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ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

If you are present at a meeting of the Council, of its executive or any committee of the executive, or of any committee, sub-committee, joint committee, or joint sub-committee of the authority, and you have a **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest** (DPI) relating to any business that will be considered at the meeting, you must <u>not</u>:

- participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your Disclosable Pecuniary Interest during the meeting, participate further in any discussion of the business, or
- participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

These prohibitions apply to any form of participation, including speaking as a member of the public.

You must:

- leave the room (in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct)
- make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of any DPI at any meeting at which you are present at which an item of business which affects or relates to the subject matter of that interest is under consideration, at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent.
- declare it to the meeting and notify the Council's Monitoring Officer within 28 days, if the DPI is not already registered.

If you have any of the following pecuniary interests, they are your **disclosable pecuniary interests** under the new national rules. You have a pecuniary interest if you, or your spouse or civil partner, have a pecuniary interest.

- Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain, which you, or your spouse or civil partner undertakes.
- Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from your council or authority) made or provided within the relevant period* in respect of any expenses incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

*The relevant period is the 12 months ending on the day when you tell the Monitoring Officer about your disclosable pecuniary interests.

- Any contract which is made between you, or your spouse or your civil partner (or a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest) and your council or authority –
 - under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and
 - which has not been fully discharged.

- Any beneficial interest in land which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, have and which is within the area of your council or authority.
- Any licence (alone or jointly with others) which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, holds to occupy land in the area of your council or authority for a month or longer.
- Any tenancy where (to your knowledge)
 - the landlord is your council or authority; and
 - the tenant is a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest.
- Any beneficial interest which you, or your spouse or your civil partner has in securities of a body where -
 - (a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of your council or authority; and
 - (b) either -
 - the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or
 - if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

If you attend a meeting at which any item of business is to be considered and you are aware that you have a **personal interest** in the matter which does not amount to a DPI, you must make verbal declaration of the existence and nature of that interest at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent. You should leave the room if your continued presence is incompatible with the 7 Principles of Public Life (selflessness; integrity; objectivity; accountability; openness; honesty; and leadership).

You have a personal interest where -

- a decision in relation to that business might reasonably be regarded as affecting the well-being or financial standing (including interests in land and easements over land) of you or a member of your family or a person or an organisation with whom you have a close association to a greater extent than it would affect the majority of the Council Tax payers, ratepayers or inhabitants of the ward or electoral area for which you have been elected or otherwise of the Authority's administrative area, or
- it relates to or is likely to affect any of the interests that are defined as DPIs but are in respect of a member of your family (other than a partner) or a person with whom you have a close association.

Guidance on declarations of interest, incorporating regulations published by the Government in relation to Disclosable Pecuniary Interests, has been circulated to you previously.

You should identify any potential interest you may have relating to business to be considered at the meeting. This will help you and anyone that you ask for advice to fully consider all the circumstances before deciding what action you should take.

In certain circumstances the Council may grant a **dispensation** to permit a Member to take part in the business of the Authority even if the member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest relating to that business.

To obtain a dispensation, you must write to the Monitoring Officer at least 48 hours before the meeting in question, explaining why a dispensation is sought and desirable, and specifying the period of time for which it is sought. The Monitoring Officer may consult with the Independent Person or the Council's Standards Committee in relation to a request for dispensation.



1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a premises licence made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

2.0 THE APPLICATION

- 2.1 The applicant is Wadsley House Social Club Ltd.
- 2.2 The application, which was received on 1st March 2016, is attached to this report labelled Appendix 'A'. Any blank pages have been omitted to save paper, but the original application will be available at the hearing.
- 2.3 Amendments have been made to the application with regards to the operating hours and the removal of regulated entertainment to be indoors only. Conditions have also been agreed with South Yorkshire Police Licensing, Safeguarding Children's Board and Health Protection Service. A copy of the correspondence is attached at Appendix 'B'

3.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 3.1 Representations and comments concerning the application have been received from the following and are attached at Appendix 'C':-
 - 2 local residents to support the application 21 Public Objections
 - 1 Petition listing 162 objectors lead spokesperson, Mr Alan Antcliff
- 3.2 Representations were made by the Environmental Protection Service. Conditions have been agreed and as such the representations were withdrawn. A copy of the correspondence is attached at Appendix 'D'
- 3.4 There are no outstanding representations from any Responsible Authority.
- 3.5 The applicant, objectors and petition leader have been invited to attend the hearing. Copies of the front page of the notices are attached to this report labelled Appendix 'E'

4.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 There are no specific financial implications arising from this application. However, additional costs may be incurred should the matter go to appeal. In such an eventuality it may not be possible to recover all these costs. The impact of these additional costs (if any) will be kept under review and may be subject of a further report during the year.

