ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

If you are present at a meeting of the Council, of its executive or any committee of the executive, or of any committee, sub-committee, joint committee, or joint sub-committee of the authority, and you have a **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest** (DPI) relating to any business that will be considered at the meeting, you must not:

- participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your Disclosable Pecuniary Interest during the meeting, participate further in any discussion of the business, or
- participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

These prohibitions apply to any form of participation, including speaking as a member of the public.

You must:

- leave the room (in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct)
- make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of any DPI at any
 meeting at which you are present at which an item of business which affects or
 relates to the subject matter of that interest is under consideration, at or before
 the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes
 apparent.
- declare it to the meeting and notify the Council's Monitoring Officer within 28 days, if the DPI is not already registered.

If you have any of the following pecuniary interests, they are your **disclosable pecuniary interests** under the new national rules. You have a pecuniary interest if you, or your spouse or civil partner, have a pecuniary interest.

- Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain, which you, or your spouse or civil partner undertakes.
- Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from your council or authority) made or provided within the relevant period* in respect of any expenses incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

*The relevant period is the 12 months ending on the day when you tell the Monitoring Officer about your disclosable pecuniary interests.

- Any contract which is made between you, or your spouse or your civil partner (or a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest) and your council or authority –
 - under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and
 - which has not been fully discharged.

- Any beneficial interest in land which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, have and which is within the area of your council or authority.
- Any licence (alone or jointly with others) which you, or your spouse or your civil
 partner, holds to occupy land in the area of your council or authority for a month
 or longer.
- Any tenancy where (to your knowledge)
 - the landlord is your council or authority; and
 - the tenant is a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest.
- Any beneficial interest which you, or your spouse or your civil partner has in securities of a body where -
 - (a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of your council or authority; and
 - (b) either -
 - the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or
 - if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

If you attend a meeting at which any item of business is to be considered and you are aware that you have a **personal interest** in the matter which does not amount to a DPI, you must make verbal declaration of the existence and nature of that interest at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent. You should leave the room if your continued presence is incompatible with the 7 Principles of Public Life (selflessness; integrity; objectivity; accountability; openness; honesty; and leadership).

You have a personal interest where -

- a decision in relation to that business might reasonably be regarded as affecting
 the well-being or financial standing (including interests in land and easements
 over land) of you or a member of your family or a person or an organisation with
 whom you have a close association to a greater extent than it would affect the
 majority of the Council Tax payers, ratepayers or inhabitants of the ward or
 electoral area for which you have been elected or otherwise of the Authority's
 administrative area, or
- it relates to or is likely to affect any of the interests that are defined as DPIs but are in respect of a member of your family (other than a partner) or a person with whom you have a close association.

Guidance on declarations of interest, incorporating regulations published by the Government in relation to Disclosable Pecuniary Interests, has been circulated to you previously.

You should identify any potential interest you may have relating to business to be considered at the meeting. This will help you and anyone that you ask for advice to fully consider all the circumstances before deciding what action you should take.

In certain circumstances the Council may grant a **dispensation** to permit a Member to take part in the business of the Authority even if the member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest relating to that business.

To obtain a dispensation, you must write to the Monitoring Officer at least 48 hours before the meeting in question, explaining why a dispensation is sought and desirable, and specifying the period of time for which it is sought. The Monitoring Officer may consult with the Independent Person or the Council's Standards Committee in relation to a request for dispensation.

STREET TRADING - STATIC STREET TRADING CONSENT - THE JOB LOT CARPARK, BARNSLEY ROAD SHEFFIELD

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a Static Street Trading consent to trade at The Job Lot car park, 939 Barnsley Road Sheffield S5 0QJ.

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council as a Licensing Authority have power under the provision of the 1982 Act to regulate Street Trading in the City.
- 2.2 A Street Trading Consent is required to trade on any Street (which includes roads, footways, forecourts, or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City Boundary.
- 2.3 The Licensing Committee at it's meeting of 29th January 2002 passed the following resolution:
 - 1. That under the provisions of schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982:
 - (a) all streets (which includes roads, footways, forecourts or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City boundary, shall be designated consent streets and;
 - (b) such street trading designation shall take effect as from the 1st April 2002; and
 - (c) all previous designations in relation to street trading will be rescinded as a result of the designation set out above.
 - 2. The effect of this resolution is that from 1st April 2002, it will be an offence to engage in street trading in any street or any other place identified in the above resolution without being authorised to do so by consent from the City Council.
- 2.4 A Local Authority may attach conditions to a Street Trading Consent. The conditions may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street and danger to persons using the street or nuisance or annoyance.
- 2.5 A Street Trading Consent may only be granted for a maximum period of twelve months.

