Dean Crouch	<p>Q. How was Hillsborough Park benefitting from hosting the Tramlines event if they were not receiving any funding for it?</p> <p>A. Hillsborough Park does receive some income from the Tramlines event and the Council is in discussions with Tramlines regarding their contributions for future years. Any future questions relating to Tramlines may be better directed to the Economic Development and Skills Policy Committee.</p>	Cllr Richard Williams
Andrea Flutter	<p>Q. Andrea Flutter asked the LAC to clarify the Council's ability to enforce a re-entry policy for the Tramlines event.</p> <p>A. Whilst this question has been asked of the LAC, this Committee confirms that SCC does not have any rights to enforce Tramlines to adopt a re-entry policy. Nor is this a decision for the Safety Advisory Group (SAG). The SAG is administered by Sheffield City Council, its core members are: -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SCC Health & Safety • SCC Highways • SCC Licensing • SCC Major Events Team • South Yorkshire Police • Yorkshire Ambulance Service • South Yorkshire Fire & Rescue <p>As the name suggests, the group acts on an advisory basis. Following the 2021 Tramlines event, the continuation of the no re-entry policy was put forward by Tramlines for review by the SAG, who agreed it was the best option operationally, on the grounds of public safety and to mitigate anti-social behaviour. The SAG understands the reasons for continuing to adopt the no re-entry policy, which support a more manageable environment throughout the festival weekend both on and off site.
