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ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

If you are present at a meeting of the Council, of its executive or any committee of the executive, or of any committee, sub-committee, joint committee, or joint sub-committee of the authority, and you have a **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest (DPI)** relating to any business that will be considered at the meeting, you must not:

- participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your Disclosable Pecuniary Interest during the meeting, participate further in any discussion of the business, or
- participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

These prohibitions apply to any form of participation, including speaking as a member of the public.

You **must**:

- leave the room (in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct)
- make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of any DPI at any meeting at which you are present at which an item of business which affects or relates to the subject matter of that interest is under consideration, at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent.
- declare it to the meeting and notify the Council's Monitoring Officer within 28 days, if the DPI is not already registered.

If you have any of the following pecuniary interests, they are your **disclosable pecuniary interests** under the new national rules. You have a pecuniary interest if you, or your spouse or civil partner, have a pecuniary interest.

- Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain, which you, or your spouse or civil partner undertakes.
- Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from your council or authority) made or provided within the relevant period* in respect of any expenses incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

*The relevant period is the 12 months ending on the day when you tell the Monitoring Officer about your disclosable pecuniary interests.

- Any contract which is made between you, or your spouse or your civil partner (or a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest) and your council or authority –
 - under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and
 - which has not been fully discharged.

- Any beneficial interest in land which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, have and which is within the area of your council or authority.
- Any licence (alone or jointly with others) which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, holds to occupy land in the area of your council or authority for a month or longer.
- Any tenancy where (to your knowledge) –
 - the landlord is your council or authority; and
 - the tenant is a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest.
- Any beneficial interest which you, or your spouse or your civil partner has in securities of a body where -
 - (a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of your council or authority; and
 - (b) either -
 - the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or
 - if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

If you attend a meeting at which any item of business is to be considered and you are aware that you have a **personal interest** in the matter which does not amount to a DPI, you must make verbal declaration of the existence and nature of that interest at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent. You should leave the room if your continued presence is incompatible with the 7 Principles of Public Life (selflessness; integrity; objectivity; accountability; openness; honesty; and leadership).

You have a personal interest where –

- a decision in relation to that business might reasonably be regarded as affecting the well-being or financial standing (including interests in land and easements over land) of you or a member of your family or a person or an organisation with whom you have a close association to a greater extent than it would affect the majority of the Council Tax payers, ratepayers or inhabitants of the ward or electoral area for which you have been elected or otherwise of the Authority's administrative area, or
- it relates to or is likely to affect any of the interests that are defined as DPIs but are in respect of a member of your family (other than a partner) or a person with whom you have a close association.

Guidance on declarations of interest, incorporating regulations published by the Government in relation to Disclosable Pecuniary Interests, has been circulated to you previously.

You should identify any potential interest you may have relating to business to be considered at the meeting. This will help you and anyone that you ask for advice to fully consider all the circumstances before deciding what action you should take.

In certain circumstances the Council may grant a **dispensation** to permit a Member to take part in the business of the Authority even if the member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest relating to that business.

To obtain a dispensation, you must write to the Monitoring Officer at least 48 hours before the meeting in question, explaining why a dispensation is sought and desirable, and specifying the period of time for which it is sought. The Monitoring Officer may consult with the Independent Person or the Council's Audit and Standards Committee in relation to a request for dispensation.

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the variation of a premises licence made under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.

2.0 THE APPLICATION

2.1 The applicants are Mitchells & Butlers Leisure Retail Limited.

2.2 The application was received by the Licensing Service on the 12th July 2022, and is attached to Appendix 'A' of this report.

2.3 A copy of the current Premises Licence is attached at Appendix 'B'.

3.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

3.1 Outstanding representations concerning the application have been received from the following interested parties/Responsible Authorities and are attached at Appendix 'C'.

4.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5.0 THE LEGAL POSITION

5.1 The Licensing Act 2003 at section 4 (1) requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives which section 4(2) sets out as:

a) the prevention of crime and disorder;

- b) public safety;
- c) the prevention of public nuisance;
- d) the protection of children from harm.

5.2 Section 4(3) of the Licensing Act also requires the Licensing Authority to have regard to the published statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182.

6.0 HEARING REGULATIONS

6.1 Regulations governing hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 have been made by the Secretary of State.

6.2 The Licensing Authority has provided all parties with the information required in the Regulations to the 2003 Act as set out at Appendix 'D'.

6.3 Attached at Appendix 'D' is the following:

- a) a copy of the Notice of Hearing;
- b) the rights of a party provided in Regulations 15 and 16;

RESIDENT OBJECTIONS

To whom it may concern,

I am emailing regarding the application made by the Nursery Tavern to vary the current layout of the premises. I understand that their plan is to extend down the side of the premises and I would like to take the opportunity to say that I object to this proposal, and to outline my reasons for this.

I have been a resident of [REDACTED]

Over the last 2 summers in particular I have submitted several noise complaints (ref no for most recent complaint: 201000823492) to the council as I have found that the Nursery Tavern have a tendency to play loud music beyond the agreed time of 10pm and, on occasion, beyond midnight. The noise from the music has frequently interrupted my 5 year old's sleep, and has led to me regularly having to sleep on the sofa at the front of the house.

They have also turned the microphone up on their pub quiz on more than the one occasion, causing my son to worry that there is a stranger in our home as I have been trying to get him to sleep.

These experiences have led to me feeling claustrophobic and on edge in my own home.

In light of these things, I believe that the application they have made would only exacerbate the challenges that myself and other residents already face.

Since the end of the pandemic lockdowns, the atmosphere and noise levels of the beer garden tend to equate to that of a club, and I do not think that this should be brought any closer to any residential area, let alone one inhabited by young families.

I firmly believe that the voices and well-being of multiple people should be listened to over and above that of one, already busy, popular and thriving business.