5.0 THE LEGAL POSITION

- 5.1 The Licensing Act 2003 at section 4 (1) requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives which section 4(2) sets out as:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder,
 - b) public safety,
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance,
 - d) the protection of children from harm.
- 5.2 Section 4(3) of the Licensing Act also requires the Licensing Authority to have regard to the published statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182.

6.0 HEARINGS REGULATIONS

- 6.1 Regulations governing hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 have been made by the Secretary of State.
- 6.2 The Licensing Authority has provided all parties with the information required in the Regulations to the 2003 Act as set out at Appendix 'F'.
- 6.3 Attached at Appendix 'F' is the following:
 - a) a copy of the Notice of Hearing;
 - b) the rights of a party provided in Regulations 15 and 16;
 - c) the consequences if a party does not attend or is not represented at the hearing
 - d) the procedure to be followed at the hearing.

7.0 APPEALS

7.1 The Licensing Act 2003 section 181 and Schedule 5 makes provision for appeals to be made by the applicant and those making representations against decisions of the Licensing Authority to the Magistrates' Court.

8.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

8.1 That Members carefully consider the representations made and take such steps as the Sub Committee consider appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

9.0 OPTIONS OPEN TO THE COMMITTEE

- 9.1 To grant the premises licence in the terms requested.
- 9.2 To grant the premises licence with conditions.
- 9.3 To reject the whole or part of the application.



- The Drive is a cul-de-sac with houses and cars to each side, movement of traffic is already extremely restricted and any increase will cause a major hazard to residents and vastly increase the level of pollution from vehicles. This is also the case for Marlcliffe Road which serves the T junction of The Drive, vehicles regularly queue here to allow access for oncoming vehicles from the single car access towards Marlcliffe School.

I am writing to object the application for the above premises to have a full licence, and extended opening hours.

We moved to the area due to the fact there were no pubs on, or near the street, and we planned to have children in this leafy suburb. Since moving here in October 2009, we have had a small number of trespassers on our property, which backs onto the club grounds. I did, on one occasion call the police on 101, which I am sure will be logged for your reference. Granting further permissions would be likely to increase the frequency of anti social trespassing.

During the football season, the street more often than not avoids antisocial incidents, but granting non members permission to use the facility would more than likely lead to further, significant issues. Having a membership ensures that stakeholders are responsible for their actions.

During the summer months, the noise from the club grounds is noticeable, particularly since the imposition of the smoking ban. Currently the noise is limited to occasional Friday and Saturday nights, which we feel is tolerable. If the club had further permissions to open for longer to a broader range of people, this is likely to cause more anti social side effects, especially as our children are in bed by 7pm.

I appreciate the club is attempting to increase its revenue streams in what are difficult trading circumstances, yet I feel it hasn't attempted to do this in other ways. For example, we have lived here for over 6 years, yet have never been offered membership via fliers, letters or any other means. Perhaps by increasing membership numbers or fees, or perhaps consider investing in a broader culinary offering it could increase its revenue without compromising the relationship it has with the local area.



Dear Sir/Madam,

We are writing to express our strong objection to the application for full premises licence and extended opening hours for Wadsley House Social Club, The Drive, Wadsley, S6 4AL.

We are objecting on the grounds that there will be a possible increased risk of antisocial behaviour and crime, public nuisance and that there will be potential harm to local children.

Wadsley House Social Club is situated in a residential area and as a result is close to a number of private houses (some less than 40 m away). It is also on a narrow cul de sac and is close to both The Corner House Nursery and Marcliffe Primary School. The club has been a private members club for many years and even with its more limited licence we have witnessed and experienced a number of incidents of anti-social behaviour and public nuisance. We are worried that any extension to the licence will see these incidents increase.

The main entrance to the club is only a short distance from houses. During functions it is often repeatedly opened and closed or even wedged open as people come outside to stand on the car park drinking and smoking. When people wedge the door open the sign asking for customers to be considerate to local residents cannot be seen because it is on the back of the door. As well as this in the summer months windows are often opened and the fire exit doors wedged open with chairs. This means that the sound of the disco can often be heard over the sound of our television. Even when the doors and windows are closed the music can often be heard over half way down the street. Efforts to ask for the music to be turned down have sometimes been ignored as no one at the club appears to want to take any responsibility for supervising what is going on during a social event. Even when music has been turned down it always returns to the same high volume at the next function. It can be very intimidating to have to ask people at the party itself to close doors and windows.

