ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

If you are present at a meeting of the Council, of its executive or any committee of the executive, or of any committee, sub-committee, joint committee, or joint sub-committee of the authority, and you have a **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest** (DPI) relating to any business that will be considered at the meeting, you must not:

- participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your Disclosable Pecuniary Interest during the meeting, participate further in any discussion of the business, or
- participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

These prohibitions apply to any form of participation, including speaking as a member of the public.

You must:

- leave the room (in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct)
- make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of any DPI at any
 meeting at which you are present at which an item of business which affects or
 relates to the subject matter of that interest is under consideration, at or before
 the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes
 apparent.
- declare it to the meeting and notify the Council's Monitoring Officer within 28 days, if the DPI is not already registered.

If you have any of the following pecuniary interests, they are your **disclosable pecuniary interests** under the new national rules. You have a pecuniary interest if you, or your spouse or civil partner, have a pecuniary interest.

- Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain, which you, or your spouse or civil partner undertakes.
- Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from your council or authority) made or provided within the relevant period* in respect of any expenses incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

*The relevant period is the 12 months ending on the day when you tell the Monitoring Officer about your disclosable pecuniary interests.

- Any contract which is made between you, or your spouse or your civil partner (or a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest) and your council or authority –
 - under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and
 - which has not been fully discharged.

- Any beneficial interest in land which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, have and which is within the area of your council or authority.
- Any licence (alone or jointly with others) which you, or your spouse or your civil
 partner, holds to occupy land in the area of your council or authority for a month
 or longer.
- Any tenancy where (to your knowledge)
 - the landlord is your council or authority; and
 - the tenant is a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest.
- Any beneficial interest which you, or your spouse or your civil partner has in securities of a body where -
 - (a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of your council or authority; and
 - (b) either -
 - the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or
 - if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

If you attend a meeting at which any item of business is to be considered and you are aware that you have a **personal interest** in the matter which does not amount to a DPI, you must make verbal declaration of the existence and nature of that interest at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent. You should leave the room if your continued presence is incompatible with the 7 Principles of Public Life (selflessness; integrity; objectivity; accountability; openness; honesty; and leadership).

You have a personal interest where -

- a decision in relation to that business might reasonably be regarded as affecting
 the well-being or financial standing (including interests in land and easements
 over land) of you or a member of your family or a person or an organisation with
 whom you have a close association to a greater extent than it would affect the
 majority of the Council Tax payers, ratepayers or inhabitants of the ward or
 electoral area for which you have been elected or otherwise of the Authority's
 administrative area, or
- it relates to or is likely to affect any of the interests that are defined as DPIs but are in respect of a member of your family (other than a partner) or a person with whom you have a close association.

Guidance on declarations of interest, incorporating regulations published by the Government in relation to Disclosable Pecuniary Interests, has been circulated to you previously.

You should identify any potential interest you may have relating to business to be considered at the meeting. This will help you and anyone that you ask for advice to fully consider all the circumstances before deciding what action you should take.

In certain circumstances the Council may grant a **dispensation** to permit a Member to take part in the business of the Authority even if the member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest relating to that business.

To obtain a dispensation, you must write to the Monitoring Officer at least 48 hours before the meeting in question, explaining why a dispensation is sought and desirable, and specifying the period of time for which it is sought. The Monitoring Officer may consult with the Independent Person or the Council's Audit and Standards Committee in relation to a request for dispensation.

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a Static Street Trading consent to trade at Tinsley Green School. This is a new build just off Norborough Road Sheffield.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council as a Licensing Authority have power under the provision of the 1982 Act to regulate Street Trading in the City.
- 2.2 A Street Trading Consent is required to trade on any Street (which includes roads, footways, forecourts, or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City Boundary.
- 2.3 The Licensing Committee at it's meeting of 29th January 2002 passed the following resolution:
 - 1. That under the provisions of schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982:
 - all streets (which includes roads, footways, forecourts or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City boundary, shall be designated consent streets and;
 - (b) such street trading designation shall take effect as from the 1st April 2002; and
 - (c) all previous designations in relation to street trading will be rescinded as a result of the designation set out above.
 - 2. The effect of this resolution is that from 1st April 2002, it will be an offence to engage in street trading in any street or any other place identified in the above resolution without being authorised to do so by consent from the City Council.
- 2.4 A Local Authority may attach conditions to a Street Trading Consent. The conditions may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street and danger to persons using the street or nuisance or annoyance.
- 2.5 A Street Trading Consent may only be granted for a maximum period of twelve months.

