- 9.1 To revoke the Street Trading Consent.
- 9.2 To defer the matter for further consideration.
- 9.3 To issue a further warning to Raja Rafagat Khan.

Mobile Street Trading Consent Conditions Fruit / vegetables and other traders

- 1. Mobile consent holders are not permitted to remain static for more than 15 minutes, and cannot return to the same site within the week (site refers to an 800 metre radius).
- 2. Mobile consent holders are not permitted to trade within a 800 metre radius of any static traders, other mobile traders, or shops, trading in similar goods / articles.
- 3. Any consent issued for a mobile street trader does not permit the holder to trade within an 800 metre radius of the Sheffield Arena, Don Valley Stadium, Sheffield Wednesday and Sheffield United Stadiums on any event / match day (see attached plan) for four hours previous, during and one hour after any event.
- 4. Mobile traders must not in any circumstance unload items for sale off the unit for display on the footpath, highway or any other area.
- 5. Mobile traders can only trade between the hours of 9am to 7pm Monday to Friday inclusive.
- 6. Mobile traders are only permitted to trade in the areas listed on their consents.
- 7. Mobile traders must ensure that any stopping position does not infringe any parking or traffic requirements or cause obstruction of the highway, and does not present any dangers to other road users or pedestrians.
- 8. Mobile traders must not stop within 800 metres of any school from an hour before the start of the school day until an hour after the end of the school day.

PLEASE NOTE, for the purposes of these conditions the "Council" shall be defined as the Licensing Service.

During a routine enforcement exercise on 10th April 2013, my colleague and I observed your vehicle registration X 805 PJW parked on South View Crescent at 10.40am, from which you were street trading.

My colleague and I spoke with you following our observations to explain to you that the Sheffield City Council Street Trading Policy has been amended following a full consultation and there are now additional conditions, which have been added to the Street Trading Policy in relation to Mobile Street Trading Consent holders for fruit/vegetables and other traders and which are now in force. We explained to you that Condition 2 of The Mobile Street Trading Consent Conditions Fruit / vegetables and other traders states that;

2. Mobile consent holders are not permitted to trade within an 800 metre radius of any static traders, other mobile traders, or shops, trading in similar goods / articles.

We also explained to you that there are a number of shops located in the immediate area in which you were trading, which sell similar goods to yourself, such as fruit and vegetables and these shops are located within an 800 metre radius of the location were you were trading from. Therefore I must inform you that should you continue to trade at any location in Sheffield, which is within an 800 metre radius of any static traders, other mobile traders, or shops, trading in similar goods / articles, then you will be in breach of the Mobile Street Trading Consent Conditions.

I must inform you that due to the number of complaints that we receive with regards to mobile street traders flouting the Street Trading Consent Conditions, officers from the Licensing Service will carry out proactive enforcement duties to seek out street traders who fail to comply with the Street Trading Consent Conditions relevant to them. If officers observe you again trading in breach of any of the Street Trading Consent Conditions, you will be invited into the Licensing Service for a formal warning, which will be placed on your file. Should you continue to breach any of the Street Trading Consent Conditions, following a formal caution, then evidence of such breaches will be placed before the Licensing Committee of the Council with a view to the possible revocation of your mobile street trading consent and/or a possible prosecution against you.

2. Mobile consent holders are not permitted to trade within an 800 metre radius of any static traders, other mobile traders, or shops, trading in similar goods / articles.



1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a Static Street Trading consent.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council as a Licensing Authority have power under the provision of the 1982 Act to regulate Street Trading in the City.
- 2.2 A Street Trading Consent is required to trade on any Street (which includes roads, footways, forecourts, or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City Boundary.
- 2.3 The Licensing Committee at it's meeting of 29th January 2002 passed the following resolution:
 - 1. That under the provisions of schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982:
 - all streets (which includes roads, footways, forecourts or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City boundary, shall be designated consent streets and;
 - (b) such street trading designation shall take effect as from the 1st April 2002; and
 - (c) all previous designations in relation to street trading will be rescinded as a result of the designation set out above.
 - 2. The effect of this resolution is that from 1st April 2002, it will be an offence to engage in street trading in any street or any other place identified in the above resolution without being authorised to do so by consent from the City Council.
- 2.4 A Local Authority may attach conditions to a Street Trading Consent. The conditions may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street and danger to persons using the street or nuisance or annoyance.
- 2.5 A Street Trading Consent may only be granted for a maximum period of twelve months.