People from the social events are often seen walking down the road carrying glasses and bottles. There does not appear to be any supervision of this by the club. The following morning we often find broken glass, empty bottles and glasses on the walls and in the road. At the end of the evening there is often a stream of taxis and there can often be a lot of shouting and swearing as people leave the premises. This woke us up on a regular basis when we first moved in. As a result of this we have moved our bedroom from the front to the back of the house.

Other party goers congregate outside the door facing the bowling green in groups of 20 or more. They hold loud conversations, wedge open the doors so that music can be heard and will usually stay outside until the end of the evening. This often prevents us from sleeping or wakes us up and means that we cannot have a window open in our bedroom.

At the moment there are only a limited number of these social events but we fear that they and the associated nuisance will become more frequent should the new licence be approved. There was a serious incident last year with a group of people fighting in the street. Fortunately for us we were away on holiday but our neighbours were very frightened by what took place. We have a number of children living on The Drive aged from babies up to teenagers. They should not be exposed to the bad language that is often heard and the unruly behaviour that sometimes takes place.

Measures taken by Wadsley House Club have done little to reassure local residents. The double glazing has little effect when windows are opened and doors wedged. We were told that the music was supposed to be cut off if the fire doors were opened but this is clearly not the case. The Club say they have CCTV but this has not prevented groups gathering on the carpark to drink, smoke and hold loud conversations that can be heard inside people's homes. The management of the club take little interest in what actually goes on when the room is hired for a social event. If the room is hired out more often there is little reason to expect that they will take appropriate measures to prevent noise and anti-social behaviour. There never appears to be any sort of supervision only the bar staff who are obviously busy serving drinks. Our neighbours were even told by a club official that once people are out of the gate it is not their problem.

A further concern is the increase in traffic on a narrow cul de sac. It can be difficult to see when exiting onto Marlcliffe Road and this is a concern if there is to be all day opening. Children and parents use Marlcliffe Road to get to the nursery and the primary school. More traffic and more cars parked will only increase the risk of an accident.

As far as all day drinking is concerned there are currently six local pubs (The Park; The Castle; The Horse and Jockey; The Wadsley Jack; The Rose and Crown and The Sportsman) within a 15 minute walk. There are also four Off Licences within the same radius. (Asda; Granvilles; Tesco and Wadsley Post Office). My partner has already had one frightening experience when a drunk came out of the club and accosted her as she was cleaning the car in the middle of the afternoon, offering her money to drive him home. She politely refused but he pressed her and would not let her pass until two of his friends came down from the club and led him away. Only then could she get back into the house. When I came home later she was still visibly upset. We are concerned that this sort of incident may happen more frequently when the Club is open all day on a more regular basis.

Throughout this process the management of the club have acted in a very arrogant manner. The licensing application was not dated as it should have been and while they do not have to discuss their plans with local residents their attitude has been that whatever happens we will just have to put up with it. In light of what has happened previously we are very concerned about the potential for more crime, disorder and public nuisance. We do not object to people enjoying a drink and having a good time but we believe that the current licence is more than adequate for a club situated in a quiet residential area.

I write with reference to the above mentioned social club's application for a full premises license and extended opening hours.

We live at
Marlcliffe Road in Wadsley and our property directly adjoins the land belonging to the social club.

We already experience low levels of disturbance from functions under the current licensing arrangements at the social club, from function attendees particularly in the summer months when functions tend to spill out into the gardens. This can be quite disturbing on a summer night, and prevents us and our children from getting to sleep. Whilst this is currently thankfully infrequent, I would fear that any extension to the licensing arrangements would lead to much more frequent such disturbances for our household and that of all of our near neighbours.

In addition, if the extended licensing arrangements are granted the social club may attract drinkers on match days, thus increasing traffic and foot flow in the area in an already busy time for the local area. This may also lead to antisocial behaviour from football fans drinking in the club before and after the match. We are also fear that the club may attract away fans in before the match, as we know that away fans park on our street and the surrounding area. This may cause a tension point to arise in the area and encourage aggressive behaviour between fans from both sides.

Furthermore, a full license may lead to the club attracting more people, which may worsen the already difficult parking situation in the local area, and lead to further antisocial behaviour. We already experience some damage to cars and small thefts on our street and surrounding areas from people returning from the pubs in Hillsborough on a Friday and Saturday night, and another pub in the area will surely not make that situation any better.

In our opinion there is no need for another pub in the local area with several being within walking distance already.

We note that the plans for the license also include a proposed opening time of 10am on weekdays, this seems totally inappropriate when there is a Primary School on Marlcliffe Road, so there could be instances of drinkers coming out of the club at school pick up time.

