ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

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1. WELCOME AND HOUSEKEEPING ARRANGEMENTS

1.1 The Chair welcomed attendees to the Community Assembly meeting, and outlined basic housekeeping arrangements.

2. EXCLUSION OF PRESS AND PUBLIC

2.1 No items were identified where resolutions may be moved to exclude the public and press.

3. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE FROM MEMBERS OF THE ASSEMBLY

3.1 Apologies for absence were submitted from Councillors Isobel Bowler and Helen Mirfin-Boukouris.

4. **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

4.1 There were no declarations of interest from Members of the Assembly on items of business to be considered at the meeting.

5. MINUTES OF LAST MEETING

5.1 The minutes of the meeting of the South East Community Assembly held on 15th December 2011 were approved as a correct record, and there were no matters arising.

6. PUBLIC QUESTIONS AND PETITIONS

- 6.1 **Petitions**
- 6.2 No petitions were submitted to the Assembly.
- 6.3 **Public Questions**
- 6.4 1) Thorpe Green Play Area
- 6.5 A number of residents of Thorpe Drive raised concerns over the potential construction of a children's play area on Thorpe Green, Waterthorpe. Concerns

highlighted were that the play area would cause anti-social behaviour (ASB) and disturb nearby residents. The residents of Thorpe Drive, where Thorpe Green was situated, stated that their views should be considered as a priority, as they would be living directly adjacent to the play area and would be the most affected. They cited the example of the John Hibbard play area at Woodhouse which was a 'no-go area' after 2100 hours, and did not wish for the same to happen at Thorpe Green.

- 6.6 The Chair replied that there would be extensive consultation with all local residents before any decisions were made, and it was also clarified that the money available for the construction of the play area had to be spent on playgrounds or parks development due to the nature of the funding. The Assembly Manager added that there was a lack of facilities for young people in the area currently, but that all views would be considered before any final decisions were made.
- Residents reported that there was extensive ASB on Thorpe Green already, although the Assembly Manager stated that Police records did not reflect this, and he encouraged residents to report any concerns they had over ASB in the area to the 101 non-emergency number. The Assembly Manager added that there was a Police drop-in surgery held every first Wednesday of the month at 1100 hours at Crystal Peaks shopping centre if residents wished to report anything or discuss concerns.
- 6.8 It was clarified that the closing date for consultation was 20th April 2012.

6.9 **2) Green Waste Bins**

- Concerns were raised over a letter sent out by waste management company Veolia stating that residents would have to pay a fixed sum of £57 at very short notice if they wished to retain their green waste bins. The Chair clarified that it was extremely unfortunate that a letter of this nature had been sent out, and he acknowledged that the information contained within it had been distressing. He confirmed that the City Council was tied into a 25 year contract with Veolia and added that the Council had little control over the materials and information Veolia issued to customers, and that the working relationship with Veolia had been very problematic at times.
- 6.11 It was confirmed that the green waste bins had been a trial for the south east of the City, and that, if residents did not wish to continue with the bin, they could purchase green waste sacks, which could be paid for and collected upon request, which is what the rest of the City did presently.
- 6.12 It was clarified that any green waste could be put in black bins, but that soil and building materials should not be placed in black bins due to the weight. Councillors encouraged members of the public to recycle and compost where possible, as, at the current rate, the City's landfill site would be full in 15 years, and then rubbish would have to be transported out of the City at a great expense.

6.13 3) Shire Brook Conservation Group

- A written question was submitted from the Shire Brook Conservation Group to ask whether the land between Woodhouse and Beighton, which was the subject of an ongoing large scale community based environmental programme, had had removed the protection it was awarded in the adopted Sheffield Development Framework (SDF) core strategy (Policy CS72) because developers found it more convenient to use Greenfield sites rather than Brownfield ones.
- 6.15 The Assembly Manager responded that the Shirebrook Conservation Group had already raised a number of points as part of their representations on the recent SDF Additional Sites, objecting to the allocation of land at Woodhouse East in particular but also to the scale of the allocation at Junction Road. All Additional Site representations were currently being examined and responses were being drafted which were scheduled to be reported to Cabinet in July 2012.

7. SOUTH EAST COMMUNITY ASSEMBLY DISCRETIONARY BUDGET REPORT 2012/13

7.1 The Assembly received a report of the Community Assembly Manager which set out recommendations for the allocation of the South East Community Assembly Discretionary Budget for 2012/13. It was noted that all recommendations were being made subject to final confirmation of funds being available. It was further noted that the South East Community Assembly was likely to have a Discretionary Budget of £204,334 for 2012/13.