Application by Mitchell & Butler to vary Premises licence - Nursery tavern Ecclesall Road Sheffield S11 8PE

I am writing to object to the above application on the basis of the prevention of a public nuisance.

The premises directly backs on to a residential street, the hours of operation of the outside of the licenced premises are without restriction and [REDACTED] we have problems with the amount of noise that emanates from the Nursery Tavern. This has increased particularly since the external area to the rear has been improved and extended (and a TV has been installed.) Hosting of large social events is encouraged and often the noise is intolerable.

This unfair (and no consideration is given) to all residents of Victoria Road, Collegiate Crescent and the surrounded area, many of which are family homes which are occupied by families with children, many of which are disturbed by the level of noise at night particularly in the summer.

This is a serious matter that should be considered before the licence is granted. The ours of operation allowing the establishment to allow their customers use the outside space should be restricted to take into account the occupants of the local area.

It is also noted at the closing time there is much more noise in the area extending form all of the licensed premises on Ecclesall Road. It would be unfair to say that this all came from the customers of the Nursery tavern, but they are certainly partially to blame.

On the basis of these points, I believe that the application should be rejected and would urge you to strongly consider the impact on the residents of the area before agreeing to any amendment.

Good afternoon,

I would like to register my objection to the above application for variations of premises licence.

I live at [REDACTED] The noise from the existing outside area of the pub does vary, peaking on weekends, however as a member of the adjacent tennis club as well as a local resident - I view that an attempt to expand the outside area is likely to only increase the noise levels.

The existing noise levels do impact tennis matches, but also it can clearly be heard in the habitable areas of my house and garden. With a young baby now in the household, this is now an increasing concern.

I'm aware that the Noise Act 1996 means that local authorities must take steps to investigate complaints of noise at nighttime, which I know my neighbours have pursued. This reinforces my view that an attempt to extend the outside area is likely to only further increase noise levels given the exposure of the area's entertainment systems into the surrounding neighbourhood.

I write to object to the Nursery Tavern's application to Sheffield City Council for a Variation of a Premises Licence to increase their outside licensed area.

Since moving to [REDACTED] have been surprised and

disappointed by The Nursery Tavern's unsocial behaviour towards its residential neighbours. The houses at the western end of [REDACTED] are very much affected by the noise coming from the outside area. There is an extremely big cinema type TV screen that regularly shows live sporting events, and this draws large enthusiastic noisy crowds. They have party nights in the outside area where the music level is unacceptable in a residential area. These evening events have sometimes gone on well after 11pm making it impossible to get to sleep in the back bedrooms of our house.

I would question whether they are conducting their licensable activities within the permitted hours and conditions?

I object because further extending the outside area can only add to the un-contained noise and for this reason, I am unhappy about this proposal.

We are writing with regard to Mitchells & Butlers Leisure Retail Ltd's application to vary the premises licence for Nursery Tavern, 276 Ecclesall Road, Sheffield S11 8PE.

They are proposing to vary the layout of the premises to enclose external seating to the side of the premises and reposition the gates leading to the rear garden.

We (Ranjan Sen and Charlotte Steenbrugge) live at [REDACTED] and the current large outdoor seating area. We would like to object strongly to the planned extension of the outdoor seating area. While we fully appreciate the value of local businesses thriving, and that Ecclesall Road is an excellent venue for social activities, we feel that these points should be balanced by the needs and wellbeing of local residents, especially as the Nursery Tavern is located adjacent to the Broomhall residential (and conservation) area, many of whom are either elderly or have young children, or have jobs where obtaining good rest is paramount (e.g. in the medical profession).

The Nursery Tavern has extended its outdoor social activities in recent years, with the addition of outdoor TV screens and speakers. These additions have very noticeably added to the noise pollution in the area on several evenings a week, often making it difficult for our children to get to sleep, particularly during large sporting occasions. Many of our neighbours have had to call the Tavern on behalf of all the residents in order to ask them politely to turn the volume level down, but there are many evenings when we all just put up with it.

The plan to extend outdoor seating and the potential for further entertainment certainly tips that balance between residents and social businesses strongly to the side of the businesses. We love the vibrant Ecclesall Road area, but also value living in a residential conservation area. Adding further noise pollution to the area - when we have already had to tolerate significant increases over the last few years - seems very much contradictory to the ethos of conservation.

I live at [REDACTED]

I have serious concerns with regards to any further development of the outdoor area. This is with regards to noise and disturbances.

I have spoken with Sam the manager recently with regards to noise nuisance with music being played on outdoor speaker both during the daytime and into the evening. In addition, there is considerable noise associated with large volumes of people gathering in the garden (shouting, chatting and singing).

Sam reassured me that they regularly check the volume and put staff on the back door and that the speakers are turned off (both outside and in the back of the pub) but I would question this as I thought I could hear music being played outside on Friday until nearly midnight. I called the pub and spoke with Sam who reassured me they keep the sound down and turn the speakers off so he would make sure this shouldn't happen. He has given me his number in case of further disturbances which I appreciate.

I did then hear music coming from the outdoor speakers past 8pm yesterday evening (Saturday 6th). Whilst I don't mind some level of noise and Sam was very responsive to my issues, I have significant concern over any additional space and noise levels of the pub. More people outside will make more noise.

My children's bedrooms are at the back of my house overlooking the pub. In the summer they are unable to open their windows often due to the noise.

The trees at the back of the pub were removed a few years ago and as I mentioned to Sam I felt that the established trees did provide some barrier to the noise. There is now nothing between us and the pub garden. Sam did mention contacting his manger to discuss replanting which I really appreciate but it would take time to become established and provide a useful barrier.

Please feel free to contact me with regards to this. I would be most happy for you to visit my property to see the issues.

We hereby strongly disagree to any planning application of this venue as it continues to promote loud

outside music and noise. It frequently exceeds reasonable noise levels to the extent that we cannot sit in our back garden without hearing excessive noise and it is absolutely not possible to leave our windows open at night due to the noise level.