I am writing to raise my objection to the application for a full premises licence and extended opening hours for Wadsley House Social Club, The Drive, Wadsley S6 4AL

I am objecting on the grounds that there will potentially be an increased risk of antisocial behaviour and crime, public nuisance and that there will be potential harm to children.

Wadsley House Social Club is situated at the top of The Drive in a cul de sac off Marlcliffe Road. There is only one short road that leads to and from the club (The Drive) It was formerly an old house, is in a residential area and is consequently closely situated to 17 houses (of which some have been converted in to flats). Other houses surround the grounds of the property on all sides. It is situated near Marlcliffe Primary school and The Corner House private nursery. Wadsley House Social Club has been a members only social club for many years, however, we are very concerned about the proposed extension to licensing and the impact this will have. This is based on the current incidents of antisocial behaviour.

There are already several incidents of public disorder and crime that have occurred locally when events have been held there. The club entrance is at the front of the property which is only a short distance from houses on The Drive. Consequently the noise levels are often high: the front door is often left open and opened frequently when people come outside to smoke, drink, talk, shout or wait for taxis when events are held during the evening, often carrying on with very loud and sometimes inappropriate conversations from inside the club. The music can be heard from the club and each time the door opens the noise levels increase. There is generally a stream of taxis that will come to collect people and people shouting to each other as they leave in their cars. As there is only one road to and from the club this generates high levels of noise late at night. The car park is small and so visitors to the club during the day and at night often park outside residents houses. Noise levels can be high when people are getting into their cars.

We often have whole and broken glasses left outside our house; people are often sitting on our wall after an event. I understand that there has been damage to cars on The Drive after an event.

At the moment there are only a few functions that take place at the weekends. Based on the antisocial incidents that have occurred so far, I believe that a proposal to extend the licensing would only increase these and potentially add to other incidents during the day.

In the spirit of being a good neighbour, we had not complained about the noise and anti-social incidents that occur during and after events until last year. We have expected to have a certain level of disruption by the very nature of choosing to live near here. However, last year, in October 2015 ! made a formal complaint to licensing about an incident which occurred during the day at a weekend that I considered to be antisocial and harmful to my children. I understand that other neighbours have complained to Wadsley House Club and to the Licensing department about previous incidents of anti-social behaviour.

We have had to move one of our children in the past when he has been woken by noise. We are frequently woken by the noise and I understand that our neighbours are too. I understand that in the past there was an argument and fight on The Drive that involved several adults, after an event at Wadsley House. We were fortunately away when this happened but this is a big concern for me. I

don't want my children to feel scared or frightened in their home. I don't want to feel intimidated in my home. There are a number of children that live on The Drive, including ours and neighbours who have grandchildren to stay and a proposal to increase opening hours is a genuine concern for me. An increase in licensing would mean that events could be held until midnight in the week and on Sundays which are all nights before local children go to school. I understand that Wadsley House could be open for occasions where non-standard timings would apply. Cars and people could be travelling past our houses late in to the night after drinking at the Social Club. Wadsley House have stated that the grounds and access to the grounds are currently covered by CCTV. However this has not so far prevented incidents of antisocial behaviour. There are signs inside the club that ask people to be respectful of neighbours but as there are often incidents of anti-social behaviour these are clearly not adhered to or monitored by Wadsley House staff. The likelihood is that there will be more disruption outside of the club grounds. We were told by a staff member a few months ago that once guests are outside the gate they are not the club's problem. Even if this is the extent of their responsibility in terms of the law it is not a principle that inspires confidence in their ability to manage their guests. If people left my house shouting and swearing late into the night I wouldn't say to my neighbours the following day that they are not my problem once they go past the gatepost.


As well as being close to a school and nursery, many local children also walk to and from Forge Valley Secondary School. The impact of increasing licensing hours during the day could impact on the children here as there is potential for crime and disorder and nuisance when children are leaving school. The increased number of cars that could be visiting Wadsley House Club during the day is a concern. Visibility at the bottom of The Drive (for the turn onto Maricliffe Road) is often reduced. Cars have been observed to drive quickly down The Drive from Wadsley House and there is potential for harm to pedestrians particularly with the high number of children and parents who cross the road during the day. There are no local crossings for children to cross the road safely and the school has no crossing patrol. We are concerned that Wadsley House are not proposing measures to ensure the safety of children in the local community.

There are already several public houses (The Park, The Horse and Jockey, The Sportsman) and a number of local shops (a corner shop, Tesco Express and an Asda) that sell alcohol during the day and into the evening. Increasing the opening hours and availability to sell alcohol during the day at Wadsley House Social Club does not seem in keeping with the reduction of crime, disorder and nuisance in the local community.

