Report of the Chief Licensing Officer

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ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

New standards arrangements were introduced by the Localism Act 2011. The new regime made changes to the way that members' interests are registered and declared.

If you are present at a meeting of the Council, of its executive or any committee of the executive, or of any committee, sub-committee, joint committee, or joint sub-committee of the authority, and you have a **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest** (DPI) relating to any business that will be considered at the meeting, you must <u>not</u>:

- participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your Disclosable Pecuniary Interest during the meeting, participate further in any discussion of the business, or
- participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

These prohibitions apply to any form of participation, including speaking as a member of the public.

You must:

- leave the room (in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct)
- make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of any DPI at any meeting at which you are present at which an item of business which affects or relates to the subject matter of that interest is under consideration, at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent.
- declare it to the meeting and notify the Council's Monitoring Officer within 28 days, if the DPI is not already registered.

If you have any of the following pecuniary interests, they are your **disclosable pecuniary interests** under the new national rules. You have a pecuniary interest if you, or your spouse or civil partner, have a pecuniary interest.

- Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain, which you, or your spouse or civil partner, undertakes.
- Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from your council or authority) made or provided within the relevant period* in respect of any expenses incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

*The relevant period is the 12 months ending on the day when you tell the Monitoring Officer about your disclosable pecuniary interests.

- Any contract which is made between you, or your spouse or your civil partner (or a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest) and your council or authority -
 - under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and
 - which has not been fully discharged.
- Any beneficial interest in land which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, have and which is within the area of your council or authority.
- Any licence (alone or jointly with others) which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, holds to occupy land in the area of your council or authority for a month or longer.
- Any tenancy where (to your knowledge) -
 - the landlord is your council or authority; and
 - the tenant is a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest.
- Any beneficial interest which you, or your spouse or your civil partner has in securities of a body where -
 - (a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of your council or authority; and
 - (b) either
 - the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or
 - if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

Under the Council's Code of Conduct, members must act in accordance with the Seven Principles of Public Life (selflessness; integrity; objectivity; accountability; openness; honesty; and leadership), including the principle of honesty, which says that 'holders of public office have a duty to declare any private interests relating to their public duties and to take steps to resolve any conflicts arising in a way that protects the public interest'.

If you attend a meeting at which any item of business is to be considered and you are aware that you have a **personal interest** in the matter which does not amount to a DPI, you must make verbal declaration of the existence and nature of that interest at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent. You should leave the room if your continued presence is incompatible with the 7 Principles of Public Life.

You have a personal interest where -

- a decision in relation to that business might reasonably be regarded as affecting the well-being or financial standing (including interests in land and easements over land) of you or a member of your family or a person or an organisation with whom you have a close association to a greater extent than it would affect the majority of the Council Tax payers, ratepayers or inhabitants of the ward or electoral area for which you have been elected or otherwise of the Authority's administrative area, or
- it relates to or is likely to affect any of the interests that are defined as DPIs but are in respect of a member of your family (other than a partner) or a person with whom you have a close association.

Guidance on declarations of interest, incorporating regulations published by the Government in relation to Disclosable Pecuniary Interests, has been circulated to you previously, and has been published on the Council's website as a downloadable document at -<u>http://councillors.sheffield.gov.uk/councillors/register-of-councillors-interests</u>

You should identify any potential interest you may have relating to business to be considered at the meeting. This will help you and anyone that you ask for advice to fully consider all the circumstances before deciding what action you should take.

In certain circumstances the Council may grant a **dispensation** to permit a Member to take part in the business of the Authority even if the member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest relating to that business.