2.6 There is no appeal procedure against the refusal or revocation of any consent. An applicant may, however apply for judicial review of the Council's decision.

3.0 THE APPLICATION

- 3.1 The applicant is a Mr Peter Devoti a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 'A'.
- 3.2 The application was submitted on 20th April 2016.
- 3.3 The application is to serve ice cream near the school entrance during school term times.
- 3.4 The application was circulated, in the usual manner, to South Yorkshire Police, South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, Highways and Planning, and City Centre Management. Notices were erected by Licensing Officers at the site advertising the application and notice was also given to shops and anyone that might be affected by the applications within the immediate vicinity.
- 3.5 Objections have been received by the head teacher of the School.

4.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 4.1 The application has been referred to the Sub-Licensing Committee for their consideration as the Licensing Authority has received objections to the application from the following parties:-
 - The head teacher.

Copies of the representations are attached at Appendix 'B'

4.2 The objections refer to issues contained in section 2.8 of our street trading policy when determining the application, and Members are referred to in particular section 2.8.2:

Public Safety Highway Section B

- 4.3 Members should consider all the information provided by the applicant both in their written application and in person at the hearing.
- 4.4 The applicant and objectors have been invited to attend the Licensing Committee hearing. Copies of the invites are attached at Appendix 'C'.
- 4.5 A copy of the hearing procedure is attached at Appendix 'D'.

5.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5.1 The Street Trading Policy states that fees will be set and reviewed annually on a full cost recovery basis. The level of fee takes into account the location, duration of consent, the trading hours and articles to be sold as well as the enforcement of terms and conditions.

Fees for static consents are determined at the grant of the application therefore there are no financial implications arising from this report.

6.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

6.1 That Members consider all the relevant information available, any representations that may be made and our policy.

7.0 OPTIONS OPEN TO THE COMMITTEE

SUB-COMMITTEE HEARING PROCEDURE

This procedure has been drawn up to assist those parties attending Street Trading Consent Committee hearings.

- 1. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.
- 2. The Chair will ask the applicants and interested parties to formally introduce themselves.
- 3. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 4. Hearing Procedure:-
 - (a) The Licensing Officer will introduce the report.
 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
 - (c) The applicant/consent holder (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (d) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the applicant and/or his/her representative.
 - (e) Consultees / interested parties will be invited to present their representations or elect a spokesperson (which may be a Councillor) to speak on their behalf. New representations must not be raised.
 - (f) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the consultees / interested parties.
 - (g) The consultees / interested parties will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (h) The applicant will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for Members to take legal advice and consider the application.
 - (k) Once a decision has been reached, all parties will be invited to return. The Sub-Committee's decision and reasons will be announced by the Chair.
 - (I) The Sub-Committee's decision will be confirmed in writing to the applicant and those parties who made representations.
- NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
 - 2) The Committee Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.

There is no right of appeal against the Council's decision to refuse to grant or revoke a Street Trading Consent.

I wish to object to this application. Before specifying the reasons, I think it is important to set the scene for the area in which this shop is situated.

Location of Ramo's

Ramo's shop is situated in the ancient and historic village of Ecclesfield, a Conservation Area, whose history goes back to before the Doomsday book. The village is dominated by the unusually large and Grade 1 listed Church, St. Mary's, itself of important historic significance to the whole of greater Sheffield or Hallamshire as it used to be. In the 12th century, Hallamshire had only 3 churches – Ecclesfield, Bradfield and Sheffield (now Sheffield Cathedral) and all three were in Ecclesfield parish and were managed and organised from Ecclesfield. These three churches remain the only Grade 1 listed churches in the whole of Sheffield.