We feel that the current licence is adequate for a social club in a residential area. Thank you for your consideration of our objection for the reasons above. Wadsley House had not dated the licensing application that they originally displayed. I hope that our objection reaches you at an appropriate time.

WADSLEY HOUSE SOCIAL CLUB

We are **Warand We of** Vainor Road Wadsley and we would like to comment on the application by WHSC to move to a full premises licence.

We have co-existed peacefully with WHSC for 29 years. Our garden backs onto the bowling green side of the WHSC. In this time, we have only had occasional noise or nuisance from larger events such as weddings and private parties. No previous objection or complaint has been made.

The scale of what has been proposed in this application is out of proportion and satisfies no apparent public or community need. We understand that we are allowed to object on the following grounds:-

1. Prevention of crime and disorder

Periodically, there is a spate of burglaries and raids on garden equipment/sheds etc. and the Police give warnings. Most neighbours have alarms and security lights, especially over the back gardens e.g. at no.s 7 and 11 Vainor Road. It is easy to access the club grounds to and from our back gardens. I have watched from my bedroom window as youths strolled down our garden from the club grounds as the Police helicopter hovered. More hours open, more events, more familiarity with such easy access concerns us.

Football fan websites tell us where we can have a drink before a game, possibly with good food and parking. Many responsible fans Ragee46 efer to plan ahead! Only good Private

security could maintain order so close to the Hillsborough ground. Derby games frequently see Police presence at all local pubs and clubs. Many social clubs offer temporary memberships for a nominal fee to boost trade. Would this be in the new business plan?

Fans can already go to The Park Hotel, The Wadsley Jack, The Rose and Crown, The Sportsman and The Horse and Jockey.

2. Public Safety

The Drive already has increased traffic due to members cars and delivery vans and lorries to Wadsley house. Turning space is limited in the grounds at busy times so three point turns and reversing manoeuvres will increase with an almost tripling of opening hours. Egress to Marlcliffe Road by vehicles can be difficult as the roads are parked up on both sides especially at weekends, SWFC matchdays and when parents are deliverying children to Corner House Nursery and Marlcliffe School. Marlcliffe Road has limited available parking due to the terraced houses having no offroad parking. Football parking has been a thorny local issue for many years.

Currently, prematch drinkers tend to walk down Wadsley Lane. Large gatherings of football supporters on The Drive and Marlcliffe Road could resemble some scenes by the Park Hotel with Police horses, Police vans and private security personnel.

At the moment, WHSC traffic does not tend to overlap Nursery, Primary School or rush hour times but the newly proposed hours will hit all of them.

Marlcliffe road does not have a pedestrian crossing at any point and the junction with Wadsley Lane is already difficult for pedestrians and drivers on Matchdays.

Vainor Road is always affected when parking is at saturation point on Marlcliffe road.

3. Prevention of public nuisance.

Wadsley is a long established residential area and for the houses which surround WHSC the bowling green, gardens, mature trees and wildlife are part of which makes the locality so distinct. Some bowling matches become a little audible but not for long. Some DJ s go for volume over taste but generally we and our neighbours adopt a live and let live approach to summer weddings etc. Any increase, however will strongly impinge on residents ability to enjoy their gardens, leave windows open or have children in the garden when language turns blue.

This application would increase opening hours from 35 hours to 96.5 hours! Plans for more live music, sporting events, weddings and parties will impact directly on the immediate housing surrounding on all four boundaries. This is not the city centre!

Monday to Friday is normally quiet apart from some bowling events. We can enjoy the peacefulness. The new hours give little respite from 10.00 am till midnight or 1.00 am.

There is a complete mix of residents within earshot from active pensioners (ouselves), young families, professionals, elderly living alone and people working from a home office. We have invested in our homes and gardens to enjoy them, not to scurry indoors as the disco starts up. Parents and children need their sleep. Outdoor live or recorded music is totally inappropriate past 7.00 p.m. let alone 1.00 a.m.

A major concern is the play area developed in recent years between the bowling green and the stone wall which backs on to Vainor Road gardens. There is a consistent tendency for children to play there without adequate supervision. The wall is often climbed by curious children or in search of a lost ball. We smile pleasantly and throw the ball back. If there was a plan by the club to target the family market, especially at the weekends, then there would be potential for increased noise and trespass. The fact is that many parents are forty metres away closer to the event.

4. Protection of children from harm.

The sporting membership is not sufficiently large even on bowling match days to involve many younger family members in attendance. Longer opening hours will, however, allow for more family events possibly coinciding with bowling, snooker, private parties and public bar access. More children floating around a large building and extensive grounds makes safeguarding problematic.