7.2 **Decision Taken**

- (b) allocates the following sums from the 2012/13 South East Community Assembly Discretionary Budget, subject to final confirmation of the budget:

 - Youth Choose £10,000

- Health Champions £11,000
- Older people's worker £18,000
- Environmental Improvements £15,000

- Clean up work maximum of £25,000
- Emerging issues fund £41,000;
- (c) delegates authority to the South East Community Assembly Manager, in consultation with the Chair, to work up and agree the details of the proposed allocations and projects set out in the report now submitted, and
- (d) authorises the Director of Community Services, in consultation with the Director of Legal Services, to agree the terms on which all funding referred to in the report now submitted is made available and to enter into such funding agreements with recipients of the funding and any other related agreements or arrangements, and on such terms, that s/he considers appropriate.

7.3 Reasons for the Decision

7.4 The purpose of the Discretionary Budget is to help fulfil the priorities of the South East Assembly Community Plan, which have been identified through consultation with local residents, groups and partners.

The South East Assembly Community Plan priorities are:

- Improving the environment
- Better community facilities
- More things for young people to do
- Reducing anti-social behaviour

All the projects proposed for funding contribute to one or more of these priorities.

Members have to decide which projects will provide maximum impact and best value for money, in a context of reduced funds being available.

1. Summary

Each Assembly has been allocated £40,000 for Highways schemes in 2012/13. This report sets out ideas for spending this sum and any underspend carried forward from the 2011/12 budget; specifically

- £13,000 for the maintenance of Speed Indication Devices and installation of new sites in Woodhouse ward
- £5000 per ward for small schemes

2. What does this mean for people within the South East Community Assembly Area?

The allocation of £40,000 for small Highways works via the Community Assembly allows some of the issues and priorities of local people to be addressed. If agreed, the proposed Highways spend set out in this report will support the operation of Speed Indicator Devices across three of the four wards in the Assembly area and the installation of a number of small schemes to benefit people in each of the four wards.

3. Outcomes and Sustainability

The funding identified in this report will contribute to the delivery of one of the priorities in the South East Community Assembly Plan – Safer roads and pavements - thus benefiting residents in the South East Assembly Area.

The funding also supports the City Council's priorities, values and outcomes as set out in the Corporate Plan 'Standing Up For Sheffield'. In particular:

4. Full Proposal

4.1 In previous financial years, the Assembly has had a large devolved budget for highway schemes (£275,000 in 2009/10 and 2010/11, reduced to £75,000 in 2011/12). This had allowed a number of large schemes (over £10,000) to be progressed, together with a minor works budget for small

works (over the last two years £40,000 has been allocated each year for minor works).

- 4.2 In the current financial year 2012/13, the Highways Budget allocation to each Assembly has been reduced to £40,000. In addition approximately £50,000 is available as an underspend from previous allocations making a potential total of £90,000.
- 4.3 The level of funding means the South East can only guarantee to fund small scale measures but may have scope to fund one or two larger scale schemes if the underspend is confirmed
- 4.4 It is proposed with the £40,000 of confirmed funding to support the following allocations
 - a) Speed Indication Device maintenance/ installation of equipment for new sites £13,000. This will support the ongoing operation of Speed Indicator Devices in Beighton and Mosborough wards and the operation of two new Speed Indicator Devices in Woodhouse ward
 - b) £5000 per ward for small schemes making a total of £20,000. These schemes will be agreed following consultation with Ward Members and will allow a variety of small measures such as dropped kerbs and handrails.
- 4.5 If agreed these measures would leave £7000 of the £40,000 budget from 2012/13 plus additional underspend from 2011/ 12 to be agreed at a later meeting

5. Financial Implications

The South East Assembly, in line with all 7 Community Assemblies, has a £40,000 Highways Budget to allocate in 2012/13, to help fulfil the priorities identified in the South East Assembly Plan. The spending proposals set out in this report do not exceed this £40,000 allocation.

6. Legal Implications

The Council, as the Highways Authority for Sheffield, has the powers under Part V of the Highways Act 1980 to implement the improvements requested in this report.

This funding is allocated from the Local Transport Plan budget and as such all projects using this funding will need to comply with the aims and objectives of the Local Transport Plan.