Ramo's shop is located on Church St which has double yellow lines on both sides of the road. It is opposite Priory Rd which also has double yellow lines on both sides of the Rd in the area where it meets Church St. This is a dangerous junction for vehicles coming out of Priory Rd joining Church St because of limited visibility and the speed of traffic. The owners of the current shop regularly park one or two vehicles at the bottom of Priory Rd on double yellow lines which has the effect of reducing access to the road to a single lane and making the junction extremely dangerous. There is more or less no parking in the village for customers of the shop and customer vehicles also from time to time park on double yellow lines. It should be noted that the customers of Ramo's are almost entirely not from the village.

Objection

- 1. Need. The only businesses open at 11pm are two pubs which stop serving at 11pm. There seems to be no justification for staying open until 2am.
- 2. Parking. The existing business already breaks parking regulations on a frequent basis by parking one or two vehicles on double yellow lines on Priory Rd. Any extended opening is likely to extend this abuse with the consequent danger presented to vehicles entering and exiting Priory Rd.
- 3. Disruption to the village. Current customers can be noisy and often leave a mess of litter and sometimes vomit which needs to be cleared up the following day. Extending this behaviour in the village, a Conservation Area, beyond 11pm would not be acceptable. It should be noted that nearly all customers of Ramo's are not from the village.

I am writing this objection in my role as a local resident and also as a churchwarden at St. Mary's Church, Ecclesfield.

I would like to record my strong objection to the above application.

This establishment already constitutes a hazard and a nuisance in that every day, vehicles belonging to the owners of that shop, park on double yellow lines at the very bottom of Priory Road with its junction with Church Street where the shop is located. Priory Road is narrow and at that point just 2 cars wide. Church Street is also narrow, very busy and it too has double yellow lines. The junction is very tight and vehicles leaving or entering Priory Road have a difficult manoeuvre. Nonetheless the owners park their vehicles right at the junction in such a way as to inhibit the free movement of traffic - especially large vehicles such as ambulances and fire engines which may need emergency access at any time of the day or night. Local residents have many times complained to the police (who say it is not their responsibility) and to the local authority but the illegal parking continues.

The owners have got away with illegal parking for years.

I make the point about parking in order to draw attention to the fact that these people are not only continuously and flagrantly flouting the law but have a weak sense of social responsibility.

But my overriding concern is the effect upon local residents. Who are these supposed patrons of the business (almost certainly not locals) wandering around the area at 2 and 3am? And doing what else besides? I suggest a recipe for noise and trouble as the word gets around. There are residents to be considered not just the marginal addition to shop sales. In close proximity are families with and without children, sick people and the elderly who will undoubtedly suffer if the extension is sanctioned which I cannot believe you will allow to happen.

The prospect of this shop remaining open until the early hours of the morning is unthinkable

I am writing to object to the proposal to extend the opening hours of the above kebab shop.

The existing management conduct the business with no regard to the welfare or safety of residents or other road users, nor to the fact that they are operating within a Conservation area.

Examples include constantly parking delivery vehicles on double yellow lines at the bottom of Priory Road, making access from and exit onto Church Street difficult and indeed dangerous for residents and users of the Church and Gatty Hall. When not parked there, they, and their customers, also park outside the shop on Church Street which restricts the main road, and is immediately before a busy road junction.

Environmentally, there is a constant smell of grease or cooking oils emitting from the shop, no adequate provision for customers to dispose of packaging, thus causing litter problems, and a constant noise from cars and delivery vehicles.

Furthermore, as the shop is within the Conservation Area it is inappropriate to have take away food shops opening till the early hours.

Right of attendance, assistance and representation



15. Subject to regulations 14(2) and 25, a party may attend the hearing and may be assisted or represented by any person whether or not that person is legally qualified.

