Proposal and reasoning for consultation: We note that both the Friends of Graves Park and the Save the Rose Garden Café Campaign have previously expressed that they do not believe there is a need to undertake a public consultation on design options 1-5. As detailed in section 1.4, we also agree that consultation on all design options is not appropriate. We do however recommend a proportionate public consultation is designed and undertaken by the Partnership to provide different ways for the public to engage and participate in the future of the café, whether this be workshops, events or surveys. The existing petition provides an insight into why the Rose Garden Café is important to the public but is limited to the petition statement. The proposed consultation could help the Partnership understand community objectives for the Rose Garden Café, whether that be establishing user experiences or highlighting which aspects of the refurbishment are most important to park and café users. Proposal for the Rose Garden Cafe Partnership to create a framework for the public consultation We believe the framework will consider the following: - Consultation to build on the themes established in the existing petition. - Consultation should be in accordance with the Equality Act 2010, the Sheffield City Council Involvement Guide and Sheffield City Council Consultation Principles, including that consultation should be proportionate, inclusive and accessible. - Consultation to be city wide as Graves Park is a designated destination site. 02/07/24 Update - Public Consultation undertaken. • The consultation was co-designed and delivered by the Rose Garden Cafe Partnership taking place from March 15th to April 19th 2024. • Methods included online and paper survey, ideas board in café designed by local school and consultation events in Park. The Partnership ensured • The results were analysed and the Partnership produced a results summary, infographic and publishing online via their Have Your Say page. Please see attachments for more detailed information included the survey, and results. • The Partnership carefully considered how the survey would be distributed and advertised to ensure it was both accessible and distributed widely. A QR code linking to the online survey was created and used on consultation posters as well as shared via the Local Area Committees and S8 magazine Active8, delivered to 15,500 homes. A press launch of the consultation via local media was organised and paper copies of the survey distributed across the city by all partners in city libraries, Dukes Café in Norfolk Park, the Rose Garden Café and the Animal Farm at Graves Park. Partners, Friends of Graves Park, Save the Rose Garden Café Campaign and the Chair also held events in Graves Park to help people complete the survey on the 30th and 31st of March and 1st and 5th April. SCC Partnership representatives did not

attend due to the Pre-Election Period restrictions. The equalities question responses were monitored throughout the consultation period and as a result, the Partnership reached out to the Local Area Committees to share the survey via diverse networks and also the SCC Equalities and Engagement Team who advertised the survey via their external Equalities Newsletter. • The consultation has informed the restoration and refurbishment brief..