The enormous screen is clearly visible from our house, the noise is frequently loud chattering, singing, chanting, screaming and booing (they stream live sports events on their large screen) We do not feel by extending the outside space even further than it already is, is reasonable to all residents living in the vicinity.

Our concern with a possible new extended outside area is that they have started to employ DJ's playing loud music in the outside area already. We do not believe this to be in keeping with a pub in such close proximity to a residential area as we can clearly hear when these DJ events are going on.

There is also the knock-on effect of drunk people littering the streets such as Collegiate Crescent and Victoria Road and leaving the premises late, again causing additional noise disturbance.

We are a family including professional workers and teenage children – due to take GCSE's next year, and this noise level does absolutely affect our living standard and sleep.

We see no reason whatsoever of why they need extra outside space and feel very strongly against it.

Thank you for your emails and refer to my telephone conversation with you earlier today. I regret to inform you that as the responsible authority in respect of Public Safety at the present time I have no alternative than to make a formal representation due to the proposed layout and arrangements shown on the plan which are unsatisfactory.

I have visited the premises and am concerned there is potential impact on means of escape both from the position and size of the gates and increase in benches throughout the beer garden.

Unfortunately I have not yet been able to speak to a fire officer about this.

I also have concerns about the 'new area' being for seating in addition to the existing seating in the beer garden. The premises already regularly has up to 450 customers which is far more than the sanitary facilities in the premises were originally designed for (maximum 250). I think consideration needs to be given to both a maximum capacity for the beer garden and more facilities for the benefit of public safety.

Please ask your clients to provide more information on how the extended area is intended to be used and to consider provision of additional sanitary facilities. I would be happy to attend a site meeting.

15. Subject to regulations 14(2) and 25, a party may attend the hearing and may be assisted or represented by any person whether or not that person is legally qualified.

Representations and supporting information

16. At the hearing a party shall be entitled to –
- (a) in response to a point upon which the authority has given notice to a party that it will want clarification under regulation 7(1)(d), give further information in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable),
 - (b) if given permission by the authority, question any other party; and
 - (c) address the authority

Failure of parties to attend the hearing

20. – (1) If a party has informed the authority that he does not intend to attend or be represented at a hearing, the hearing may proceed in his absence.
- (2) If a party who has not so indicated fails to attend or be represented at a hearing the authority may:–
- (a) where it considers it to be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the hearing to a specified date, or
 - (b) hold the hearing in the party's absence.

23. A hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority and cross-examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considers that cross-examination is required for it to consider the representations, application or notice as the case may require.
24. The authority must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights provided for at regulation 16.
25. The authority may require any person attending the hearing who in their opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may –
- (a) refuse to permit that person to return, or
 - (b) permit him to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify,

(c) but such a person may, before the end of the hearing, submit to the authority in writing any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.