The current low incidence of children scaling garden walls has meant little evidence of property owners placing obstructions or sharp objects on wall tops. Hopefully our neighbours would never be driven to such potentially harmful and illegal measures. The wall is fine as it is but one could understand some residents raising the height or screening in some ugly way. This would detract from the pleasant semi woodland outlook on both sides.

Children are naturally curious and loud. Any increase in play equipment, swings and football goals will be a further attraction away from the main function area. Parental supervision would have to be continuous.

Our four infant grandchildren are regular visitors and their swings are only yards from the boundary wall of the club. It is not appropriate for them to feel overlooked by large groups of strangers in what is normally a peaceful and safe area.

Summary

All in all, we like having a traditional local social club as a neighbour albeit with some small inconveniences, but these proposals for such a change of hours and usage fill us with alarm.

I have the following concerns re the above application

1 Substantially increased noise from building and gardens

My garden backs onto the grounds of the Social Club. Whenever the windows are open on a warm day or evening the noise from the building can be heard in my garden and the rear rooms of my house. Any noise from the gardens is very loud. Up to now noise from open windows in the Club has mostly been the sound of chattering voices and mostly at weekends. If the Club is allowed to extend their hours of opening and any number of functions/entertainment is allowed up to 1am at weekends and midnight during the week, it will have an impact on the enjoyment of our gardens for myself and my neighbours.

To allow noise to 1 am is unacceptable especially if these functions/entertainments take place outside in the grounds. Any noise from the grounds can be heard not only in the houses on my side of Vainor Road (where it is very loud) but on the other side of Vainor Road as well, quite a distance from the Club. Up to now it has mostly been crown green bowling matches during the day which is quite acceptable and from a few people using the grounds.

As the Club is maintaining its member status (but membership will be open to anyone buying a day membership) it appears it will be allowed to sell alcohol cheaper than the local pubs. This will have a knock-on effect on their business but also increase the amount of people using the building and grounds of the Club, leading to increased noise.

The Club has a children's playground so it is obviously encouraging its customers to use the grounds not just people using the bowling green.

2 Invasion of mine and my neighbours gardens by children and young adults from the grounds of the Club

There has always been a problem with children and young adults climbing over the wall and coming into mine and my neighbours' gardens. In the past we have dealt with this problem as it happened with the individuals themselves and in the interest of being a good neighbour I have not complained to the Club. I have had damage to items in my garden by these invaders. Other neighbours have had far more damage than me. As the Club had a membership scheme this at least limited the amount of people with access to our gardens. If the Club is going to open to anyone (like a pub) then I forsee an increase in this problem for myself and my neighbours. It happens during the day and night and I have been sat in the garden and watched as people climbed over the wall and casually walked around my garden until they saw me.

My garden backs onto an area used by the gardeners at the Club as a compost area, it is the only one on Vainor Road that fully backs onto this area. If the full premised licence is granted I would like the Club to erect a fence with a lockable gate to cut this area backing onto my garden off from the grounds of the Club. This may go some way to stopping this problem of invasion into my garden. I am 70 years old and live alone. I do not want to have to deal with children and young adults sitting on the wall and peering into my garden or climbing over the wall and walking around my garden.

Over the years the gardeners at the Club have built up the land on their side of the wall and it is now only about 3 feet in height on their side. Very easy to gain access to my garden.

I am also very concerned that if a person is injured whilst messing about in my garden, who is liable? Probably me even if that person came into my garden uninvited.

3 Devaluation of my property

If this licence is granted and the extended opening hours allowed then our property will be devalued. Many people will not wish to buy a house next to a pub which has noisy entertainment till the early hours, together with the noise of people leaving with the attendant banging of doors and chatter. This happens now but as the Club is only open to members it is not so much of a nuisance to me although it must annoy people living on The Drive. All of this I will be able to hear from the rear bedrooms of my house. Sound carries in this area.

I do however believe that extending the hours of the sale of alcohol and allowing outdoor live music would be likely to increase the likelihood of noise pollution, of excessive alcohol consumption, anti-social and disruptive behaviour which would have a detrimental impact upon the lives of the local residents and potentially may also put them at risk of witnessing frightening or inappropriate behaviours.

I have lived at my property since 2010, in this time I have contacted the police on two occasions to report drunken and aggressive behaviours of patrons of the Wadsley House Social Club who have been fighting, hitting cars and throwing objects as they have left. I am very concerned that, if this application is granted, it would increase the likelihood of such incidents occurring, since it would be more likely that more alcohol would be consumed and dependant upon the live music being aired, there would also be concerns about the crowds attracted.

