ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

New standards arrangements were introduced by the Localism Act 2011. The new regime made changes to the way that members' interests are registered and declared.

If you are present at a meeting of the Council, of its executive or any committee of the executive, or of any committee, sub-committee, joint committee, or joint sub-committee of the authority, and you have a **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest** (DPI) relating to any business that will be considered at the meeting, you must not:

- participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your Disclosable Pecuniary Interest during the meeting, participate further in any discussion of the business, or
- participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

These prohibitions apply to any form of participation, including speaking as a member of the public.

You must:

- leave the room (in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct)
- make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of any DPI at any
 meeting at which you are present at which an item of business which affects or
 relates to the subject matter of that interest is under consideration, at or before
 the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes
 apparent.
- declare it to the meeting and notify the Council's Monitoring Officer within 28 days, if the DPI is not already registered.

If you have any of the following pecuniary interests, they are your **disclosable pecuniary interests** under the new national rules. You have a pecuniary interest if you, or your spouse or civil partner, have a pecuniary interest.

- Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain, which you, or your spouse or civil partner, undertakes.
- Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from your council or authority) made or provided within the relevant period* in respect of any expenses incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

*The relevant period is the 12 months ending on the day when you tell the Monitoring Officer about your disclosable pecuniary interests.

Page 1

- Any contract which is made between you, or your spouse or your civil partner (or a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest) and your council or authority -
 - under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and
 - which has not been fully discharged.
- Any beneficial interest in land which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, have and which is within the area of your council or authority.
- Any licence (alone or jointly with others) which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, holds to occupy land in the area of your council or authority for a month or longer.
- Any tenancy where (to your knowledge) -
 - the landlord is your council or authority; and
 - the tenant is a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest.
- Any beneficial interest which you, or your spouse or your civil partner has in securities of a body where -
 - (a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of your council or authority; and

(b) either

- the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or
- if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

Under the Council's Code of Conduct, members must act in accordance with the Seven Principles of Public Life (selflessness; integrity; objectivity; accountability; openness; honesty; and leadership), including the principle of honesty, which says that 'holders of public office have a duty to declare any private interests relating to their public duties and to take steps to resolve any conflicts arising in a way that protects the public interest'.

If you attend a meeting at which any item of business is to be considered and you are aware that you have a **personal interest** in the matter which does not amount to a DPI, you must make verbal declaration of the existence and nature of that interest at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent. You should leave the room if your continued presence is incompatible with the 7 Principles of Public Life.

You have a personal interest where –

- a decision in relation to that business might reasonably be regarded as affecting
 the well-being or financial standing (including interests in land and easements
 over land) of you or a member of your family or a person or an organisation with
 whom you have a close association to a greater extent than it would affect the
 majority of the Council Tax payers, ratepayers or inhabitants of the ward or
 electoral area for which you have been elected or otherwise of the Authority's
 administrative area, or
- it relates to or is likely to affect any of the interests that are defined as DPIs but are in respect of a member of your family (other than a partner) or a person with whom you have a close association.

Guidance on declarations of interest, incorporating regulations published by the Government in relation to Disclosable Pecuniary Interests, has been circulated to you previously, and has been published on the Council's website as a downloadable document at -http://councillors.sheffield.gov.uk/councillors/register-of-councillors-interests

You should identify any potential interest you may have relating to business to be considered at the meeting. This will help you and anyone that you ask for advice to fully consider all the circumstances before deciding what action you should take.

In certain circumstances the Council may grant a **dispensation** to permit a Member to take part in the business of the Authority even if the member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest relating to that business.

To obtain a dispensation, you must write to the Monitoring Officer at least 48 hours before the meeting in question, explaining why a dispensation is sought and desirable, and specifying the period of time for which it is sought. The Monitoring Officer may consult with the Independent Person or the Council's Standards Committee in relation to a request for dispensation.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT 1982