Representations and supporting information

- 16. At the hearing a party shall be entitled to -
 - (a) in response to a point upon which the authority has given notice to a party that it will want clarification under regulation 7(1)(d), give further information in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable),
 - (b) if given permission by the authority, question any other party; and
 - (c) address the authority

Failure of parties to attend the hearing

- 20. (1) If a party has informed the authority that he does not intend to attend or be represented at a hearing, the hearing may proceed in his absence.
 - (2) If a party who has not so indicated fails to attend or be represented at a hearing the authority may:—
 - (a) where it considers it to be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the hearing to a specified date, or
 - (b) hold the hearing in the party's absence.
 - (3) Where the authority holds the hearing in the absence of a party, the authority shall consider at the hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.
 - (4) Where the authority adjourns the hearing to a specified date it must forthwith notify the parties of the date, time and place to which the hearing has been adjourned.

Procedure at hearing

- 21. Subject to the provisions of the Regulations, the authority shall determine the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 22. At the beginning of the hearing, the authority shall explain to the parties the procedure which it proposes to follow at the hearing and shall consider any request made by a party under regulation 8(2) for permission for another person to appear at the hearing, such permission shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 23. A hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority and cross-examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considers that cross-examination is required for it to consider the representations, application or notice as the case may require.
- 24. The authority must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights provided for at regulation 16.
- 25. The authority may require any person attending the hearing who in their opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may
 - (a) refuse to permit that person to return, or
 - (b) permit him to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify, but such a person may, before the end of the hearing, submit to the authority in writing any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.

Regulation 8



- (1) A party shall give to the authority within the period of time provided for in the following provisions of this regulation a notice stating
 - (a) whether he intends to attend or be represented at the hearing;
 - (b) whether he considers a hearing to be unnecessary
- (2) In a case where a party wishes any other person (other than the person he intends to represent him at the hearing) to appear at the hearing, the notice referred to in paragraph (1) shall contain a request for permission for such other person to appear at the hearing accompanied by details of the name of that person and a brief description of the point or points on which that person may be able to assist the authority in relation to the application, representations or notice of the party making the request.
- (3) In the case of a hearing under -
 - (a) section 48(3)(a) (cancellation of interim authority notice following police objection), or
 - (b) section 105(2)(a) (counter notice following police objection to temporary event notice),

the party shall give the notice no later than one working day before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

- (4) In the case of a hearing under -
 - (a) section 167(5)(a) (review of premises licence following closure order),
 - (b) paragraph 4(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application for conversion of existing licence), paragraph 16(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application for conversion of existing club certificate)
 - (c) paragraph 26(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application by holder of justices' licence for grant of personal licence),

the party shall give the notice no later than two working days before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

(5) In any other case, the party shall give the notice no later than five working days before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

<u>Licensing Act 2003 – Hearing Procedure – Regulation 7 (1)</u>



This procedure has been drawn up in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 to assist those parties attending Licensing Committee hearings.

- 1. The hearing before the Council is Quasi Judicial.
- 2. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.
- 3. The Chair will ask the applicants to formally introduce themselves.
- 4. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 5. Hearing Procedure:-
 - (a) The Licensing Officer will introduce the report.
 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
 - (c) The Licensing Officer will introduce in turn representatives for the Responsible Authority and Interested Parties who will be asked to detail their relevant representations.
 - (d) Members may ask questions of those parties
 - (e) With the leave of the Chair the applicant or his representative may cross examine the representatives of the Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties.
 - (f) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (g) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) may then be asked questions by members and with the leave of the Chair from the other parties present.
 - (h) The applicant will then be given the opportunity to sum up the application.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for members to take legal advice and consider the application.
- 6. The decision of the Licensing Committee will be given in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and regulations made there under.
- NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
 - 2) The Committee Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a Static Street Trading consent to trade at Fargate Sheffield.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council as a Licensing Authority have power under the provision of the 1982 Act to regulate Street Trading in the City.
- 2.2 A Street Trading Consent is required to trade on any Street (which includes roads, footways, forecourts, or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City Boundary.
- 2.3 The Licensing Committee at it's meeting of 29th January 2002 passed the following resolution:
 - 1. That under the provisions of schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982:
 - (a) all streets (which includes roads, footways, forecourts or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City boundary, shall be designated consent streets and;
 - (b) such street trading designation shall take effect as from the 1st April 2002; and
 - (c) all previous designations in relation to street trading will be rescinded as a result of the designation set out above.
 - 2. The effect of this resolution is that from 1st April 2002, it will be an offence to engage in street trading in any street or any other place identified in the above resolution without being authorised to do so by consent from the City Council.
- 2.4 A Local Authority may attach conditions to a Street Trading Consent. The conditions may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street and danger to persons using the street or nuisance or annoyance.
- 2.5 A Street Trading Consent may only be granted for a maximum period of twelve months.