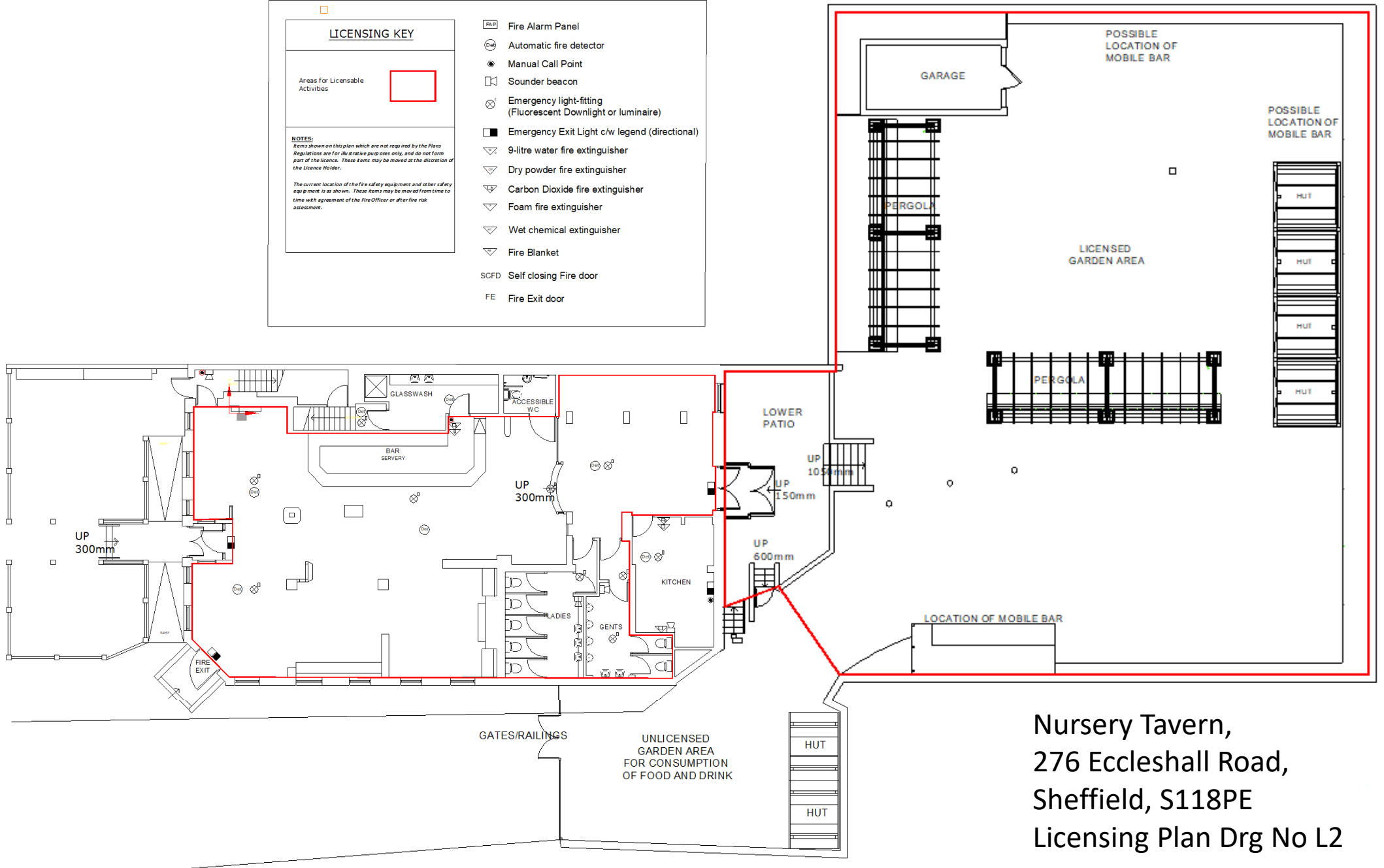



ANNEXES**Annex 1A - Mandatory Conditions****Mandatory Condition 1 (Section 19 ss 2)**

Where a licence authorises the sale of alcohol then no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Mandatory Condition 2 (Section 19 ss 3)

Where a licence authorises the sale of alcohol then every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory Condition 3 (Section 20)

Annex 1B - Mandatory Condition effective from 28th May 2014:

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-

- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.



ANNEXES continued ...

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 1C - Mandatory Conditions effective from 1st October 2014:

- 1.-(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3.- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
4. The responsible person must ensure that-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

Supplementary information

Sheffield City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy on Public Safety states Licence holders have a responsibility to ensure the safety of those using their premises and advises applicants to undertake risk assessments in relation to the safety of customers and staff on the premises. Guidance on WC provision:

Building Regulation Approved Document G provides information on the scale of provision and layout of toilets in buildings other than dwellings.

For staff toilets paragraph 4.12 refers to The Workplace (Health, Safety and Welfare) Regulations 1992 on the minimum number of sanitary conveniences which must be provided in workplaces. The Approved Code of Practice (ACOP) that supports those Regulations sets out how to calculate that minimum requirement (guidance on those minimum numbers can be found at <https://www.hse.gov.uk/simple-health-safety/workplace-facilities/health-safety.htm>).

For accessible toilets paragraph 4.13 refers to Part M of Schedule 1 to the Building Regulations 2010 which sets out requirements relating to access to and use of buildings and guidance on the provision of suitable sanitary accommodation. Such accommodation may form part of the total number of sanitary conveniences provided within a building.

For the number of customer toilets paragraph 4.14 refers to BS 6465-1:2006 + A1:2009 Sanitary installations. Code of practice for the design of sanitary facilities and scales of provision of sanitary and associated appliances. Table 11 is used to calculate the minimum provision for licenced pubs, bars, nightclubs and discos.

The standards are based on research and state that toilets need to be quickly accessible without the need to queue. Calculations for the number of persons using the sanitary facilities should reflect normal peak use. Allowance has been made in the tables for the fact that premises are unlikely to be used to capacity most of the time and the numbers should not be reduced.

Background: The Nursery Tavern (see photos below)

The Nursery Tavern has confirmed it has an internal capacity of 217. The proportion of wet sales at the premises is 92 %, only 8% of sales relating to food. The sanitary appliances for the original building were designed for a maximum capacity of 250. The premises has seating to the front of the premises and in recent years an extensive beer garden with seating huts containing televisions, outdoor seating and two large TV screens has been installed without any additional sanitary provision at the premises. The proposed extension of the outdoor beer garden area could potentially increase the premises capacity by 60 – 70 persons.

From discussion with the manager, it is confirmed this popular premises regularly has between 350 - 450 customers at one time during the week, especially football match days, student nights and other sports event days where the use of the beer garden is so popular numbers have to be regulated on a one in one out basis and extensive queues for the toilets require door staff supervision and half hourly cleaning. Females and customers requiring unisex accessible facilities are particularly disadvantaged as the time required to use these facilities is greater. Undue delay queuing for toilets can lead to distress, health problems and potential pressure to exit the premises to urinate in the street.

In my opinion if the customer area is extended, there should be no further increase in customer capacity and the total capacity of the premises capped at 441 in line with the planning permission plans dated June 2018 (18/03728/FUL) unless permanent additional sanitary provision is provided in accordance with BS 6465-1:2006 + A1:2009 Table 11.

I further recommend that for match days and other events where the numbers of customers are likely to exceed 300, the requirement for additional sanitary provision is risk assessed and temporary additional facilities provided to prevent excessive queuing.