STREET TRADING

CONSENT SITE - Livesey Street

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a consent to street trade.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council as a Licensing Authority have power under the provision of the 1982 Act to regulate Street Trading in the City.
- 2.2 A Street Trading Consent is required to trade on any Street (which includes roads, footways, forecourts, or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City Boundary.
- 2.3 The Licensing Committee at it's meeting of 29th January 2002 passed the following resolution:
 - 1. That under the provisions of schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982:
 - all streets (which includes roads, footways, forecourts or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City boundary, shall be designated consent streets and;
 - (b) such street trading designation shall take effect as from the 1st April 2002; and
 - (c) all previous designations in relation to street trading will be rescinded as a result of the designation set out above.
 - 2. The effect of this resolution is that from 1st April 2002, it will be an offence to engage in street trading in any street or any other place identified in the above resolution without being authorised to do so by consent from the City Council.
- 2.4 A Local Authority may attach conditions to a Street Trading Consent. The conditions may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street and danger to persons using the street or nuisance or annoyance.
- 2.5 A Street Trading Consent may only be granted for a maximum period of twelve months.
- 2.6 There is no appeal procedure against the refusal or revocation of a consent. An applicant may, however apply for judicial review of the councils decision.

3.0 THE APPLICATION

- 3.1 The applicants are Shelley and Andrew Roberts and a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 'A'.
- 3.2 The application is to sell hot and cold sandwiches, hot and cold drinks, confectionary.
- 3.3 The application is to trade from a site on Livesey Street. A copy of the location of the site is attached at Appendix 'B'.
- 3.4 A copy of the Council's City Wide Street Trading Quality Specification is attached at Appendix 'C'.

4.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

4.1 Objections to the application have been received from a local business.

5.0 BACKGROUND

- 5.1 Shelley and Andrew Roberts submitted an application for a static street trading consent on 1st February 2013.
- 5.2 The application and plan were circulated, in the usual manner, to South Yorkshire Police, South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, Planning and Highways on 1st February 2013.



I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your registration form for the above premises, the details of which have been entered on the register. I take this opportunity to remind you that you must notify this Department of any subsequent changes to the business or if you cease trading.

High risk food businesses (such as caterers, cafes, restaurants, takeaways etc.) will be inspected on a regular basis. Low risk businesses (such as corner shops) may be visited less frequently or be required to complete a self-assessment form instead of being visited. Inspections are normally carried out on a 'spot check' basis.

You will need to make sure the business complies with the food hygiene Regulations. These include the requirement to keep the premises clean, maintain them in good repair, provide adequate facilities, make sure staff are adequately instructed or trained in food hygiene matters and produce a written food safety management system. 



1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a consent to street trade.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council as a Licensing Authority have power under the provision of the 1982 Act to regulate Street Trading in the City.
- 2.2 A Street Trading Consent is required to trade on any Street (which includes roads, footways, forecourts, or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City Boundary.
- 2.3 The Licensing Committee at it's meeting of 29th January 2002 passed the following resolution:
 - 1. That under the provisions of schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982:
 - (a) all streets (which includes roads, footways, forecourts or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City boundary, shall be designated consent streets and:
 - (b) such street trading designation shall take effect as from the 1st April 2002; and
 - (c) all previous designations in relation to street trading will be rescinded as a result of the designation set out above.
 - 2. The effect of this resolution is that from 1st April 2002, it will be an offence to engage in street trading in any street or any other place identified in the above resolution without being authorised to do so by consent from the City Council.
- 2.4 A Local Authority may attach conditions to a Street Trading Consent. The conditions may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street and danger to persons using the street or nuisance or annoyance.
- 2.5 A Street Trading Consent may only be granted for a maximum period of twelve months.
- 2.6 There is no appeal procedure against the refusal or revocation of a consent. An applicant may, however apply for judicial review of the councils decision.

CITY WIDE STREET TRADING QUALITY SPECIFICATION (This specification does not include the city centre)

UNIT DESIGN

- Good display is an important part of the selling process and top quality presentation encourages purchase and benefits the retailers' reputation.
- It is in the best interest of traders to produce a high quality design both internally and externally in their unit.
- The function of the unit is to identify the trader and add vitality and colour to the immediate area, and reflect the quality, cleanliness in their operation. The unit must contribute to the appearance of the area for good or bad, so design matters to everyone who uses the street, as well as the operator.



Dear General Licensing,

We write in regard to the above application of which you kindly provided the University of Sheffield a copy of to provide comment.

The University has serious concerns over the use of Portobello as a location for a Street trader, we set out our concerns below.

