concern in that six month period, the licence be referred back to the Sub-Committee.

Application for a first Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Driver's Licence

(a) Grant a licence for the shorter term of 12 months, in the light of the offences and convictions now reported and, on renewal, authority be given to grant the applicant a licence for the maximum term of 36 months, subject to (i) there being no further cause for concern and (ii) the applicant successfully passing all tests normally required of a new applicant and (b) if there is any cause for concern in that 12 month period, the licence be referred back to the Sub-Committee.