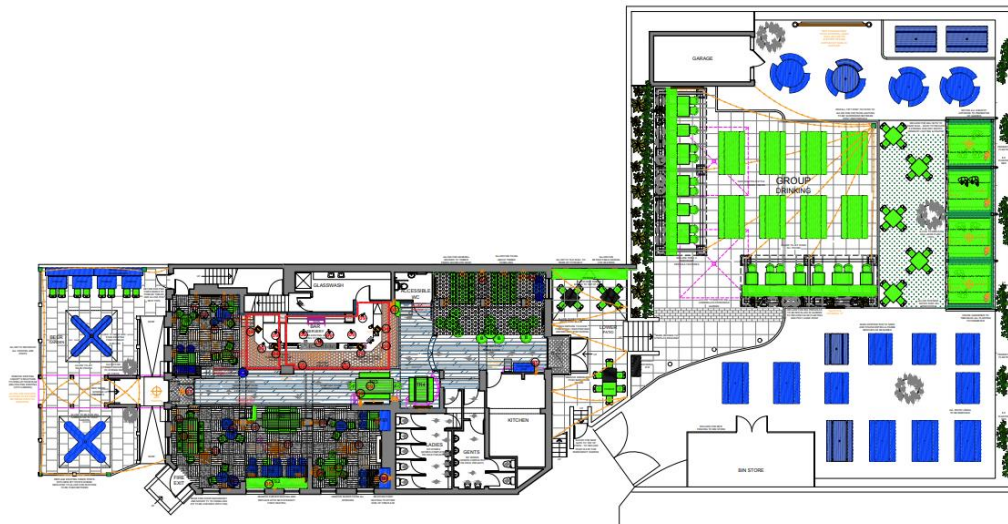

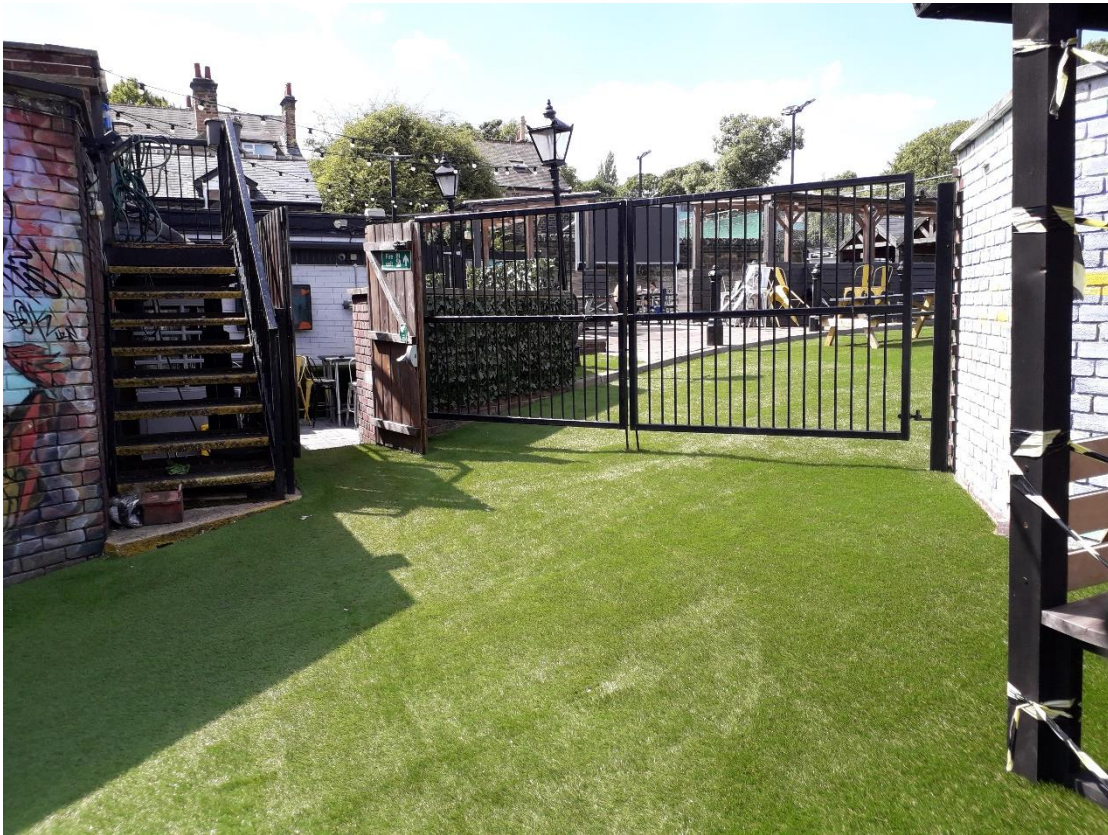
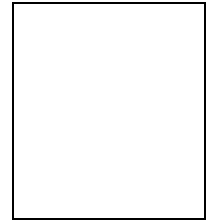


Figure 6: Part of proposed new seating area

Dear Ms Hannah Beddow,

In respect of the attached Temporary Event Notice (TEN) for 17/09/2022, please take this as formal advice of my objection to this TEN. The objection is made in my capacity of Environmental Protection Officer for Sheffield City Council, acting as Responsible Authority for the Prevention of Public Nuisance. The objection is made on the basis of likely public nuisance arising from the noise associated with this outside event.

The Premises Licence Holder, True North Brew Co, previously sought my views on the Oktoberfest event prior to this TEN being received, and I communicated the likelihood of the this objection at that time. The reasons are as set out in the attached email response to Marc Craddock on this topic, dated 19/07/2022. For ease of reference, in that email I advised;

"In my view the Oktoberfest event would be ill-advised. As we've established, the premises is extremely noise-sensitive. The relaxations the NMP permits for pre-notified events were intended to allow due consideration of a small number of appropriately low key events, both in terms of the entertainment provision and the character of the events in general. Oktoberfest is, by definition and tradition, a bawdy affair. Whilst acoustic, the entertainment described is loud, intrusive and cannot be readily reduced in volume. The noise from patrons partaking in this type of event would reasonably be anticipated to be higher than for an average event. Entertainers of the type referenced encourage a degree of audience participation, as is demonstrated by the description that they walk around the audience and take requests.

I would be minded to object, and to allow the Licensing Subcommittee to make a decision in respect of such a proposal."

I maintain this position now, on behalf of SCC EPS Commercial Team, and therefore object to this TEN outright.

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the variation of a premises licence made under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.



I represent Sheffield City Council's Health and Safety Enforcement Team in the Health Protection Service as Responsible Authority for Public Safety for this application.

I note from the documents that major refurbishment is planned/taking place at the premises and would like to check with you if the premises was built before the year 2000. If this is the case can you please advise me if an asbestos renovation survey has been carried out as I will need to know this.

There are two types of asbestos survey:

- Asbestos Management Survey - This type of survey is for managing asbestos in the premises where major change is not being carried out.
- A Refurbishment & Demolition Survey – where full access, sampling and identification is required. This type of survey is normally recommended prior to demolition or major refurbishment work commencing in the survey area to identify all asbestos containing materials to be removed as far reasonably practicable before major refurbishment or final demolition.