7. Equality of Opportunity Implications

The South East Community Highways budget is being applied across the Assembly area, with measures which will benefit all parts of the community, including pedestrians, public transport users, car users and those with limited mobility.

8. Human Resource Implications

There are no specific human resource implications for the Council as a result of the allocation of this funding.

9. Environmental and Sustainability Implications

The proposals in this report promote responsible driving and pedestrian safety.

10. Mitigation of Risk

The risks relating to this proposal have been considered by the South East Community Assembly Team and Highways Officers. These risks will be regularly reviewed and monitored.

11. Alternative Options

- a) No ward budgets this would involve Members considering all requests and would be unworkable
- b) Divide the whole budget into ward allocations this would not take into account variations in needs across the area and previous investment

Part of the governance structure of Sheffield Homes includes Area Boards, the purpose of which is to:

"provide a focus on services and customers in a local area, to ensure that Sheffield Homes services are responsive to the varying needs of different communities in Sheffield".

This proposal fits in with the values and outcomes of the Corporate Plan 2011-14 'Standing up for Sheffield'.

4. Full Proposal

The Leader's scheme of delegation for the discharging executive functions authorises Community Assemblies to "nominate Council representation for the appropriate Sheffield Homes Area Board in consultation with the appropriate Cabinet member". The appropriate Cabinet member is currently the holder of the Homes and Neighbourhoods portfolio.

Sheffield Homes are a key partner in each of the Assembly Areas. They have named senior officer representation on each of the Partner Panels and have worked closely with the Assembly Teams on a number of projects and initiatives.

The Area Boards meet on a bi-monthly basis and the agendas focus on service delivery by the Company at an area level. They provide a key link in the Company's governance structure between the Board of Directors,

Tenants' and Residents' Associations (TARAs), Local Housing Partnership groups and tenants.

The composition of Area Boards is as follows: -

- 5 tenants.
- 4 independents.
- 2 Sheffield City Council appointees.
- A maximum of one leaseholder may take one of the tenant places on each Area Board.

The expectation is that the Assembly's nominees would provide the formal link between the work of the Assembly and Sheffield Homes, further strengthening the partnership relationships and reassuring tenants and residents that there is an additional opportunity for influencing the work priorities of the Assembly and also ensuring that opportunities for joint work are not missed.

The practice of Assemblies making nominations to the Sheffield Homes Area Boards, promotes closer working relationships between tenants and the members of the Assembly. This increases the influence of and helps to inform the decision making of the Assemblies.

Two representatives are requested from the South East Community Assembly for the South East Area Board.

Members of the South East Community Assembly have been consulted and have provisionally proposed Cllr Chris Rosling-Josephs and Cllr Denise Fox to fill these roles. The Cabinet Member for Homes and Neighbourhoods is content with these nominations.

Although the function of nominating Council representatives to the Area Boards has been allocated to the Community Assemblies, under the Council's arrangements for discharging 'local choice functions', the actual appointment of the nominees is a non-executive function reserved to Full Council. The Assembly's nominations will therefore need to be referred to Council for endorsement.

5. Financial Implications

There are no specific financial implications arising from this proposal.

6. Legal Implications

There are no specific legal implications arising from this proposal, other than that the appointees will need to be mindful of their legal role and responsibilities when serving on the local Board.

7. Equality of Opportunity Implications

There are no specific equality of opportunity implications arising from this proposal

8. Human Resource Implications

If a nominee is no longer able to fulfil this role (temporarily or permanently) then the Assembly will have to provide a substitute as and when that situation arises.

11. Alternative Options

The South East Community Assembly could consider alternative nominees to the Councillors proposed.

12. Reasons for Recommendations

The South East Community Assembly has been requested to nominate two Sheffield City Council appointees to the South East Area Board.

13. Recommendations

The South East Community Assembly is recommended to:-

- (1) have regard to the positive views expressed by the Cabinet Member for Homes and Neighbourhoods about the proposal to nominate Cllr Chris Rosling-Josephs and Cllr Denise Fox to the Sheffield Homes South East Area Board, and having regard to these views to nominate two members of the Assembly to these positions;
- (2) request the Director of Modern Governance to refer these nominations to full Council for approval at the earliest approval; and
- (3) subject to Council approval, request the Assembly Manager to complete the necessary paperwork to effect these appointments, in consultation with the Director of Legal Services.
