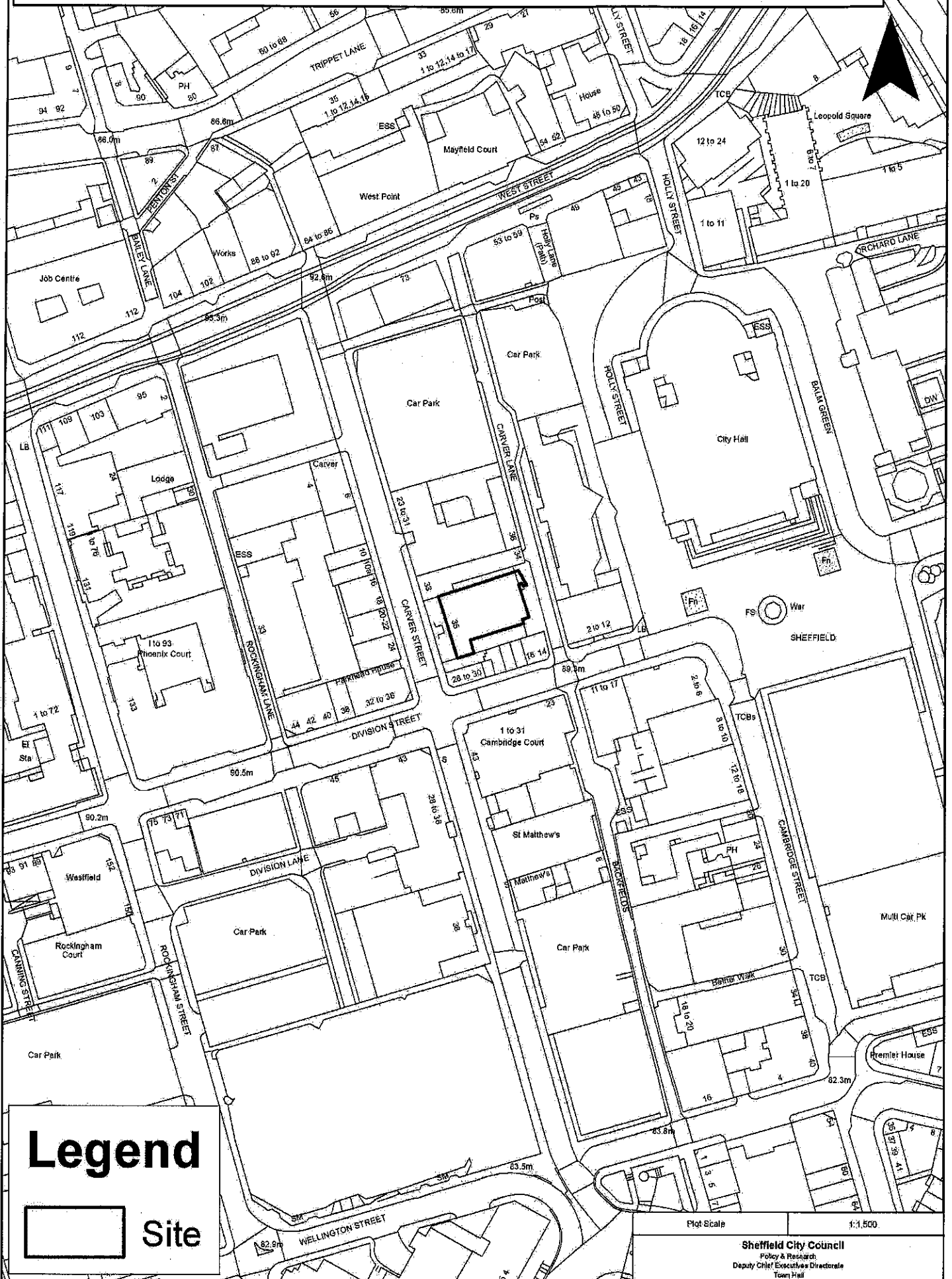

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To consider an Application to Vary a Premises Licence made under the Licensing Act 2003.

2.0 THE APPLICATION

- 2.1 The applicant is Harewood (Viper Rooms) Limited.
- 2.2 The application, which was received on 9 February 2012 is attached to this report labelled Appendix 'A'.
- 2.3 Page 2 of the application form details briefly the proposed variation.
- 2.4 The current premises licence is attached at Appendix 'B'.

3.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 3.1 Representations concerning the application for variation have been received from the following :-

- Local Councillor Attached at Appendix 'C'
- Local Residents Attached at Appendix 'D'

- 3.2 As the representations have not been resolved, the matter is referred to the Licensing Committee.

- 3.3 The applicant and representatives from 3.1 have been invited to attend the hearing. Copies of the front page of the notices are attached to this report labelled Appendix 'E'.