2.6 There is no appeal procedure against the refusal or revocation of a consent. An applicant may, however apply for judicial review of the Council's decision.

3.0 THE APPLICATION

- 3.1 The applicant is Raja Rafaqat Khan and a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 'A'.
- 3.2 The application was submitted on 31st May 2013.
- 3.3 The application is to sell Fruit, Vegetables, Toilet Paper, Eggs and Spices.

4.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

4.1 Objection to the application has been received from Councillor Nikki Bond and local businesses.

5.0 BACKGROUND

- 5.1 Raja Rafaqat Khan submitted an application for a Static Street Trading consent on 31st May 2013. Raja Rafaqat Khan currently holds a City Wide Mobile Consent, which expires on 31st March 2014.
- 5.2 The application was circulated, in the usual manner, to South Yorkshire Police, South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, Highways and Planning on 3rd June 2013. Notices were erected by Licensing Officers on Emily Road on 4th June 2013 advertising the application and notice was also given to shops within the immediate location, which sell similar items to the applicant.
- 5.3 Objections have been received from Councillor Nikki Bond and local businesses which are attached to the report at Appendix 'B'. Members should note that comment has been received from Paul Turner Highways and Sue Barker, Planning, which are attached at Appendix 'C'.
- 5.4 Members should note that the Council Street Trading Policy states at page 18, paragraph 3.2.8, that "All applications will be dealt with under their own individual merits, however, when determining an application the proximity of existing nearby shops, café's and other traders that primarily trade in the same articles will be taken into account". Also the Council Street Trading Policy states at page 18 paragraph 3.2.11 that "Written comments from consultees, individuals and occupiers of properties that may be affected by the proposed site will be taken into consideration when determining an application". A copy of the Council's Street Trading Policy is available via the following link; https://www.sheffield.gov.uk/business-economy/licensing/general-licensing/retail/street-trading.html. Members should note that the age restriction of 5 years for motorised vehicles is under review and is not presently being enforced.
- 5.5 The applicant, Councillor Nikki Bond and local shopkeepers have been invited to attend the Licensing Committee hearing. Copies of the invites are attached at Appendix 'D'.

5.6 A copy of the hearing procedure is attached at Appendix 'E'.

Hope I am not too late for this.

My objection to this static street trading application is in respect of 3.2.8 of the Street Trading Licensing Policy that states:

"All applications will be dealt with under their own individual merits, however, when determining an application the proximity of existing nearby shops, café's and other traders that primarily trade in the same articles will be taken into account."

Having spent a lot of time with local businesses listening to their concerns about the impact of mobile street trading on their business, I cannot allow this application to go ahead without objection because the 5-hour proposed time would actually have a worse impact than the mobile vans in the sense that it would deter local residents away from existing businesses who sell similar produce.

I understand that this application has already been rejected on Owler Lane, which is a cul-de-sac. Emily Road is within a network of small, busy roads with a lot of traffic and families walking about. If the previous application was rejected for a cul-de-sac, which is presumably more quiet than Emily Road, then I add an additional objection to this application on the basis of it posing a potential safety risk.

Furthermore it concerns me that the applicant has written N/A next to the food hygiene rating criteria, and they have also failed to provide evidence (at the time of writing their application) that the vehicle meet's the Council's food safety standards.

I'd be grateful if you would accept this email as evidence of my objection and hope to attend the Licensing Sub-Committee meeting when this case is scheduled.

STREET TRADING CONSENT APPLICATION

SUB-COMMITTEE HEARING PROCEDURE

This procedure has been drawn up to assist those parties attending Street Trading Consent Committee hearings.

- 1. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.
- 2. The Chair will ask the applicants and interested parties to formally introduce themselves.
- 3. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 4. Hearing Procedure:-
 - (a) The Licensing Officer will introduce the report.
 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
 - (c) The applicant/consent holder (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (d) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the applicant and/or his/her representative.
 - (e) Consultees / interested parties will be invited to present their representations or elect a spokesperson (which may be a Councillor) to speak on their behalf. New representations must not be raised.
 - (f) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the consultees / interested parties.
 - (g) The consultees / interested parties will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (h) The applicant will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for Members to take legal advice and consider the application.
 - (k) Once a decision has been reached, all parties will be invited to return. The Sub-Committee's decision and reasons will be announced by the Chair.
 - (I) The Sub-Committee's decision will be confirmed in writing to the applicant and those parties who made representations.
- NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
 - 2) The Committee Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.

There is no right of appeal against the Council's decision to refuse to grant or revoke a Street Trading Consent.

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