To obtain a dispensation, you must write to the Monitoring Officer at least 48 hours before the meeting in question, explaining why a dispensation is sought and desirable, and specifying the period of time for which it is sought. The Monitoring Officer may consult with the Independent Person or the Council's Standards Committee in relation to a request for dispensation.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT 1982

<u>STREET TRADING – SCHOOLS (ICE CREAM) STREET TRADING</u> <u>CONSENT – TINSLEY NURSERY AND INFANT SCHOOL.</u>

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a Schools (ice cream) Street Trading consent.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council as a Licensing Authority have power under the provision of the 1982 Act to regulate Street Trading in the City.
- 2.2 A Street Trading Consent is required to trade on any Street (which includes roads, footways, forecourts, or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City Boundary.
- 2.3 The Licensing Committee at it's meeting of 29th January 2002 passed the following resolution:
 - 1. That under the provisions of schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982:
 - (a) all streets (which includes roads, footways, forecourts or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City boundary, shall be designated consent streets and;
 - (b) such street trading designation shall take effect as from the 1st April 2002; and
 - (c) all previous designations in relation to street trading will be rescinded as a result of the designation set out above.
 - 2. The effect of this resolution is that from 1st April 2002, it will be an offence to engage in street trading in any street or any other place identified in the above resolution without being authorised to do so by consent from the City Council.
- 2.4 A Local Authority may attach conditions to a Street Trading Consent. The conditions may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street and danger to persons using the street or nuisance or annoyance.
- 2.5 A Street Trading Consent may only be granted for a maximum period of twelve months.

(i)

2.6 There is no appeal procedure against the refusal or revocation of a consent. An applicant may, however apply for judicial review of the Council's decision.

3.0 THE APPLICATION

- 3.1 The applicants are Peter Devoti and Zoe Devoti and a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 'A'.
- 3.2 The application was submitted on 17th April 2013.
- 3.3 The application is to sell ice cream, soft drinks, lollies, water and confectionary.

4.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

4.1 Objection to the application has been received from South Yorkshire Police and Tinsley Nursery and Infant School.

5.0 BACKGROUND

- 5.1 Peter Devoti and Zoe Devoti submitted an application for a School (ice cream) Street Trading consent on 17th April 2013. Peter Devoti currently holds a City Wide Mobile Consent, which expires on 31st March 2014.
- 5.2 The application was circulated, in the usual manner, to South Yorkshire Police, South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, Highways and Planning on 19th April 2013.
- 5.3 Objections have been received from South Yorkshire Police and Tinsley Nursery and Infant School and are attached to the report at Appendix 'B'.
- 5.4 Members should note that the Council Street Trading Policy states at page 21, paragraph 3.5.3, that "Applicants are required to obtain written confirmation from the head teacher of the school they wish to trade outside from. This written confirmation must be on school headed paper and will not be accepted in any other form". The applicants have contacted Tinsley Nursery and Infant School with regards to obtaining written confirmation to which Tinsley Nursery and Infant School has responded with the above referred to objection. A copy of the Council's Street Trading Policy is available via the following link; https://www.sheffield.gov.uk/business-economy/licensing/general-licensing/retail/street-trading.html. Members should note that the age restriction of 5 years for motorised vehicles is under review and is not presently being enforced.
- 5.5 Members should also note that the Licensing Service wrote to Mr Devoti on 20th March 2013, following receipt of a complaint with regards to the location of the ice cream vehicle belonging to Peter Devoti, whilst trading at Tinsley Nursery and Infant School. A copy of the aforementioned letter is attached at Appendix'C'.
- 5.6 The applicant and objectors have been invited to attend the Licensing Committee hearing. Copies of the invites are attached at Appendix 'D'.

5.7 A copy of the hearing procedure is attached at Appendix 'E'.

6.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

6.1 There are no financial implications for the Council arising from this report.

7.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

7.1 That Members consider all the relevant information available and any representations that may be made.

Dear Mrs Turley,

In response to your enquiry regarding the school's view on an application you have received from Mr Devoti for Street Trading Consent outside Tinsley Nursery Infant School, the school's view has not changed since August 2008 when you refused a previous application. The safety and well being of our children are our main concerns. We object most strongly to consent being granted for street trading in the vicinity of the school.

The ice cream van creates a dangerous obstruction to pedestrians and other road users when parked on Siemens Close and on Bawtry Road close to the pelican crossing that our children and parents use. Tinsley NI is situated on Siemens Close, a dead end street. Traffic at the beginning and end of the school day is very busy with parents dropping off and collecting children. As there is nowhere to turn round, cars have to reverse the length of the street back on to Bawtry Road. This is dangerous for our pedestrians as cars also park on the corners and on Bawtry Road. The ice cream van blocks the view of drivers and of pedestrians trying to cross. We have enlisted the support of our Police Community Support Officers on numerous occasions to move the van on and deal with other inconsiderate drivers because of the danger to our children and their parents.