I have gone through all to documents you have sent but unfortunately a number of issues remain unanswered. I understand Sean will discuss with you when you meet next week.

25/08/22 - Additional information and plans received from Michelle Hazelwood.

Revised Plans – these are still unsatisfactory

It is noted that 'the drawings, plans, sketches etc. are provided to our clients based upon information provided by the client and drawn in accordance with common building practices and local codes. None of the employees are registered architects, engineers or land surveyors...'

1. The stepped entrance to the premises is not shown.

2. The drawings do not show the changes in level to the fire exit to Steel Road. The temporary ramp seen at time of visit did not comply with Part M of the building regulations, and a compliant ramp or steps will need to be shown.
3. There is no indication where the goods lift terminates in the kitchen as it is not marked on the ground floor plan.
4. The bar or bars are not shown.
5. The external terrace and other rooms are not adequately identified.
6. No information on internal stair dimensions or external stair from the terrace have been provided as requested.

I understand from the correspondence the number of internal covers is to be 60.
An asbestos survey has been submitted following action taken by the Health and Safety Executive and found to be satisfactory.

Application

There is no mention of an additional outside first floor terrace on the licence application form and it is not identified in the original drawings or identified as such on the updated plan.

I propose these conditions for consideration.

1. *A Building Regulation Completion Certificate shall be submitted to the responsible authority for public safety prior to opening for business.*
2. *A satisfactory Electrical Installation Certificate shall be submitted to the responsible authority for public safety prior to opening for business. (If an electrical condition report is provided it should cover 100% of the premises).*
3. *A permanent fixed residual current device (RCD) must protect the electrical power serving all amplified music equipment used for the purposes of live music or similar entertainment.*
4. *A structural engineers report shall be submitted confirming that the single-story roof is suitable to be used as a outdoor seating area or terrace for a dynamic load commensurate for the purpose and numbers of people using it.*
5. *There shall be no transportation of hot food and drinks using the public staircase between the ground floor and the first floor (whilst open to members of the public).*

 3. The Chair will ask the applicants to formally introduce themselves.
 4. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.

The premises has recently been sold and application was filed with you for Transfer of the Premises Licence to the new operator.

The new operator seeks to undertake significant refurbishment of the premises and rebrand it a modern Mediterranean restaurant, particularly focussing on the culture and food of east of the Mediterranean – Turkey, Greece etc.

The refurbishment has allowed a review of the Premises Licence to be undertaken and application is made to amend the Licence as follows:

1. Layout.

To amend the layout of the premises as per drawing 05/22 Licensing Plan which is annexed and the changes are as follows:

Ground Floor

- Relocation of bar servery and provision of new high counter tables and relocation of stairway to first floor.
- Additional provision in connection with toilet facilities
- Complete refit of kitchen including provision of food hoist.

First Floor

- To include within the licensed area, the first floor which has always existed and been used but was previously omitted from the licensed area.
- To provide food hoist to first floor.
- Fixed seating
- New centrally located bar servery.
- Creation of two private dining areas.
- Additional toilet provision.
- Back of house services.

2. Licensable Activities

- (a) To enhance hours in respect of all licensable activities retail sale of alcohol, provision of facilities for entertainment, live and recorded music to commence at 11:30 hours daily so as to provide for the provision of aperitifs and early lunch bookings.
- (b) To enhance hours in respect of Sundays to 23:30 hours to provide consistency throughout the week in respect of retail sale of alcohol, late night refreshment, provision of facilities for entertainment, live and recorded music.
- (c) To permit both on sales and off sales of alcohol daily.

