ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

If you are present at a meeting of the Council, of its executive or any committee of the executive, or of any committee, sub-committee, joint committee, or joint sub-committee of the authority, and you have a **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest** (DPI) relating to any business that will be considered at the meeting, you must <u>not</u>:

- participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your Disclosable Pecuniary Interest during the meeting, participate further in any discussion of the business, or
- participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

These prohibitions apply to any form of participation, including speaking as a member of the public.

You must:

- leave the room (in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct)
- make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of any DPI at any meeting at which you are present at which an item of business which affects or relates to the subject matter of that interest is under consideration, at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent.
- declare it to the meeting and notify the Council's Monitoring Officer within 28 days, if the DPI is not already registered.

If you have any of the following pecuniary interests, they are your **disclosable pecuniary interests** under the new national rules. You have a pecuniary interest if you, or your spouse or civil partner, have a pecuniary interest.

- Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain, which you, or your spouse or civil partner undertakes.
- Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from your council or authority) made or provided within the relevant period* in respect of any expenses incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

*The relevant period is the 12 months ending on the day when you tell the Monitoring Officer about your disclosable pecuniary interests.

- Any contract which is made between you, or your spouse or your civil partner (or a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest) and your council or authority –
 - under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and
 - which has not been fully discharged.

- Any beneficial interest in land which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, have and which is within the area of your council or authority.
- Any licence (alone or jointly with others) which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, holds to occupy land in the area of your council or authority for a month or longer.
- Any tenancy where (to your knowledge) -
 - the landlord is your council or authority; and
 - the tenant is a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest.
- Any beneficial interest which you, or your spouse or your civil partner has in securities of a body where -
 - (a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of your council or authority; and
 - (b) either -
 - the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or
 - if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

If you attend a meeting at which any item of business is to be considered and you are aware that you have a **personal interest** in the matter which does not amount to a DPI, you must make verbal declaration of the existence and nature of that interest at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent. You should leave the room if your continued presence is incompatible with the 7 Principles of Public Life (selflessness; integrity; objectivity; accountability; openness; honesty; and leadership).

You have a personal interest where -

- a decision in relation to that business might reasonably be regarded as affecting the well-being or financial standing (including interests in land and easements over land) of you or a member of your family or a person or an organisation with whom you have a close association to a greater extent than it would affect the majority of the Council Tax payers, ratepayers or inhabitants of the ward or electoral area for which you have been elected or otherwise of the Authority's administrative area, or
- it relates to or is likely to affect any of the interests that are defined as DPIs but are in respect of a member of your family (other than a partner) or a person with whom you have a close association.

Guidance on declarations of interest, incorporating regulations published by the Government in relation to Disclosable Pecuniary Interests, has been circulated to you previously.

You should identify any potential interest you may have relating to business to be considered at the meeting. This will help you and anyone that you ask for advice to fully consider all the circumstances before deciding what action you should take.

In certain circumstances the Council may grant a **dispensation** to permit a Member to take part in the business of the Authority even if the member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest relating to that business.

To obtain a dispensation, you must write to the Monitoring Officer at least 48 hours before the meeting in question, explaining why a dispensation is sought and desirable, and specifying the period of time for which it is sought. The Monitoring Officer may consult with the Independent Person or the Council's Audit and Standards Committee in relation to a request for dispensation.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT 1982

STREET TRADING – Hot food Pancakes - Fargate

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a Static Street Trading consent to trade at Fargate Sheffield.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council as a Licensing Authority have power under the provision of the 1982 Act to regulate Street Trading in the City.
- 2.2 A Street Trading Consent is required to trade on any Street (which includes roads, footways, forecourts, or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City Boundary.
- 2.3 The Licensing Committee at it's meeting of 29th January 2002 passed the following resolution:
 - 1. That under the provisions of schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982:
 - (a) all streets (which includes roads, footways, forecourts or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City boundary, shall be designated consent streets and;
 - (b) such street trading designation shall take effect as from the 1st April 2002; and
 - (c) all previous designations in relation to street trading will be rescinded as a result of the designation set out above.
 - 2. The effect of this resolution is that from 1st April 2002, it will be an offence to engage in street trading in any street or any other place identified in the above resolution without being authorised to do so by consent from the City Council.
- 2.4 A Local Authority may attach conditions to a Street Trading Consent. The conditions may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street and danger to persons using the street or nuisance or annoyance.
- 2.5 A Street Trading Consent may only be granted for a maximum period of twelve months.