We hope you will take our concerns into account when considering the application.

Please find scanned below copies of two statements, from both myself and PCSO Thorpe regarding the issues surround the parking of an icecream van on Siemens Close, Tinsley, Sheffield. I have retained the originals in my tray until I can drop them round to your office.

You will see that I have spoken to Mr Devoti regarding him operating without a current licence and he moved on request and did not return the next day. I am hopeful he will continue to take this view until such time as a renewal is determined.

It is the police opinion that wherever such a vehicle was parked on Siemens Close then this would not be supported by the school or police and would put the safety of the children at risk. Perhaps an alternative siting could be on Newburn Drive which is the next road along from the school. In essence it appears to be a wider and longer road, less constricted with vehicles and has another entrance to the school playground. This is only a suggestion and is in no way to be interpreted as an unchallenged alternative as clearly assessment will need to be made.

I look forward to hearing from you with details of the proposed licensing board hearing. Can you please acknowledge receipt.

I am a Police Constable with the South Yorkshire Police currently posted to Attercliffe Police Station,
attached to the East Safer Neighbourhood Team, Sheffield.
I have been employed in this role for around three and a half years and Tinsley is an area which is within
the area I patrol. Over this time I have attended on Siemens Close, Tinsley, Sheffield to deal with issues
arising out of vehicles parking inconsiderately and illegally along this road which is a small cul-de-sac which
provides one of the entrances to Tinsley Junior and Infants School. I have previously offered advice and
requests to move to motorists parked illegally on this road. I have also issued fixed penalty notices to
vehicles who were unattended and I was unable to locate their drivers to request their removal.
On Monday 17 June 2013 I was on duty in full police uniform, when, as a result of information received, I
attended at Siemens Close, Tinsley, Sheffield. At this location I could see that an ice cream van, registered
number DK08YFN was parked on Siemens Close. It was parked nearside to kerb, facing Bawtry Road,
approximately 20 metres from the junction. The vehicle was running and a male whom I now know to be
Peter DEVOTI 07.07.1960 was serving ice cream to the public.
After introductions I requested to see the trading consent issued to Mr Devoti. He indicated to a laminated
notice that was affixed in the rear of his vehicle that showed an expiry date of 31 March 2013. I pointed
this out to Mr DEVOTI who stated he had made a new application, paid the fee and the renewal had simply
not been received. I informed Mr DEVOTI that I had spoken with the Sheffield City Council Licensing
Department who had confirmed that Mr DEVOTI was not currently operating within a Trading Consent as

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he had not submitted a renewal application in good time, but also that he had not complied with the direction to make a new application, as had all applicants for Street Trading Consents as there had been a change in the terms of these consents. I encouraged Mr DEVOTI to familiarise himself with the requirements. Following a further brief discussion, Mr DEVOTI then moved on my request. On Tuesday 18 June 2013 I was on duty in full police uniform when I re-visited Siemens Close, Tinsley,

Sheffield at approximately 1455 hours. At this time there was no ice cream van present.

I am a Police Community Support Officer currently posted to Attercliffe Police Station attached to the East
Safer Neighbourhood Team.
I have worked in this role for approximately 4 years and throughout I have had responsibility for policing in
the Tinsley area of Sheffield. My role includes regular visits to the local schools and high visibility patrols of
the Tinsley area. I have regular contact with both the Junior School and Nursery and Infant School at
Tinsley.
Tinsley Infants School, which is accessed by entrances from Siemens Close and Newburn Drive, Tinsley,
Sheffield is identified as a high risk to children's safety and as a result Sheffield City Council regularly work
with the school to educate the children and raise awareness.
As a result of information passed to me and direct observations I have conducted a number of operations t
address concerns regarding speeding vehicles and parking issues around the school, which are specifically
around the start and end of the school day.
Historically the parking around the school has been an issue; however, I can say that over the last couple c
years there seems to have been an increase in the number of parents wishing to take their children to
school in vehicles. This in turn causes congestion around the area and Siemens Close is particularly
difficult. It is a small cul de sac and there are school yellow painted zig-zag lines directly painted onto the
road surface outside the school. Across the road from the school are residential properties and many of
these households regularly park their personal vehicles at this location. When school is about to finish for