At this time, Wadsley House Social Club, with their bowls club, football match day openings, private functions and members coexist well with the local community in which, as a single mother of a small child I feel safe and secure. I feel if the application is granted, this would be at risk and therefore respectfully request that it be refused.



I am not exactly sure of current opening hours, maybe till 11pm weekdays, 12 midnight, weekends? The notice which has only come to our attention and has no deadline date is displayed at the gate entrance to the side.

The application indicates the following:

Provision of late night refreshments: mon, tues, wed, thurs, sunday; 23:00-24:00 and fri and sat 23:00-01.00

Sale by retail of alcohol : mon, tues, wed, thurs: 10am -18.30.p.m. and 19.00-24.00, fri 10am - 18.30 p.m. and 19.00-01.00. Sat. 10am - 18.30 p.m. and 19.00-01.00. Sunday 10am - 18.30.p.m. and 19.00-11.30.p.m.

Provision of regulated entertainment -films, indoor sporting, events, live music, recorded music, dance, anything of a similar description. - Mon, tues, wed, thurs, 19.00-24.00. Fri 19.00-01.00, Sat 10.30am - 18.30p.m. 19.00-01.00. Sunday 10.30am -18.30p.m. and 19.00-24.00.

I am emailing Licensing Service with my concerns, Tel. No. 01142734264 along with other residents of The Drive and we are getting together to discuss further plans, maybe get a petition etc. The four grounds I believe you can challenge this on are 1. The Prevention of Crime and Disorder 2. Public safety 3. The Prevention of Public Nuisance and 4. The Protection of Children from Harm.

I emailed Licensing last year with concerns following a really rowdy party in the early hours at a weekend, people shouting and swearing at each other very aggressively, not sure if they were fighting. There were also quite young children present who would have witnessed this. I had an incident a few years ago when a male who had been attending the club had an altercation with a female and decided to smash my drivers side window which I was alerted to after by a neighbour, fortunately he had gone and the club paid for the excess for the windscreen replacement and I did report it to the police etc.

On another occasion there was a mass brawl in the street, maybe 20-30 people fighting, police involved, cars being banged which was very frightening when it is literally outside your property. The parties were very aggressive, threatening and intimidating and they were intoxicated. The club should not really be in such close proximity to the road which is residential and leads straight up to the club, if you visit you will see.


There have been other incidents, these are not just isolated incidents and have been where there have been people shouting, arguing, swearing, singing and fighting, being very aggressive and intimidating in the early hours of the morning/ very late hours of the evening but you do not want to get involved for fear of reprisals and yet you get disturbed sleep as cannot wind down hours after they have left. These incidents cause you to be on edge and to be concerned for the personal safety of oneself, family, property and car etc. It causes anxiety and psychological harm. Some residents on the road have school age children, including myself, at least three households and one single parent has a 2-3 year old , one adult has mental health issues etc. There is the Corner House Nursery which is round the corner about 50 yards away .

There is noise coming from loud parties in the incidents mentioned and in general, from traffic to and from the club, taxis to and from the club, car doors banging, talking loudly as well as behaviour already mentioned. There was another occasion when I could hear a very aggressive and extremely drunk male outside our property being very verbally threatening and swearing to whom I do not know and he lingered for about half an hour and I was very concerned for our family's general safety and could not go to bed till he had moved on.

I am not a complaining type of person and have put up with incidents and for reasons stated. The club accept no liability for attenders once they have left. We are very concerned as residents and have no doubt these incidents will increase if this application is not rejected given later opening hours and alcohol consumption. I do work for Local Govt. 30 years this year and work in Rotherham Adult Social Care. I have also passed your email address to resident at the top house on the right, who is a retired teacher as she is available during the day and have asked her to email you as she is also helping co-ordinate a response. I am available evenings, not Thursdays and weekends sometimes but she might be available for a visit weekdays. There is a resident at No. 10 who is a board member and who has considerable involvement with the club.


We have been a neighbour of the club for many years and have been subject to loud music, disturbance and antisocial behaviour on quite a few occasions. At the present time the levels of these problems are acceptable but the granting of this licence will increase the risk of these problems occurring more often. The officials at the club seem to be unable to manage these problems and have no regards for the residents living on The Drive.



Thank you for the advice below. I am disappointed to receive this at the eleventh hour, and after I have closed my discussions with the applicant and withdrawn my earlier representations in relation to the prevention of public nuisance.

Complaints received by EPS about nuisance from these premises have typically centred on noise from customers departing. This current application has already sought to extend licensable activities by a couple of hours (beyond those on the Club Certificate), which is a significant change. My approach has been to seek to limit potential for nuisance by asking the applicant to remove the outdoor aspect of regulated entertainments, and also to have some basic controls over noise breakout and general good management practices by way of appropriate conditions. These controls have been agreed with EPS. Nevertheless, I felt that the extension of hours was on the cusp of tolerability.