2.6 There is no appeal procedure against the refusal or revocation of any consent. An applicant may, however apply for judicial review of the Council's decision.

3.0 THE APPLICATION

- 3.1 The applicant is Mr Michael Desmond copy of the application is attached at Appendix 'A'.
- 3.2 The application was deferred from the hearing of 22nd August as Mr Desmond was unable to attend.
- 3.3 The application was submitted on 29th June 2017.
- 3.4 The application is to serve Pancakes, Monday to Sunday. (no hours of trading have been indicated)
- 3.5 The application was circulated, in the usual manner, to South Yorkshire Police, South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, Highways and Planning, and City Centre Management. Notices were erected by Licensing Officers at the site advertising the application and notice was also given to shops and anyone that might be affected by the applications within the immediate vicinity.
- 3.6 No objections have been received.

4.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 4.1 Members should consider all the information provided by the applicant both in their written application and in person at the hearing.
- 4.2 The applicant has been invited to attend the Licensing Committee hearing. Copies of the invites are attached at Appendix 'B'.
- 4.3 A copy of the hearing procedure is attached at Appendix 'C'.

5.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 The Street Trading Policy states that fees will be set and reviewed annually on a full cost recovery basis. The level of fee takes into account the location, duration of consent, the trading hours and articles to be sold as well as the enforcement of terms and conditions.
- 5.2 Fees for static consents are determined at the grant of the application therefore there are no financial implications arising from this report.

6.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

6.1 That Members consider all the relevant information available, any representations that may be made and our policy.

- All equipment, tools, gas bottles etc. must be self contained within the stall/handcart etc.
- · Bright colours and a sense of fun are encouraged.
- Finished in flame retardant paint.
- A colour photograph or scale illustration of the proposed handcart must be submitted to the Licensing Service as part of the application process.
- No barrow/handcart should have a frontage greater than 3.0 metres or a width greater than 2.0metre.
- · Roofs should be no more than 2.5m above ground level.
- Pitched and curved roofs are encouraged.
- Canopies should be high quality with a feeling of 'permanence'. These could be manufactured from either stretched canvas, or woven material, opaque or light metal materials. Clear plastic awning and extensions to the canopy will not be acceptable.
- Canopies must be maintained and cleaned to a high standard.
- Food traders must ensure that any stall design satisfies the requirement of food safely legislation. Staff must be adequately trained in good hygiene (Basic Food Hygiene Certificate and regular on going training) and records of training must be made available on request.

Since 2015 I have been operating Monet's garden a successful flower cycle on Fargate. much as I love selling my flowers I'm afraid it is no longer feasible as working in direct sunlight on Fargate has led to me getting skin cancers on my forehead and face, my GP and surgeon have told me I should no longer do this. Since stopping my flower sales I have been engaged in very heavy work but have been advised to stop this due to more Heart related health issues. My GP agrees that working on my pancake unit will cause me no health issues.

For many years I have owned and operated a much loved local, mobile catering unit (Double Dutch Pancakes) and would like to apply for a static pitch on Fargate as I only do a few events a year. My pancake unit is bespoke, individual and very pleasing on the eye; it is like no other in the country. I have attached photos. We sell a wide range of sweet and savoury pancakes and all our ingredients are cooked fresh to order and sourced locally and one of our pancakes can be bought for as little as two pounds fifty. No one else is selling pancakes in the vicinity and I am no threat to anyone else's livelihood. Chinese People in particular flock to my pancake unit as the sight and smell of my classic pancakes reminds them of home and fills them with Joy, in light of the Chinese community growing so fast in our city and the Chinese student numbers growing massively by the year they are now a very important part of our city's economy and will continue to receive a warm welcome and top quality food at my pancake unit which will light up Fargate , bring culinary joy and a great international feel to our vibrant city centre

I hope the committee can look favourably on my on this application, I am sixty four next and it will be difficult finding alternative work or retraining.





