#### White Ribbon Accreditation

 White Ribbon is a global campaign that encourages people, and especially men and boys, to individually and collectively take action and change the behaviour and culture that leads to abuse and violence.

 To wear a white ribbon is to promise to never to commit, excuse or remain silent about male violence against women.

 This shows our commitment to working towards achieving gender equality and ending violence against women and girls.

## Some of the actions that Sheffield City Council have already taken include:

 The launch of our first Women and Girls Night-time Safety Charter

- Development of resources for Sheffield Against Sexual Harassment, including the promotion of the Ask for Angela scheme in venues, bars and other premises
- Support for the city's Violence Against Women and Girls Forum.



#### What does Youth Voice & Influence mean?

 By Youth Voice & Influence we mean listening to young people, valuing what we hear and acting upon it to make positive change.

• We support and empower young people to shape, lead and produce their own activities and programmes.

 We ensure that we have the mechanisms in place to support young people to be involved in decision making at all levels.

### Context to the work with young people:

 South Yorkshire Police Young People's Independent Advisory Group (SYP YP IAG) initially raised cat calling and sexual harassment as an issue in Summer 2021

- Sheffield Youth Cabinet (SYC) elections started in November 2021 where a lot of young people identified Sexual Harassment as an issue they would like to tackle
  - SYP YP IAG and SYC joined forces to work with MyPockets film company in developing the animation

- Made by young people for young people and communities
- Throughout the film the group chose to 'talk' to boys and men however they do recognise that they are not the only perpetrators and would love boys and men to be part of the solution!