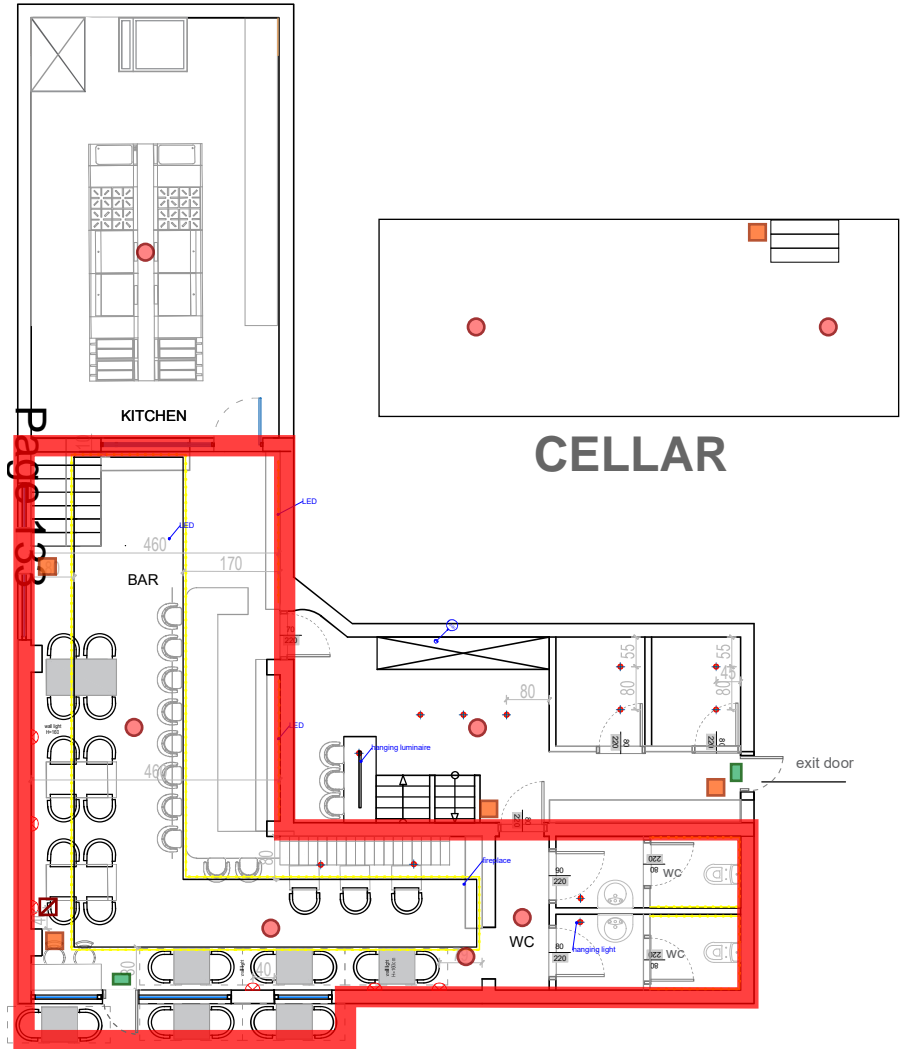

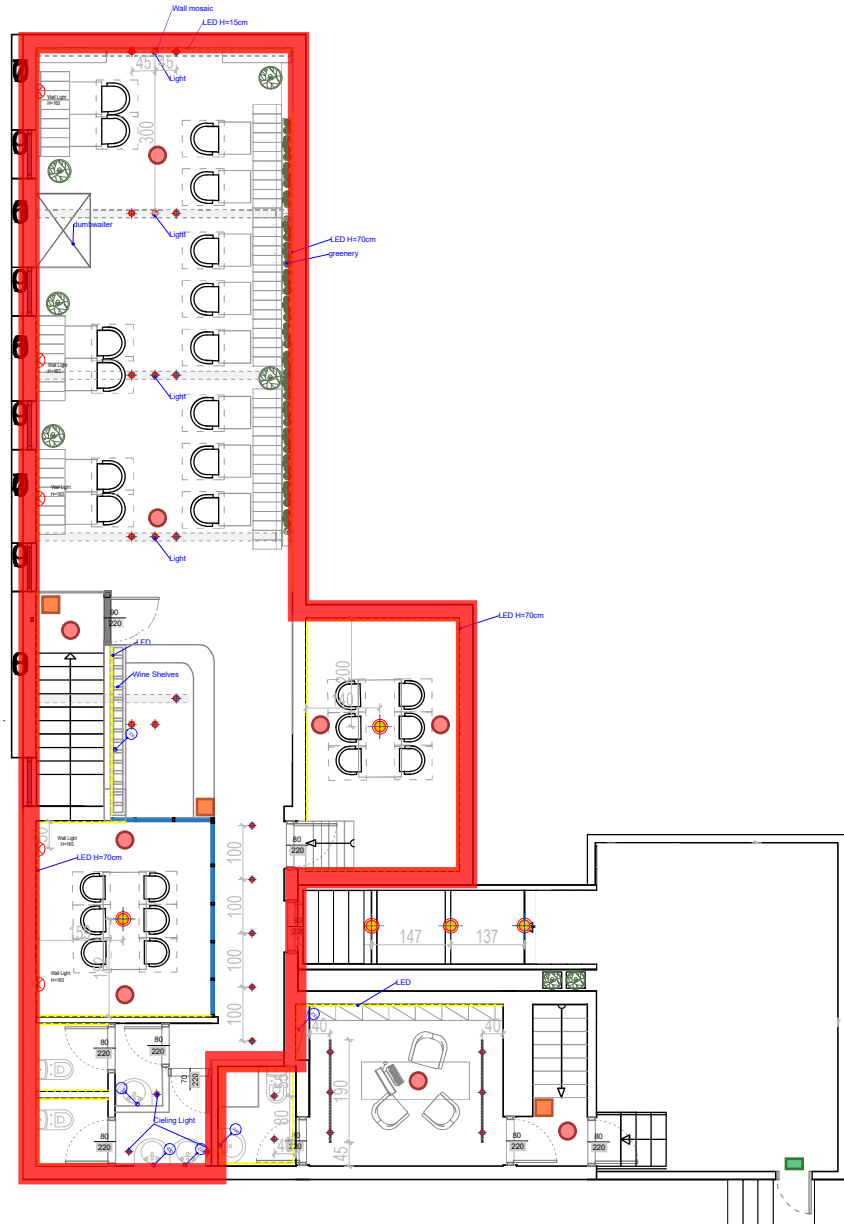

ANNEXES**Annex 1A - Mandatory Conditions****Mandatory Condition 1 (Section 19 ss 2)**

Where a licence authorises the sale of alcohol then no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

ANNEXES continued ...**Annex 1C - Mandatory Conditions effective from 1st October 2010:**

These mandatory conditions apply where the licence authorises the supply of alcohol. The condition 5 does not apply where the licence authorises the sale by retail or supply of alcohol only for consumption off the premises.

4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

I have the following representation to make with regards to Public Nuisance for the application for a premises licence for the above premises.

The premises are located in close proximity to residential accommodation. I am therefore concerned that nearby residents could potentially be affected by excessive noise disturbance from the use of the premises for longer and/ or later hours on some days, noise breaking out of the premises and noise from people outside the venue in the later evening.

I represent Sheffield City Council's Health and Safety Enforcement Team in the Health Protection Service as Responsible Authority for Public Safety for this application.

I note from the documents that major refurbishment is planned/taking place at the premises and would like to check with you if the premises was built before the year 2000. If this is the case can you please advise me if an asbestos renovation survey has been carried out as I will need to know this.

There are two types of asbestos survey:

- Asbestos Management Survey - This type of survey is for managing asbestos in the premises where major change is not being carried out.
- A Refurbishment & Demolition Survey – where full access, sampling and identification is required. This type of survey is normally recommended prior to demolition or major refurbishment work commencing in the survey area to identify all asbestos containing materials to be removed as far reasonably practicable before major refurbishment or final demolition.

I have gone through all to documents you have sent but unfortunately a number of issues remain unanswered. I understand Sean will discuss with you when you meet next week.