1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the variation of a Static Street Trading consent to trade at Peace Gardens Sheffield.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council as a Licensing Authority have power under the provision of the 1982 Act to regulate Street Trading in the City.
- 2.2 A Street Trading Consent is required to trade on any Street (which includes roads, footways, forecourts, or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City Boundary.
- 2.3 The Licensing Committee at it's meeting of 29th January 2002 passed the following resolution:
 - 1. That under the provisions of schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982:
 - (a) all streets (which includes roads, footways, forecourts or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City boundary, shall be designated consent streets and;
 - (b) such street trading designation shall take effect as from the 1st April 2002; and
 - (c) all previous designations in relation to street trading will be rescinded as a result of the designation set out above.
 - 2. The effect of this resolution is that from 1st April 2002, it will be an offence to engage in street trading in any street or any other place identified in the above resolution without being authorised to do so by consent from the City Council.
- 2.4 A Local Authority may attach conditions to a Street Trading Consent. The conditions may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street and danger to persons using the street or nuisance or annoyance.
- 2.5 A Street Trading Consent may only be granted for a maximum period of twelve months.
- 2.6 There is no appeal procedure against the refusal or revocation of any consent. An applicant may, however apply for judicial review of the Council's decision.

3.0 THE APPLICATION

- 3.1 The applicant is Mr Michael Desmond a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 'A'.
- 3.2 The Application was deferred from a hearing of the 22nd August Mr Desmond was unable to attend the hearing.
- 3.3 The application was submitted on 20th June 2017.
- 3.4 The application is vary the current sale of flowers to hot food (pancakes).
- 3.5 The application was circulated, in the usual manner, to South Yorkshire Police, South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, Highways and Planning, and City Centre Management. Notices were erected by Licensing Officers at the site advertising the application and notice was also given to shops and anyone that might be affected by the applications within the immediate vicinity.
- 3.6 No objections have been received.

4.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 4.1 Members should consider all the information provided by the applicant both in their written application and in person at the hearing.
- 4.2 The applicant has been invited to attend the Licensing Committee hearing. Copies of the invites are attached at Appendix 'B'.
- 4.3 A copy of the hearing procedure is attached at Appendix 'C'.

5.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 The Street Trading Policy states that fees will be set and reviewed annually on a full cost recovery basis. The level of fee takes into account the location, duration of consent, the trading hours and articles to be sold as well as the enforcement of terms and conditions.
- 5.2 Fees for static consents are determined at the grant of the application therefore there are no financial implications arising from this report.

No one else is selling pancakes in the vicinity and I am no threat to anyone else's livelihood. Chinese People in particular flock to my pancake unit as the sight and smell of my classic pancakes reminds them of home and fills them with Joy, in light of the Chinese community growing so fast in our city and the Chinese student numbers growing massively by the year they are now a very important part of our city's economy and will continue to receive a warm welcome and top quality food at my pancake unit which will light up Fargate , bring culinary joy and a great international feel to our vibrant city centre


Appendix C

Hearing procedure

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1. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.

- 2. The Chair will ask the applicants and interested parties to formally introduce themselves.
- 3. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 4. Hearing Procedure:-
 - (a) The Licensing Officer will introduce the report.
 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
 - (c) The applicant/consent holder (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (d) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the applicant and/or his/her representative.
 - (e) Consultees / interested parties will be invited to present their representations or elect a spokesperson (which may be a Councillor) to speak on their behalf. New representations must not be raised.
 - (f) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the consultees / interested parties.
 - (g) The consultees / interested parties will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (h) The applicant will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for Members to take legal advice and consider the application.
 - (k) Once a decision has been reached, all parties will be invited to return. The Sub-Committee's decision and reasons will be announced by the Chair.
 - (I) The Sub-Committee's decision will be confirmed in writing to the applicant and those parties who made representations.
- NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