2.6 There is no appeal procedure against the refusal or revocation of a consent. An applicant may, however apply for judicial review of the Council's decision.

3.0 THE APPLICATION

- 3.1 The applicant is Wayne Walker and a copy of the application is attached at Appendix
- 3.2 The application was submitted on 20th June 2016.
- 3.3 The application is to sell fresh meat from a mobile chilled unit on a Friday every week from 08:00 to 16:00 hours.
- 3.4 The applicant has consulted with the Planning and Highways departments and received comments back from each service as well as authorisation from the manager at Job Lot to trade within the car park area at the premises.
- 3.5 The application was circulated, in the usual manner, to South Yorkshire Police, South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, Highways and Planning. Notices were erected by Licensing Officers at the site advertising the application and notice was also given to shops and anyone that might be affected by the applications within the immediate vicinity.
- 3.6 No objections have been received by any of the above relevant authorities.
- 3.7 Objections have been received by interested parties listed below in 4.1 of this report.

4.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 4.1 The application has been referred to the Sub-Licensing Committee for their consideration as the Licensing Authority has received objections to the application from the following parties:-
 - Local Residents
 - Interested Party (Application pending for Fabulous Flooring) (Similar goods and Close Proximity)

Copies of the representations are attached at Appendix 'B'

4.2 The objections refer to issues contained in section 2.8 of our street trading policy when determining the application, and Members are referred to in particular section 2.8.2:

Traders (a) & (b)

- 4.3 Members should consider all the information provided by the applicant both in their written application and in person at the hearing.
- 4.4 The applicant has been invited to attend the Licensing Committee hearing. Copies of the invites are attached at Appendix 'C'.

4.5 A copy of the hearing procedure is attached at Appendix 'D'.

5.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 The Street Trading Policy states that fees will be set and reviewed annually on a full cost recovery basis. The level of fee takes into account the location, duration of consent, the trading hours and articles to be sold as well as the enforcement of terms and conditions.
- 5.2 Fees for static consents are determined at the grant of the application therefore there are no financial implications arising from this report.

6.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

UNIT DESIGN

- Good display is an important part of the selling process and top quality presentation encourages purchase and benefits the retailers' reputation.
- It is in the best interest of traders to produce a high quality design both internally and externally in their unit.
- The function of the unit is to identify the trader and add vitality and colour to the immediate area, and reflect the quality, cleanliness in their operation. The unit must contribute to the appearance of the area for good or bad, so design matters to everyone who uses the street, as well as the operator.
- Stalls must enhance the visual appearance of the street rather than detract from it and be constructed in a suitable style and of appropriate materials.

Examples of acceptable designs include:

- o Modern, simple, functional stalls with umbrellas, canopies or striped awnings.
- o Traditional or 'period' type handcarts, barrows or tricycles.
- The stall design should be fully accessible for all customers.
- The outside of the unit will be limited to the name of the stall, the type of product sold and a simple price list. Ad hoc pictures and advertiser's slogans should be avoided, as should untidy handwritten signs.
- Advertisements on stalls will not be permitted except by permission of the Council in writing and subject to further conditions. The Council shall be the sole judge of what is an acceptable advertisement.
- Sign writing and scrollwork must be finished to a standard acceptable to the City Council.
- The unit must be visually acceptable to the City Council.
- The general design of the unit must meet the requirements of the Council for the location and proposed hours or days of trading. A photograph of the actual unit or proposed model must be submitted on application.
- Bright colours and a sense of fun are encouraged.
- Pitched and curved roofs are encouraged.
- Canopies must be maintained and cleaned.
- No expenditure on units or equipment should be made until the Council has granted consent and the unit design has been approved.
- The internal layout of the unit must be clean and to a high standard. Page 17

Not only that the new meat van is from Stoke on Trent, I want to support our local businesses in Sheffield like the meat van stood at the side of Fabulous Flooring.



