Notice under Regulation 10: Key Decision where less than 28 days' public notice has been given

Pursuant to Regulation 10 of the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012 ('the Regulations'), **I hereby give Notice** that:-

The Leader intends to make a Key Decision on behalf of the Sheffield City Council on 9th April 2018

The Key Decision will be about the Redevelopment of the National Union of Mineworkers (NUM) former Headquarters on Holly Street – Proposed Further Action

It has not been possible to give 28 clear days' notice of the intention to make the Key Decision, as required by Regulation 9 (2) of the Regulations.

The reasons why compliance with Regulation 9 is impracticable in this matter are as follows:-

The Council is seeking to guarantee additional funding to enable the comprehensive refurbishment of this prominent building to be completed.

The arrangements subject to this report are time sensitive and we have to respond before the opportunity is lost, and 28 days is too long.