4.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 4.1 There are no specific financial implications arising from this application. However, additional costs may be incurred should the matter go to appeal. In such an eventuality it may not be possible to recover all these costs. The impact of these additional costs (if any) will be kept under review and may be subject of a further report during the year.

5.0 THE LEGAL POSITION

- 5.1 The Licensing Act 2003 at section 4 (1) requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives which section 4(2) sets out as: -

- a) the prevention of crime and disorder,
- b) public safety,
- c) the prevention of public nuisance,
- d) the protection of children from harm.

5.2 Section 4(3) of the Licensing Act also requires the Licensing Authority to have regard to the published statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182.

6.0 HEARINGS REGULATIONS

6.1 Regulations governing hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 have been made by the Secretary of State.

6.2 The Licensing Authority has provided all parties with the information required in the Regulations to the 2003 Act as set out at Appendix 'F'.

6.3 Attached at Appendix 'F' is the following: -

- a) a copy of the Notice of Hearing;
- b) the rights of a party provided in Regulations 15 and 16;
- c) the consequences if a party does not attend or is not represented at the hearing
- d) the procedure to be followed at the hearing.

7.0 APPEALS

7.1 The Licensing Act 2003 section 181 and Schedule 5 makes provision for appeals to be made by the applicant and those making representations against decisions of the Licensing Authority, to the Magistrates' Court.

8.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

8.1 That members carefully consider the representations made and take such steps, as the Committee consider necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

9.0 OPTIONS OPEN TO THE COMMITTEE

9.1 To vary the premises licence in the terms requested.

9.2 To vary the premises licence with modified conditions.

9.3 To reject the whole or part of the application.

Annex 1A – Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory Condition 1 (Section 19 ss 2)

Where a licence authorises the sale of alcohol then no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence –

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or**
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.**

Mandatory Condition 2 (Section 19 ss 3)

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Annex 1C - Mandatory Conditions effective from 1st October 2010:

These mandatory conditions apply where the licence authorises the supply of alcohol. The condition 5 does not apply where the licence authorises the sale by retail or supply of alcohol only for consumption off the premises.

4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that—

(a) Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) Customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

1. Each entrance to the premises will be monitored by at least 1 member of door staff from 21:00 hours on any day the premises remains open after 01:00 hours.
2. Persons will not be permitted to enter the premises after 02:00 hours on any night.
3. To acquire a suitable number of radio set(s) for the premises and take the CCRAC Radio Scheme into use at all times when trading and continue to be a user whilst this system/facility is in use in Sheffield.
4. No customers apparently carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any times the premises are open to the public.
5. A Colour CCTV system to the specification of South Yorkshire Police will be fitted, maintained and in use at all times when the premises are open. CCTV images will be stored for 28 days. Police will be given access to the copies of images for purposes in connection with the prevention and detection of crime and disorder.
6. Additional external colour camera fitted to CCTV system, showing right side of external drinking area.
7. Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose.
8. Any reasonable requirements of the authorities will be complied with in order to ensure the premises are suitable for their intended use.
9. The designated premises supervisor for these premises must be a registered member of Sheffield Licence Watch. Annual membership and meeting attendance should be maintained.
10. A designated member of staff will monitor any outside drinking area at all times.
11. When public dancing is to take place on the premises in an area not previously approved for dancing by the authority, at least 14 days notice must be given to Environmental and Regulatory Services (Health Protection Service) and the Licensing Authority, identifying the area to be used which should be suitable and adequate in size as the designated dance floor for the intended use and dancing must not take place in that area unless approved by the authority.
12. Indoor sporting events shall consist of traditional pub games.
13. Where appropriate, prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
14. Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.

15. No films or videos of any description will be shown so that they can be viewed by persons under the age of any applicable BBFC/Local Authority certification.

16. When regulated entertainment is provided windows and doors shall remain closed except for access and egress.

17. Sunday - Thursday the playing of live or recorded music after 01:30 hours shall be at a reduced volume, agreed by the Environmental Protection Service.

18. Children under the age of 18 are not permitted on the premises at all times.

19. A permanent fixed residual current device (RCD) must protect the electrical power supply serving all amplified music equipment used for the purpose of live music and other entertainment.

20. To comply with the reasonable requirements of South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service.

21. The fire exit doors on to Carver Lane shall only be used as disabled access or as an emergency exit and shall not at any other time be propped open.

22. Any increase in hours for regulated entertainment shall not take effect until the lobby to the rear of the premises fronting onto Carver Lane is built to the satisfaction of the Environmental Protection Service.

23. No amplified sound shall be played within the building except through an in-house amplified sound system fitted with a sound limiter, the settings of which shall have received the prior written approval of the Environmental Protection Service.