 - (f) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the consultees / interested parties.
 - (g) The consultees / interested parties will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (h) The applicant will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for Members to take legal advice and consider the application.
 - (k) Once a decision has been reached, all parties will be invited to return. The Sub-Committee's decision and reasons will be announced by the Chair.
 - (I) The Sub-Committee's decision will be confirmed in writing to the applicant and those parties who made representations.
- NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a Static Street Trading consent to trade at Fabulous Flooring Car Park, Deerlands Avenue S5 7WN

2.0 INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 The Council as a Licensing Authority have power under the provision of the 1982 Act to regulate Street Trading in the City.
- 2.2 A Street Trading Consent is required to trade on any Street (which includes roads, footways, forecourts, or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City Boundary.
- 2.3 The Licensing Committee at it's meeting of 29th January 2002 passed the following resolution:
 - That under the provisions of schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982:
 - (a) all streets (which includes roads, footways, forecourts or other areas to which the public have access) within the Sheffield City boundary, shall be designated consent streets and;
 (b) such street trading designation about the consent street.
 - (b) such street trading designation shall take effect as from the 1st April 2002 and
 - (c) all previous designations in relation to street trading will be rescinded as a result of the designation set out above.
 - The effect of this resolution is that from 1st April 2002, it will be an offence to engage in street trading in any street or any other place identified in the above resolution without being authorised to do so by consent from the City Council.
- 2.4 A Local Authority may attach conditions to a Street Trading Consent. The conditions may include conditions to prevent obstruction of the street and danger to persons using the street or nuisance or annoyance.
- 2.5 A Street Trading Consent may only be granted for a maximum period of twelve months

2.6 There is no appeal procedure against the refusal or revocation of a consent. An applicant may, however apply for judicial review of the Council's decision.

3.0 THE APPLICATION

- 3.1 The applicant is Craig Wood (Calvert's Meats) and a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 'A'.
- 3.2 The application was submitted on 9th June 2016.
- 3.3 The application is to sell fresh meat from a mobile chilled unit on a Tuesday and Friday only every week from 08:00 to 16:00 hours.
- 3.4 The applicant has consulted with the Planning and Highways departments and received comments back from each service as well as authorisation from the Job Lot Deerland's Avenue to trade within the car park area at the premises. Attached at Appendix B.
- 3.5 The application was circulated, in the usual manner, to South Yorkshire Police, South Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, Highways and Planning. Notices were erected by Licensing Officers at the site advertising the application and notice was also given to shops and anyone that might be affected by the applications within the immediate vicinity.
- 3.6 No objections have been received from any of the above relevant authorities.

4.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 4.1 The application has been referred to the Sub-Licensing Committee for their consideration as the Licensing Authority has two application of a similar nature within close proximity of each other selling similar products
- 4.2 Section 2.8 of our street trading policy should be considered when determining the application, and Members are referred to in particular section 2.8.2:

Traders (a)

- 4.3 Mr Wood is and existing trader with Sheffield City Council and currently two statics street trading consents. Premier Convenience Store, Northern Avenue and the Car Park of the Old Blue Ball, Bradfield Road, Sheffield.
- 4.4 After information was received that Mr Wood was trading on this site without consent he was spoken to by Officers and subsequently made the required application and was granted a 1 month short term Street Trading Consent for this site (Fabulous Flooring) to trade on Sundays only between 5th June 2016 and 5th July 2016.

- 4.5 On 22nd August 2016 was contacted by Officers regarding a letter received on 11th August 2016 from Mr Wood stating that he no longer required the consent for Tuesday. Mr Wood was informed that he hadn't got any such consent. A copy of the officer's note is attached at appendix C
- 4.6 Members should consider all the information provided by the applicant both in their written application and in person at the hearing.
- 4.7 The applicant has been invited to attend the Licensing Committee hearing. Copies of the invites are attached at Appendix 'D'.
- 4.8 A copy of the hearing procedure is attached at Appendix 'E'.





 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
 - (c) The applicant/consent holder (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (d) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the applicant and/or his/her representative.
 - (e) Consultees / interested parties will be invited to present their representations or elect a spokesperson (which may be a Councillor) to speak on their behalf. New representations must not be raised.
 - (f) The Chair of the Licensing Committee will invite Members of the Sub-Committee and all other parties present to put any relevant questions to the consultees / interested parties.
 - (g) The consultees / interested parties will be invited to sum up. A maximum of 5 minutes will be allowed.
