The Sheffield Place Based Plan

1. Key notes to support the presentation

- 1.1 This plan responds to the challenges that health and care face over the next five years
- 1.2 The plan is still in draft with the following areas to be finalised:
 - 1.2.1 **Foreword** To be added
 - 1.2.2 **Page 11**: Further work on how the "programmes" are described. As listed these are more themes that link to established programmes the final version will better reflect this and make reference to the programmes as named.
 - 1.2.3 Page 17: More to be added to the risks and mitigations that takes account of the importance of a robust citywide approach to Equality Impact Assessment and to Quality Impact Assessment
 - 1.2.4 **Commissioning**: needs some further consideration to what "commissioning" looks like in the future
- 1.3 Whilst the plan references the various initiatives and programmes that are largely already underway the importance of the plan is not so much in what we do but how we do it.
- 1.4 The plan importantly aims to tackle the barriers and the risks that have previously prevented us from fully seeing the impact of the actions we have taken to drive value across health and care. This is about:
 - 1.4.1 how we work as a city
 - 1.4.2 developing the infrastructure and policy that supports a different way of working
 - 1.4.3 developing a robust and jointly owned financial strategy
 - 1.4.4 understanding how we affect the required behavioural change across organisations, professionals and people
 - 1.4.5 leading change by example
- 1.5 The plan makes links to initiatives that tackle the wider determinants of health and care as well as health and care itself
- 1.6 Next steps will involve:
 - 1.6.1 signing off the plan through all boards (between now and January 2017)
 - 1.6.2 confirming the delivery mechanisms that bring together all of the initiatives (February 2017)
 - 1.6.3 Developing the Financial Strategy (February 2017)
 - 1.6.4 Implementation and, where they don't already exist, detailed delivery plans (March 2017 onwards)
