Report of the Chief Licensing Officer

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ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

New standards arrangements were introduced by the Localism Act 2011. The new regime made changes to the way that members' interests are registered and declared.

If you are present at a meeting of the Council, of its executive or any committee of the executive, or of any committee, sub-committee, joint committee, or joint sub-committee of the authority, and you have a **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest** (DPI) relating to any business that will be considered at the meeting, you must <u>not</u>:

- participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your Disclosable Pecuniary Interest during the meeting, participate further in any discussion of the business, or
- participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

These prohibitions apply to any form of participation, including speaking as a member of the public.

You must:

- leave the room (in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct)
- make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of any DPI at any meeting at which you are present at which an item of business which affects or relates to the subject matter of that interest is under consideration, at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent.
- declare it to the meeting and notify the Council's Monitoring Officer within 28 days, if the DPI is not already registered.

If you have any of the following pecuniary interests, they are your **disclosable pecuniary interests** under the new national rules. You have a pecuniary interest if you, or your spouse or civil partner, have a pecuniary interest.

- Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain, which you, or your spouse or civil partner, undertakes.
- Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from your council or authority) made or provided within the relevant period* in respect of any expenses incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

*The relevant period is the 12 months ending on the day when you tell the Monitoring Officer about your disclosable pecuniary interests.

- Any contract which is made between you, or your spouse or your civil partner (or a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest) and your council or authority -
 - under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and
 - which has not been fully discharged.
- Any beneficial interest in land which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, have and which is within the area of your council or authority.
- Any licence (alone or jointly with others) which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, holds to occupy land in the area of your council or authority for a month or longer.
- Any tenancy where (to your knowledge) -
 - the landlord is your council or authority; and
 - the tenant is a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest.
- Any beneficial interest which you, or your spouse or your civil partner has in securities of a body where -
 - (a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of your council or authority; and
 - (b) either
 - the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or
 - if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

Under the Council's Code of Conduct, members must act in accordance with the Seven Principles of Public Life (selflessness; integrity; objectivity; accountability; openness; honesty; and leadership), including the principle of honesty, which says that 'holders of public office have a duty to declare any private interests relating to their public duties and to take steps to resolve any conflicts arising in a way that protects the public interest'.

If you attend a meeting at which any item of business is to be considered and you are aware that you have a **personal interest** in the matter which does not amount to a DPI, you must make verbal declaration of the existence and nature of that interest at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent. You should leave the room if your continued presence is incompatible with the 7 Principles of Public Life.

You have a personal interest where -

- a decision in relation to that business might reasonably be regarded as affecting the well-being or financial standing (including interests in land and easements over land) of you or a member of your family or a person or an organisation with whom you have a close association to a greater extent than it would affect the majority of the Council Tax payers, ratepayers or inhabitants of the ward or electoral area for which you have been elected or otherwise of the Authority's administrative area, or
- it relates to or is likely to affect any of the interests that are defined as DPIs but are in respect of a member of your family (other than a partner) or a person with whom you have a close association.

Guidance on declarations of interest, incorporating regulations published by the Government in relation to Disclosable Pecuniary Interests, has been circulated to you previously, and has been published on the Council's website as a downloadable document at -<u>http://councillors.sheffield.gov.uk/councillors/register-of-councillors-interests</u>

You should identify any potential interest you may have relating to business to be considered at the meeting. This will help you and anyone that you ask for advice to fully consider all the circumstances before deciding what action you should take.

In certain circumstances the Council may grant a **dispensation** to permit a Member to take part in the business of the Authority even if the member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest relating to that business.

To obtain a dispensation, you must write to the Monitoring Officer at least 48 hours before the meeting in question, explaining why a dispensation is sought and desirable, and specifying the period of time for which it is sought. The Monitoring Officer may consult with the Independent Person or the Council's Standards Committee in relation to a request for dispensation.



1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an Application to Vary a Premises Licence made under the Licensing Act 2003.

2.0 THE APPLICATION

- 2.1 The applicant is Sheffield Industrial Museums Trust.
- 2.2 The application, which was received on 6 November 2012 is attached to this report labelled Appendix 'A'.
- 2.3 Page 2 of the application form details briefly the proposed variation.
- 2.4 The current premises licence is attached at Appendix 'B'.

3.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 3.1 Representations concerning the application for variation have been received from the following :-
 - Local Residents
 Attached at Appendix 'C'
- 3.2 As the representations have not been resolved, the matter is referred to the Licensing Committee.
- 3.3 The applicant and representatives from 3.1 have been invited to attend the hearing. Copies of the front page of the notices are attached to this report labelled Appendix 'D'.

4.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 There are no specific financial implications arising from this application. However, additional costs may be incurred should the matter go to appeal. In such an eventuality it may not be possible to recover all these costs. The impact of these additional costs (if any) will be kept under review and may be subject of a further report during the year.

5.0 THE LEGAL POSITION

- 5.1 The Licensing Act 2003 at section 4 (1) requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives which section 4(2) sets out as:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder,
 - b) public safety,
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance,
 - d) the protection of children from harm.

5.2 Section 4(3) of the Licensing Act also requires the Licensing Authority to have regard to the published statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182.

