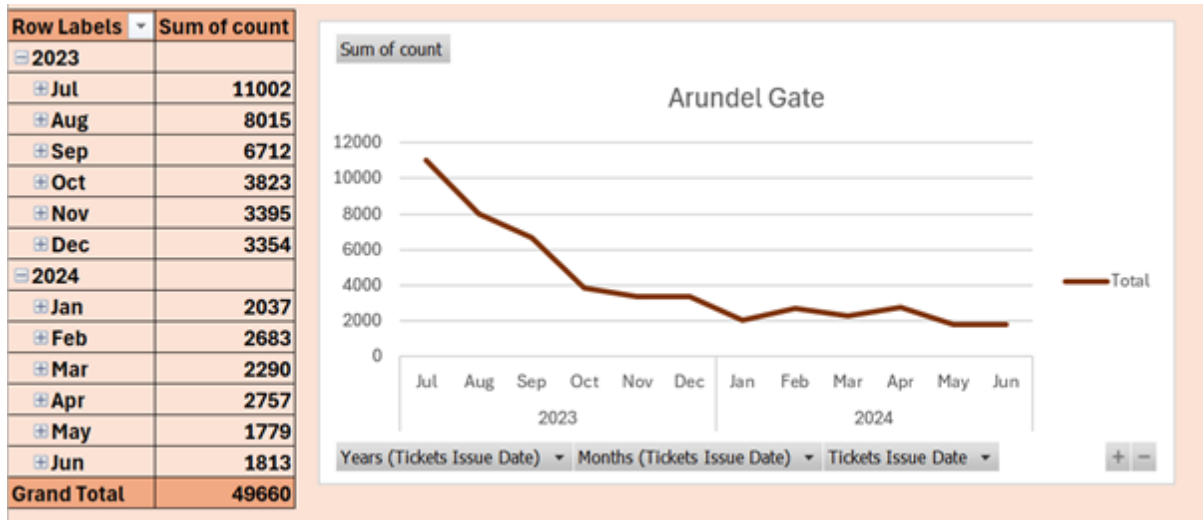
Remaining Written Answers Provided To Members' Questions

Questions of Councillor Will Sapwell to the Chair of the Transport, Regeneration and Climate Policy Committee (Councillor Ben Miskell)

Q.4 Since the start of the Arundel Bus gate, how many vehicles have been fined?

A.4 In the period 1st July 2023 to 30th June 2024 a total of 49,660 individual vehicles have received a PCNs (note some vehicles will have received multiple PCNs, the total number of PCNs issued to date is 62,213). As you can see from the graph, the number of PCNs issued has drastically reduced. As a physician you will know the importance of clean air to the most vulnerable in our city and will no doubt see the value of these public health interventions.



Q.5 How many of these vehicles have been registered in Sheffield?

A.5 Of the 49,660 vehicles that were issued a PCN, 17,878 were registered in Sheffield

Q.6 How many of these vehicles are registered outside of Sheffield?

A.6 Of the 49,660 vehicles that were issued a PCN, 31,782 were registered outside Sheffield.

Q.7 How much money has been raised in fines for Sheffield and other authorities?

A.7 From 1st April 2023 to 31st March 2024 – Income from Bus Lane fines £3,961 & CAZ fines £5,806,351. As a result of the Clean Air Zone, several projects, aimed at improving the air quality around schools in Sheffield, are set to benefit with £1million being invested in the expansion of School Streets and part-time 20mph zones. Announced as part of the Clean Air Investment Plan, the projects will create a safer environment for children travelling to and from school and also encourage pupils and parents to adopt a more active lifestyle by walking, cycling, and wheeling. You should be aware that the collection of revenue by colleagues in Parking Services is overseen by your colleague Councillor Joe Otten's Waste and Street Scene Policy Committee.