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the day the road experiences an influx of vehicles wanting to park up nearby to allow children to be collected. Over the last couple of years I have been aware of an ice cream van parking up on Siemens Close, in various locations along this road. The specific issues of this vehicle being parked at the end of the road, facing away from Bawtry Road alongside the railings has resulted in other vehicles entering Siemens Close with their view obstructed by the van. As a result I requested the driver of the van, a male I now know to be Mr Peter Devoti was spoken to myself and moved on as requested. On the occasions I have asked Mr Devoti to move which is around 2-3 times he was parked right on the junction, in a dangerous position. I made the decision not to issue a fixed penalty ticket for being parked in a dangerous position as I was more concerned with ensuring he moved the vehicle.

I have spoken to Mr Devoti on a few occasions regarding the parking issues at the finish of the school day. Despite frequent requests by staff and myself for the children to remain aware and check before crossing the road, the children are excited and eager to get to the ice cream van when they come out of school and often run straight into the road. To my knowledge there have been no collisions, but in my opinion it is only a matter of time before this occurs.

From discussions with staff at the school I am aware that they have also spoken to Mr Devoti and requested him to move for safety reasons. From my speaking to Mr Devoti he was abrupt and clearly not happy to be redirected. Mr Devoti accused me of being racist, although this clearly was not the case. I would describe Mr Devoti as male, white, around his mid forties, medium build, with cropped dark coloured hair. He operates from an ice cream van with 'Mr Whippy' advertised.

My colleague and I visited the above site at 3pm on 19th March 2013 following receipt of a complaint with regards to the location of an ice cream vehicle that parks outside the above school to sell ice cream. On arrival at the above site my colleague and I observed an ice cream vehicle parked in a dangerous position on the corner of Siemens Close and Bawtry Road. My colleague and I spoke to the occupants of the vehicle who confirmed that they were trading on your behalf as you were on holiday and that your vehicle is always parked in that position due to the congestion on Siemens Close. I must bring to your attention the following standard conditions;

- 1. The consent holder shall not obstruct the highway / footpath in which the site is situated or cause danger to persons using the highway / footpath.
- 2. The consent holder shall not cause nuisance or annoyance whether to persons using the street or otherwise.
- 3. The consent holder shall at all times obey all road traffic regulations in force in the consent area.

I would be grateful if you could consider the above and find a more suitable and safer location on Siemens Close to park your vehicle whilst trading to ensure that the location of your vehicle is not a cause of danger to members of the public and fellow road users.

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STREET TRADING CONSENT APPLICATION

SUB-COMMITTEE HEARING PROCEDURE

This procedure has been drawn up to assist those parties attending Street Trading Consent Committee hearings.

1. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.

2. The Chair will ask the applicants and interested parties to formally introduce themselves.

3. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.

- 4. Hearing Procedure:-
 - (a) The Licensing Officer will introduce the report.
 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
 - (c) The applicant/consent holder (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (d) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the applicant and/or his/her representative.
 - (e) Consultees / interested parties will be invited to present their representations or elect a spokesperson (which may be a Councillor) to speak on their behalf. New representations must not be raised.
 - (f) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the consultees / interested parties.
 - (g) The consultees / interested parties will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (h) The applicant will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for Members to take legal advice and consider the application.
 - (k) Once a decision has been reached, all parties will be invited to return. The Sub-Committee's decision and reasons will be announced by the Chair.
 - (I) The Sub-Committee's decision will be confirmed in writing to the applicant and those parties who made representations.
- NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
 - 2) The Committee Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.

There is no right of appeal against the Council's decision to refuse to grant or revoke a Street Trading Consent.

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