25/08/22 - Additional information and plans received from Michelle Hazelwood.

Revised Plans – these are still unsatisfactory

It is noted that *'the drawings, plans, sketches etc. are provided to our clients based upon information provided by the client and drawn in accordance with common building practices and local codes. None of the employees are registered architects, engineers or land surveyors...'*

1. The stepped entrance to the premises is not shown.
2. The drawings do not show the changes in level to the fire exit to Steel Road. The temporary ramp seen at time of visit did not comply with Part M of the building regulations, and a compliant ramp or steps will need to be shown.
3. There is no indication where the goods lift terminates in the kitchen as it is not marked on the ground floor plan.
4. The bar or bars are not shown.
5. The external terrace and other rooms are not adequately identified.
6. No information on internal stair dimensions or external stair from the terrace have been provided as requested.

I understand from the correspondence the number of internal covers is to be 60. An asbestos survey has been submitted following action taken by the Health and Safety Executive and found to be satisfactory.

Application

There is no mention of an additional outside first floor terrace on the licence application form and it is not identified in the original drawings or identified as such on the updated plan.

I propose these conditions for consideration.

1. *A Building Regulation Completion Certificate shall be submitted to the responsible authority for public safety prior to opening for business.*
2. *A satisfactory Electrical Installation Certificate shall be submitted to the responsible authority for public safety prior to opening for business. (If an electrical condition report is provided it should cover 100% of the premises).*
3. *A permanent fixed residual current device (RCD) must protect the electrical power serving all amplified music equipment used for the purposes of live music or similar entertainment.*
4. *A structural engineers report shall be submitted confirming that the single-story roof is suitable to be used as a outdoor seating area or terrace for a dynamic load commensurate for the purpose and numbers of people using it.*
5. *There shall be no transportation of hot food and drinks using the public staircase between the ground floor and the first floor (whilst open to members of the public).*

Supplementary information

Sheffield City Council's Statement of Licensing Policy on Public Safety states Licence holders have a responsibility to ensure the safety of those using their premises and advises applicants to undertake risk assessments in relation to the safety of customers and staff on the premises. The Policy also encourages the provision of disabled access and facilities to licensed premises when a new application is being made or when substantial alterations are taking place, reasonable provision must be made under the Equality Act 2010 for people to access and use the building and its facilities.

The design standards for venue safety referred to in the Public Safety Policy are:

- Building Regulations Approved Document M: Access to and use of buildings - Volume 2: Buildings other than dwellings (This includes ramped access design).
- BS 8300-1 2018: Design of an accessible and inclusive built environment - Part 1: External environment - Code of practice
- BS 8300-2 2018: Design of an accessible and inclusive built environment - Part 2: Buildings - Code of practice (this includes wheelchair and ambulant accessible toilet design)

Timeline

17/06/2022: Request was made to Applicant Solicitor Michelle Hazelwood for confirmation that the premises was built prior to 2000 and a risk assessment for Asbestos had been carried out prior to refurbishment.

08/07/2022: A meeting with Solicitor Michelle Hazelwood was arranged at the building site. Access to the building was not possible as there was no confirmation that a risk assessment for Asbestos had been carried out. There was discussion about the plans and what was intended in the building.

It was confirmed that:

1. The planned capacity was 79 persons
2. There was no wheelchair accessible provision to the building or wheelchair accessible sanitary provision. The provision of wheelchair access and sanitary provision in accordance with Part M was requested.
3. There were numerous changes of level in the building shown on the plan for which new staircases were to be constructed. Advice was given on the dimensions required for licenced premises.
4. There were at least two rooms for guests on the first floor without windows and no information on ventilation. Advice on requirement for ventilation was provided.
5. There was an unmarked area on the first floor of the plan with fire exit which did not seem to lead anywhere. The building owner's representative stated this area was to be an external seating area on the roof of the single-story portion of the building with a fire escape stair to be built. Advice was provided that this would need to be checked by a structural engineer to confirm it was suitable and would need to be marked on the plan.

6. There did not seem to be any understanding that there would need to be building control approval for the structural changes to the premises and this would be required as a condition on the licence.

It became clear that the plan as submitted was inadequate and did not reflect what was being built. A request was made for suitable scale plans 1:100 at A4 to be produced representing what was actually being built and incorporating wheelchair access and sanitary provision in accordance with the licencing policy.

The lack of risk assessment in relation to asbestos was reported to the HSE as the building site fell to their enforcement. I understand and inspector was to visit.

26/7/22 to 24/08/22 - Various correspondence with Michelle Hazelwood summarised below:

1. Confirmation has been received that an architect has been engaged, plans are to be submitted to building control, ventilation arrangements will be made for the internal guest rooms, and space has been found for a wheelchair accessible toilet.
2. No new plans have yet been submitted to the responsible authority for public safety, so it has not been possible to assess if other risks to public safety need to be considered.
3. Staircase dimensions, ramp access gradient and structural engineers report for the terrace have not been received.
4. No confirmation has been received that either asbestos was not present, or the premises is subject to a clearance certificate to allow for a visit to the premises.

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I understand from the correspondence the number of internal covers is to be 60.

An asbestos survey has been submitted following action taken by the Health and Safety Executive and found to be satisfactory.

Application

There is no mention of an additional outside first floor terrace on the licence application form and it is not identified in the original drawings or identified as such on the updated plan.

Should the licensing committee be minded to grant the licence the following conditions are proposed for consideration.

1. *A Building Regulation Completion Certificate shall be submitted to the responsible authority for public safety prior to opening for business.*
2. *A satisfactory Electrical Installation Certificate shall be submitted to the responsible authority for public safety prior to opening for business. (If an electrical condition report is provided it should cover 100% of the premises).*
3. *A permanent fixed residual current device (RCD) must protect the electrical power serving all amplified music equipment used for the purposes of live music or similar entertainment.*