2.6 There is no appeal procedure against the refusal or revocation of any consent. An applicant may, however apply for judicial review of the Council's decision.

3.0 THE APPLICATION

- 3.1 The applicants are Mr Hristo Hristov & Zima Simeonova a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 'A'.
- 3.2 The application was submitted on 20th February 2017.
- 3.3 The application is to serve Traditional Balkan Food, hot & cold, Monday to Sunday between 09.00 and 19.00.
- 3.4 The application was circulated, in the usual manner, to South Yorkshire Police, South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, Highways and Planning, and City Centre Management. Notices were erected by Licensing Officers at the site advertising the application and notice was also given to shops and anyone that might be affected by the applications within the immediate vicinity.
- 3.5 Objections have been received by an interested party, a business nearby.

4.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 4.1 The application has been referred to the Sub-Licensing Committee for their consideration as the Licensing Authority has received objections to the application from the following parties:-

CITY CENTRE STREET TRADING Small Trading Stalls

BACKGROUND

Street activities are an essential ingredient of a vibrant and lively city, and in Sheffield there is a strong demand for legitimate small scale trading pitches. They also offer an opportunity for small businesses to get started with relatively modest outlay.


The widening of footways offers the opportunity to designate more pitches in locations that will add to the attractiveness of the City Centre. In Orchard Square and Meadowhall 'Barrow' style stalls are used extensively, enhancing the colour and vitality of those places.

This scheme is part of the City Council's campaign to make Sheffield City Centre a more attractive and vibrant place. Set out below is the qualitative criteria which forms the basis on which to test applications for the grant of designated small trading stall Street Trading Consent sites within the City Centre.

QUALITATIVE CRITERIA - SMALL TRADING STALLS

GENERAL DESIGN

- There will be no motorised vehicles or stalls etc. permitted as part of this scheme.
- All barrows/handcarts must be capable of being moved on and off site by hand and any
 vehicles used to bring the barrows/handcarts to the site must be parked, loaded and unloaded
 off site.
- Good display is an important part of the selling process and top quality presentation encourages purchase and benefits the retailer reputation.
- It is in the best interest of traders to produce a high quality design in their barrows/handcarts.
 The function of the stall is to identify the trader and add vitality and colour to the immediate
 area, and reflect the quality, cleanliness and order in their operation. The barrow/stall
 contributes to the appearance of the street for good or bad, so design matters to everyone
 who uses the street, as well as the operator.



SUB-COMMITTEE HEARING PROCEDURE



This procedure has been drawn up to assist those parties attending Street Trading Consent Committee hearings.

- 1. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.
- 2. The Chair will ask the applicants and interested parties to formally introduce themselves.
- 3. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- Hearing Procedure:-4.
 - The Licensing Officer will introduce the report. (a)
 - Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the (b)
 - (c) The applicant/consent holder (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:
 - detail the application; (i)
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-(d) Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the applicant and/or his/her representative.
 - Consultees / interested parties will be invited to present their representations (e) or elect a spokesperson (which may be a Councillor) to speak on their behalf. New representations must not be raised.
 - The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-(f) Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the consultees / interested parties.
 - The consultees / interested parties will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 (g) minutes will be allowed.
 - The applicant will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be (h) allowed.
 - The Licensing Officer will then detail the options. (i)
 - There will then be a private session for Members to take legal advice and (j) consider the application.
 - Once a decision has been reached, all parties will be invited to return. The (k) Sub-Committee's decision and reasons will be announced by the Chair.
 - The Sub-Committee's decision will be confirmed in writing to the applicant and (l) those parties who made representations.
- At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request NB: 1) legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
 - The Committee Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with 2) the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.

There is no right of appeal against the Council's decision to refuse to grant or revoke a Street Trading Consent.

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