6.0 HEARINGS REGULATIONS

- 6.1 Regulations governing hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 have been made by the Secretary of State.
- 6.2 The Licensing Authority has provided all parties with the information required in the Regulations to the 2003 Act as set out at Appendix 'E'.
- 6.3 Attached at Appendix 'E' is the following:
 - a) a copy of the Notice of Hearing;
 - b) the rights of a party provided in Regulations 15 and 16;
 - c) the consequences if a party does not attend or is not represented at the hearing
 - d) the procedure to be followed at the hearing.

7.0 APPEALS

7.1 The Licensing Act 2003 section 181 and Schedule 5 makes provision for appeals to be made by the applicant and those making representations against decisions of the Licensing Authority, to the Magistrates' Court.

8.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

8.1 That members carefully consider the representations made and take such steps, as the Committee consider necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

9.0 OPTIONS OPEN TO THE COMMITTEE

- 9.1 To vary the premises licence in the terms requested.
- 9.2 To vary the premises licence with modified conditions.
- 9.3 To reject the whole or part of the application.

It is proposed the condition 4 remains as currently stipulated, as the proposed additional July event would be covered by the description of "any similar event or function"

(d) Condition 5

To be amended so as to read "In respect of external sales at the Victorian Christmas market or summer event of a similar nature, the location shall be pre-nominated and recorded by the Designated Premises Supervisor".

(e) Condition 8

Currently there is a prohibition on all off sales however, permission is sought to enable off sales on a limited basis so as to facilitate the sale of locally brewed real ale from the site along with other local products tying in with the historical nature of the area and the historic ties between the brewers and the steel works. It is proposed that Condition 8 be amended to read:

"Off sales be permitted in relation to the museum shop area and café and as per condition 5 above"

An assessment as to the amendments has been undertaken with regard to the 4 licensing objectives. It is considered that the extension of the area for all licensable activities will have no adverse impact, the premises being closely supervised during events and alcohol remaining an ancillary aspect. With regard to the extension of regulated entertainment both internally and externally, application has been drafted so as to restrict the external usage period and it is believed that such restriction will avoid public nuisance arising.

The application to allow off sales is limited in scope and such sales are anticipated to be ancillary to the overall sales within the museum shop or café.







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Annex 1A – Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory Condition 1 (Section 19 ss 2)

Where a licence authorises the sale of alcohol then no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence –

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

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Annex 1C - Mandatory Conditions effective from 1st October 2010:

These mandatory conditions apply where the licence authorises the supply of alcohol. The condition 5 does not apply where the licence authorises the sale by retail or supply of alcohol only for consumption off the premises.

- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

- 10. Where appropriate, prominent legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.

Regarding Kelham Island Museum, Alma Street, S3 8RY application to extend opening hours.

I have to express my opposition to the proposed license changes the museum is applying for.

The venue joins onto residential apartments which are considered to be in an exclusive development. Indeed one function area shares a wall with three flats. The continued noise to later hours is not acceptable for the approximately 25 flats that are directly next to the museum.

Equally, the present license terms have already resulted in unacceptable levels of noise from museum patrons at late hours, to extend the hours that this would cover is not supported by any resident within the building.

With regard to the Christmas market and proposed summer event and extended hours for external events, again I must oppose. These events cause near chaos all around Kelham Island, from Shalesmoor roundabout to the end of Alma Street, with horrific parking and traffic to negotiate, along with violations of parking regulations. It is not safe as a pedestrian either during these times. Residents cannot access their secure parking easily due to poorly controlled crowds blocking the access road (also the emergency vehicle access road). Security of the building has been compromised on past events due to patrons of these markets mistaking an entering or exiting resident as using a museum door and following them through. During previous events, the stewards representing the museum have refused access to myself and my partner on separate and multiple incidences because we weren't ticket holders for the event. Explaning that we lived in the residences wasn't sufficient to the extent that I was escorted to the front door of the building by one steward. When these events are held, the residents of Kelham Riverside have to endure three days of stressful living conditions. While we can put up with the occassional disruption, multiple events and events running later would only add to the stress.

The proposed changes to the license would not adhere to any of the four licensing objectives. Given that a temporary event notice is not a difficult application, it would be preferred of the museum could not extend it's opening hours, internal and external licensed activity hours or extend markets.

The museum is planning a major extension to its current licensing arrangements.

These include extending the time allowed for plays and indoor sporting events, recorded music (indoors and outdoors), performance of dance, and most worryingly late night refreshment and sale of alcohol, all to 2am, with hours of opening extended until 2.30am, 7 days a week. I believe currently the licence permits staying open until 11.30pm except for 1am closing 10 days a year.

The museum lies within a largely residential area, and my apartment building is about 40 metres from the museum entrance, on the small cobbled road that leads to the museum. My apartment faces on to this road. I believe that the proposed extensive changes to the licence will lead to an unacceptable level of noise and disruption in the early hours, on a nightly basis. The events at the museum are expected to attract in excess of 100 people. This number of people leaving between 2am and 2.30am, whether by foot (after a few drinks), taxi or private car will create a great deal of noise and disturbance.

I have no objection to the museum trying to be financially healthy and I support the main aims of education for the people of Sheffield, but I do not understand why this needs to equate to a 2.30am closing time.