24. No amplified sound or live music shall be played nor shall loud speakers be placed at any time outside the building within the proposed outdoor smoking area.

- 25. Music should only be played within the building such that:
 - (i) Noise breakout from the building to the street should not exceed the ambient noise levels by more than 3 dB(A) when measured as a 15 minute LAeq;
 - (ii) Noise breakout from the building to the street should not exceed the ambient noise levels in any octave band centre frequency by more than 3dB when measured as a 15 minute Leq.

Note: Where ambient noise level is the ALeq, 15 minutes in the absence of the specific noise source (breakout from the premises).

This application refers to having "having had regard to concerns raised by Councillor Murphy". Those concerns were stated in my objection to their previous application dated August 4th as follows :

"I am writing to object to the application by The Ruby Lounge to extend their hours when they reopen as the Viper Rooms. The premises are close to 30 apartments at Cambridge Court about 25 yards away. Turning right out of the premises customers will walk towards the apartment

blocks at Mortin Works and West Point on West Street which are around 100 yards away. They may also use the car parks on Carver Street and there will be taxi noise.

The residents of all these blocks already have to contend with a lot of late noise and anti-social behaviour from nearby premises such as Crystal, Walkabout and Reflex/Flares. Currently this does not extend past 3.30pm and it allows residents the expectation of at least a 4 hour window with limited noise allowing them to get much needed sleep. Ruby Lounge should continue to close at 3.30 pm to maintain the correct balance between the night time economy and the well-being of residents."

- (a) where it considers it to be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the hearing to a specified date, or
 - (b) hold the hearing in the party's absence.
- (3) Where the authority holds the hearing in the absence of a party, the authority shall consider at the hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.
- (4) Where the authority adjourns the hearing to a specified date it must forthwith notify the parties of the date, time and place to which the hearing has been adjourned.

Procedure at hearing

21. Subject to the provisions of the Regulations, the authority shall determine the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
22. At the beginning of the hearing, the authority shall explain to the parties the procedure which it proposes to follow at the hearing and shall consider any request made by a party under regulation 8(2) for permission for another person to appear at the hearing, such permission shall not be unreasonably withheld.
23. A hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority and cross-examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considers that cross-examination is required for it to consider the representations, application or notice as the case may require.
24. The authority must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights provided for at regulation 16.
25. The authority may require any person attending the hearing who in their opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may –
- (a) refuse to permit that person to return, or
 - (b) permit him to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify,
- but such a person may, before the end of the hearing, submit to the authority in writing any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.

Licensing Act 2003 – Hearing Procedure – Regulation 7 (1)

This procedure has been drawn up in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 to assist those parties attending Licensing Committee hearings.

1. The hearing before the Council is Quasi Judicial.
 2. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.
 3. The Chair will ask the applicants to formally introduce themselves.
 4. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
 5. Hearing Procedure:-
 - (a) The Licensing Officer will introduce the report.
 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
 - (c) The Licensing Officer will introduce in turn representatives for the Responsible Authority and Interested Parties who will be asked to detail their relevant representations.
 - (d) Members may ask questions of those parties
 - (e) With the leave of the Chair the applicant or his representative may cross examine the representatives of the Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties.
 - (f) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (g) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) may then be asked questions by members and with the leave of the Chair from the other parties present.
 - (h) The applicant will then be given the opportunity to sum up the application.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for members to take legal advice and consider the application.
 6. The decision of the Licensing Committee will be given in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and regulations made there under.
- NB:
- 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
 - 2) The Committee Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.

Regulation 8

- (1) A party shall give to the authority within the period of time provided for in the following provisions of this regulation a notice stating –
- (a) whether he intends to attend or be represented at the hearing;
 - (b) whether he considers a hearing to be unnecessary
- (2) In a case where a party wishes any other person (other than the person he intends to represent him at the hearing) to appear at the hearing, the notice referred to in paragraph (1) shall contain a request for permission for such other person to appear at the hearing accompanied by details of the name of that person and a brief description of the point or points on which that person may be able to assist the authority in relation to the application, representations or notice of the party making the request.

- (3) In the case of a hearing under –

- (a) section 48(3)(a) (cancellation of interim authority notice following police objection), or
- (b) section 105(2)(a) (counter notice following police objection to temporary event notice),

the party shall give the notice no later than one working day before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

- (4) In the case of a hearing under –

- (a) section 167(5)(a) (review of premises licence following closure order),
- (b) paragraph 4(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application for conversion of existing licence), paragraph 16(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application for conversion of existing club certificate)
- (c) paragraph 26(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application by holder of justices' licence for grant of personal licence),

the party shall give the notice no later than two working days before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

- (5) In any other case, the party shall give the notice no later than five working days before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.
