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ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

New standards arrangements were introduced by the Localism Act 2011. The new regime made changes to the way that members' interests are registered and declared.

If you are present at a meeting of the Council, of its executive or any committee of the executive, or of any committee, sub-committee, joint committee, or joint sub-committee of the authority, and you have a **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest** (DPI) relating to any business that will be considered at the meeting, you must <u>not</u>:

- participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your Disclosable Pecuniary Interest during the meeting, participate further in any discussion of the business, or
- participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

These prohibitions apply to any form of participation, including speaking as a member of the public.

You must:

- leave the room (in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct)
- make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of any DPI at any meeting at which you are present at which an item of business which affects or relates to the subject matter of that interest is under consideration, at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent.
- declare it to the meeting and notify the Council's Monitoring Officer within 28 days, if the DPI is not already registered.

If you have any of the following pecuniary interests, they are your **disclosable pecuniary interests** under the new national rules. You have a pecuniary interest if you, or your spouse or civil partner, have a pecuniary interest.

- Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain, which you, or your spouse or civil partner, undertakes.
- Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from your council or authority) made or provided within the relevant period* in respect of any expenses incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

*The relevant period is the 12 months ending on the day when you tell the Monitoring Officer about your disclosable pecuniary interests.

- Any contract which is made between you, or your spouse or your civil partner (or a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest) and your council or authority -
 - under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and
 - which has not been fully discharged.
- Any beneficial interest in land which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, have and which is within the area of your council or authority.
- Any licence (alone or jointly with others) which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, holds to occupy land in the area of your council or authority for a month or longer.
- Any tenancy where (to your knowledge) -
 - the landlord is your council or authority; and
 - the tenant is a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest.
- Any beneficial interest which you, or your spouse or your civil partner has in securities of a body where -
 - (a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of your council or authority; and
 - (b) either
 - the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or
 - if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

Under the Council's Code of Conduct, members must act in accordance with the Seven Principles of Public Life (selflessness; integrity; objectivity; accountability; openness; honesty; and leadership), including the principle of honesty, which says that 'holders of public office have a duty to declare any private interests relating to their public duties and to take steps to resolve any conflicts arising in a way that protects the public interest'.

If you attend a meeting at which any item of business is to be considered and you are aware that you have a **personal interest** in the matter which does not amount to a DPI, you must make verbal declaration of the existence and nature of that interest at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent. You should leave the room if your continued presence is incompatible with the 7 Principles of Public Life.

You have a personal interest where -

- a decision in relation to that business might reasonably be regarded as affecting the well-being or financial standing (including interests in land and easements over land) of you or a member of your family or a person or an organisation with whom you have a close association to a greater extent than it would affect the majority of the Council Tax payers, ratepayers or inhabitants of the ward or electoral area for which you have been elected or otherwise of the Authority's administrative area, or
- it relates to or is likely to affect any of the interests that are defined as DPIs but are in respect of a member of your family (other than a partner) or a person with whom you have a close association.

Guidance on declarations of interest, incorporating regulations published by the Government in relation to Disclosable Pecuniary Interests, has been circulated to you previously, and has been published on the Council's website as a downloadable document at -<u>http://councillors.sheffield.gov.uk/councillors/register-of-councillors-interests</u>

You should identify any potential interest you may have relating to business to be considered at the meeting. This will help you and anyone that you ask for advice to fully consider all the circumstances before deciding what action you should take.

In certain circumstances the Council may grant a **dispensation** to permit a Member to take part in the business of the Authority even if the member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest relating to that business.

To obtain a dispensation, you must write to the Monitoring Officer at least 48 hours before the meeting in question, explaining why a dispensation is sought and desirable, and specifying the period of time for which it is sought. The Monitoring Officer may consult with the Independent Person or the Council's Standards Committee in relation to a request for dispensation.

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

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an Application to Vary a Premises Licence made under the Licensing Act 2003.

2.0 THE APPLICATION

- 2.1 The applicant is JD Wetherspoon PLC.
- 2.2 The application, which was received on 19 November 2012 is attached to this report labelled Appendix 'A'.
- 2.3 Page 2 of the application form details briefly the proposed variation.
- 2.4 The current premises licence is attached at Appendix 'B'.

3.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 3.1 Representations concerning the application for variation have been received from the following :-
 - Local Resident Attached at Appendix 'C'
- 3.2 As the representations have not been resolved, the matter is referred to the Licensing Committee.
- 3.3 The applicant and representatives from 3.1 have been invited to attend the hearing. Copies of the front page of the notices are attached to this report labelled Appendix 'D'.

4.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 There are no specific financial implications arising from this application. However, additional costs may be incurred should the matter go to appeal. In such an eventuality it may not be possible to recover all these costs. The impact of these additional costs (if any) will be kept under review and may be subject of a further report during the year.

5.0 THE LEGAL POSITION

- 5.1 The Licensing Act 2003 at section 4 (1) requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives which section 4(2) sets out as:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder,
 - b) public safety,
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance,
 - d) the protection of children from harm.

5.2 Section 4(3) of the Licensing Act also requires the Licensing Authority to have regard to the published statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182.

6.0 HEARINGS REGULATIONS

- 6.1 Regulations governing hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 have been made by the Secretary of State.
- 6.2 The Licensing Authority has provided all parties with the information required in the Regulations to the 2003 Act as set out at Appendix 'E'.
- 6.3 Attached at Appendix 'E' is the following:
 - a) a copy of the Notice of Hearing;
 - b) the rights of a party provided in Regulations 15 and 16;
 - c) the consequences if a party does not attend or is not represented at the hearing
 - d) the procedure to be followed at the hearing.

