Proposal Outline: Prince William and The Royal Foundation (TRF) have launched Homewards: a transformative five-year programme that will aim to demonstrate that it's possible to end homelessness – making it rare, brief and unrepeated. Homewards will work in partnership with six flagship locations from across the UK, who will put collaboration at the heart of the response. Sheffield City Council on behalf of the city was successful in the bidding process back in March 2023 under strict embargo. A formal endorsement is now being sought from the Strategy and Resource Committee on the programmes alignment with the Council's aims and strategies. Subject to endorsement and the commencement of the programme in Sheffield, this EIA will need to be reviewed and updated to reflect and inform the local development of the programme and its outcomes.