Portobello is a pedestrianized public highway which has created an attractive route for both pedestrians and cyclists. Portobello is one of the signed cycle routes promoted by Sheffield City Council and provides a popular route from Leavygreave Road all the way to Haymarket.

Portobello has a configuration of a single cycle route, with a footpath either side. The current street trader completely blocks the northern footpath and creates a blockage across the route with customers waiting to be served. As the route is used by students of the University and a high number of cyclist, the university believes this location is unsuitable for a trader given that a conflict between cyclist and pedestrians is created.

It is recognised that a great deal of planning and expenditure has taken place to create an attractive pedestrianized area, which is popular to the residents of Sheffield, students and visitors of the University. We are of the opinion that static traders in this location of the city are not appropriate and detract from the work on public realm space that has already begun. The University is working closely with Sheffield City Council on improving realm space around the Universitys campus. This is an area which has been identified for further improvement and the locating of a trader in this location will impede these plans.

The University has concerns on the health and safety grounds, as discussed this is based on the safety both pedestrians and cyclists. In addition we have concerns over how this unit will generate its power cooking and lighting. With no local power sources we assume the unit maybe powered by a generators. Should this be the case then the noise and fumes from the unit would be unsuitable for this location as both teaching and office accommodation is situated either side of Portobello.

Extraction from the unit will push food smells to the surrounding location, this will provide both and unattractive environment for people using the area but also for the University buildings surrounding the unit.

With regard to the Portobello Street Trading application I would comment as follows.

With the amount of information provided with Mrs Wu's recent application we have been able to make more detailed comments than we could on the previous application for this street.

We consulted our Traffic Regulations Team regarding any formal vehicle or cycle restrictions on Portobello. They have confirmed the following:-

"With reference to your enquiry regarding the traffic regulations in place on Portobello, I would advise you that it has a Prohibition of Driving Except for Access restriction at its entrance from St Georges Terrace/Regent Street. The other end of Portobello where it joins Mappin Street is closed off with several bollards in place to prevent vehicle access.

In effect, It is essentially a pedestrian street which can be also be used by cyclists and any motor vehicles which need to gain access to any of the premises along its length".

This means that motor vehicles of any size, for the purpose of access and/or deliveries, can drive down Portobello from the top end (off Regent Street). They then have to make manoeuvres to turn around or reverse back up Portobello. This is the nature of this pedestrianised access road to which the University buildings require delivery and emergency vehicle access.

It could be considered that such access is rarely required.

However, we have a legal duty to consider pedestrian safety and wherever there is a possible mix of vehicles, cycles and pedestrians there is always a risk of injury. This can be said of Portobello along its full length and as it is today, without any trader present.

With the introduction of a catering trailer then the risk is increased considerably, primarily because the trailer occupies what is effectively a footway. When any vehicles or cycles access any part of Portobello pedestrians can naturally get out of the way and the footways provide this refuge. The trailer would not only present an obstruction of this refuge but customers waiting to be served would have to move out of the way if a vehicle required access to service or deliver to the University buildings at the bottom of the street.

Unlike the Fargate pedestrian precinct there is no time restriction for vehicular access and there is little room for vehicles that do need access to manoeuvre on Portobello.

It is on the grounds of general pedestrian safety that we have to object to the proposal.

SUB-COMMITTEE HEARING PROCEDURE

his procedure has been drawn up to assist those parties attending Street Trading Consent Committee hearings.

- 1. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.
- 2. The Chair will ask the applicants and interested parties to formally introduce themselves.
- 3. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 4. Hearing Procedure:-
 - (a) The Licensing Officer will introduce the report.
 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
 - (c) The applicant/consent holder (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (d) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the applicant and/or his/her representative.
 - (e) Consultees / interested parties will be invited to present their representations or elect a spokesperson (which may be a Councillor) to speak on their behalf. New representations must not be raised.
 - (f) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the consultees / interested parties.
 - (g) The consultees / interested parties will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (h) The applicant will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for Members to take legal advice and consider the application.
 - (k) Once a decision has been reached, all parties will be invited to return. The Sub-Committee's decision and reasons will be announced by the Chair.
 - (l) The Sub-Committee's decision will be confirmed in writing to the applicant and those parties who made representations.
- NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
 - 2) The Committee Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.

There is no right of appeal against the Council's decision to refuse to grant or revoke a Street Trading Consent.