7.0 APPEALS

7.1 The Licensing Act 2003 section 181 and Schedule 5 makes provision for appeals to be made by the applicant and those making representations against decisions of the Licensing Authority, to the Magistrates' Court.

8.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

8.1 That members carefully consider the representations made and take such steps, as the Committee consider necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

9.0 OPTIONS OPEN TO THE COMMITTEE

- 9.1 To vary the premises licence in the terms requested.
- 9.2 To vary the premises licence with modified conditions.
- 9.3 To reject the whole or part of the application.

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Annex 1A – Mandatory Conditions

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
 (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.



Re: Notice of Application to vary a Premises Licence, JD Wetherspoon PLC, Rawson Spring, Langsett Road, S6 2UN

I wish to object to the application to vary a premises license for JD Wetherspoon PLC, Rawson Spring, Langsett Road, my reasons are set out below.

We live at Middlewood Road, which is far enough away from the JD Wetherspoon premises for us to not experience direct problems but we live on a main pedestrian route for people to get home from the premises.

Currently we experience a higher noise level on Friday and Saturday nights from the people leaving the JD Wetherspoon premises We notice this more on Friday and Saturday nights as the closing time is 1am (11:30 during the week) and we are often disturbed by people causing a public nuisance by making a lot of noise as they return to their homes walking through dense residential areas as we and our neighbours are sleeping. There is very little traffic at these hours and the occasional shouts and screams of people often wake us up.

Extending the weekday closing hours to 12:30 will mean we experience these problems during the week, we currently accept the level of noise during the week at it always ends well before midnight. The noise will become more of a public nuisance as it will be pushed into quieter hours of the night when people expect to be able to sleep undisturbed. During the week most people need to get up early for school or work, a disturbed nights sleep for these adults and children is a problem.

We have reported many incidents of crime, disorder and public nuisance to the police either via 999 or 101, we believe that some of these are related to drinking from licensed premises on Hillsborough Corner including JD Wetherspoon. Examples include but are not limited to;

- Public Nuisance - people arguing and screaming at each other in the street and at the bus stop - a frequent occurrence

- Crime & Disorder - Drunk people breaking into Hillsborough shopping arcade (Date of offence 21.07.12, Conviction secured in local Magistrates court)

- Crime & Disorder - Drunk man lying down on the tram tracks on Middlewood Road.

We regularly have the problem of drunk people hanging around in our yard late at night, using it as a toilet, and becoming abusive when asked to leave.

We believe that extending the mid week opening hours of JD Wetherspoon will create a precedent and introduce an element of competition among the licensed premises around Hillsborough Corner to all increase their opening hours. If this happens then these problems will become more pronounced over time and occur more frequently later in the night.

A related problem is the issue of Hackney Carriages parking illegally opposite the JD Wetherspoons premises, in Rudyard Road. This has been discussed many times at the Licensing Committee meeting, most recently in the Taxi Enforcement Review dated 8th November 2012 and discussed at the 8th November 2012 Licensing Committee Meeting, the report is available in

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the downloads section at the following URL:

http://meetings.sheffield.gov.uk/council-meetings/licensing-committee/agendas-2012/agenda-8thnovember-2012 report available as a link in the downloads section.

The report states:

"5.2 Rudyard Road. This area continues to be of concern for local residents, an number of warning letters and formal warnings have been issues to drivers who have repeatedly transgressed in this particular area. 5 warning letters and 9 Defect notices have been issued to drivers in this period of enforcement activity, for causing a hazard or obstruction on this particular road."

We believe that these problems whereby taxis cause hazards and obstructions will become worse and continue on longer into the night causing a public nuisance for local residents. When the taxi drivers wait here, they are committing a crime by waiting on an area designated as no waiting with double yellow lines. If midweek opening hours are extended then taxi drivers will wait for a longer time during the week in this location waiting for fares from the last people to leave the JD Wetherspoons premises.

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Right of attendance, assistance and representation

15. Subject to regulations 14(2) and 25, a party may attend the hearing and may be assisted or represented by any person whether or not that person is legally qualified.

Representations and supporting information

- 16. At the hearing a party shall be entitled to -
 - (a) in response to a point upon which the authority has given notice to a party that it will want clarification under regulation 7(1)(d), give further information in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable),
 - (b) if given permission by the authority, question any other party; and
 - (c) address the authority

Failure of parties to attend the hearing

- 20. (1) If a party has informed the authority that he does not intend to attend or be represented at a hearing, the hearing may proceed in his absence.
 - (2) If a party who has not so indicated fails to attend or be represented at a hearing the authority may:--
 - (a) where it considers it to be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the hearing to a specified date, or

- 5. Hearing Procedure:-

 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
 - (c) The Licensing Officer will introduce in turn representatives for the Responsible Authority and Interested Parties who will be asked to detail their relevant representations.
 - (d) Members may ask questions of those parties
 - (e) With the leave of the Chair the applicant or his representative may cross examine the representatives of the Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties.
 - (f) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (g) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) may then be asked questions by members and with the leave of the Chair from the other parties present.
 - (h) The applicant will then be given the opportunity to sum up the application.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for members to take legal advice and consider the application.
- 6. The decision of the Licensing Committee will be given in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and regulations made there under.

 NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.

2) The Committee Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.