My opinion is that the additional 30 minutes opening time is undesirable, and likely to exacerbate the potential for noise from customers departing to affect occupiers of neighbouring properties. I would argue that if the drinking up time is necessary, it would be preferable to reduce the licensable activities by 30 minutes, so as to protect the neighbourhood from additional nuisance.

Unfortunately **i** am not able to raise this as a formal representation, as opening hours do not constitute licensable activity are the refore not within the remit of the Act. I would therefore stand by my current agreement with the applicant to withdraw my previous objections. However, I feel it is my responsibility to raise this issue informally, and ask that an additional 30 minutes opening time is not included in the text of any licence granted.

Right of attendance, assistance and representation

15. Subject to regulations 14(2) and 25, a party may attend the hearing and may be assisted or represented by any person whether or not that person is legally qualified.

Representations and supporting information

- 16. At the hearing a party shall be entitled to -
 - (a) in response to a point upon which the authority has given notice to a party that it will want clarification under regulation 7(1)(d), give further information in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable),
 - (b) if given permission by the authority, question any other party; and
 - (c) address the authority

Failure of parties to attend the hearing

- 20. (1) If a party has informed the authority that he does not intend to attend or be represented at a hearing, the hearing may proceed in his absence.
 - (2) If a party who has not so indicated fails to attend or be represented at a hearing the authority may:-
 - (a) where it considers it to be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the hearing to a specified date, or
 - (b) hold the hearing in the party's absence.
 - (3) Where the authority holds the hearing in the absence of a party, the authority shall consider at the hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.
 - (4) Where the authority adjourns the hearing to a specified date it must forthwith notify the parties of the date, time and place to which the hearing has been adjourned.

Procedure at hearing

- 21. Subject to the provisions of the Regulations, the authority shall determine the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 22. At the beginning of the hearing, the authority shall explain to the parties the procedure which it proposes to follow at the hearing and shall consider any request made by a party under regulation 8(2) for permission for another person to appear at the hearing, such permission shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 23. A hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority and cross-examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considers that cross-examination is required for it to consider the representations, application or notice as the case may require.
- 24. The authority must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights provided for at regulation 16.
- 25. The authority may require any person attending the hearing who in their opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may –

(a) refuse to permit that person to return, or

(b) permit him to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify,

but such a person may, before the end of the hearing, submit to the authority in writing any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.


- (1) A party shall give to the authority within the period of time provided for in the following provisions of this regulation a notice stating
 - (a) whether he intends to attend or be represented at the hearing;
 - (b) whether he considers a hearing to be unnecessary
- (2) In a case where a party wishes any other person (other than the person he intends to represent him at the hearing) to appear at the hearing, the notice referred to in paragraph (1) shall contain a request for permission for such other person to appear at the hearing accompanied by details of the name of that person and a brief description of the point or points on which that person may be able to assist the authority in relation to the application, representations or notice of the party making the request.
- (3) In the case of a hearing under -
 - (a) section 48(3)(a) (cancellation of interim authority notice following police objection), or
 - (b) section 105(2)(a) (counter notice following police objection to temporary event notice),

the party shall give the notice no later than one working day before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

- (4) In the case of a hearing under -
 - (a) section 167(5)(a) (review of premises licence following closure order),
 - (b) paragraph 4(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application for conversion of existing licence), paragraph 16(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application for conversion of existing club certificate)
 - (c) paragraph 26(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application by holder of justices' licence for grant of personal licence),

the party shall give the notice no later than two working days before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

(5) In any other case, the party shall give the notice no later than five working days before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.



- 1. The hearing before the Council is Quasi Judicial.
- 2. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.
- 3. The Chair will ask the applicants to formally introduce themselves.
- 4. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 5. Hearing Procedure:-
 - (a) The Licensing Officer will introduce the report.
 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
 - (c) The Licensing Officer will introduce in turn representatives for the Responsible Authority and Interested Parties who will be asked to detail their relevant representations.
 - (d) Members may ask questions of those parties
 - (e) With the leave of the Chair the applicant or his representative may cross examine the representatives of the Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties.
 - (f) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (g) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) may then be asked questions by members and with the leave of the Chair from the other parties present.
 - (h) The applicant will then be given the opportunity to sum up the application.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for members to take legal advice and consider the application.
- 6. The decision of the Licensing Committee will be given in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and regulations made there under.
- NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
 - 2) The Committee Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.
