REPORT TO THE EXECUTIVE LEADER

MONTH 2 2014/15 CAPITAL APPROVALS

1. SUMMARY

- 1.1 A number of schemes have been submitted for approval in line with the Council's agreed capital approval process. In line with the agreed financial reporting calendar, these schemes would normally go forward for approval at the Cabinet to be held in August . However, the August cabinet has been cancelled and the next scheduled meeting is 17th September. In order to avoid unnecessary delay to the progress of these projects, approval is sought through a Leader's Executive Decision.
- 1.2 Below is a summary of the number and total value of schemes in each approval category:
 - 9 additions to the capital programme with a total value of £2.9m; and
 - 52 variations to the capital programme creating a net increase of £2.7m.

Further details of the schemes listed above can be found in Appendix 1.

1.3 There were no instances of variations or emergency approval of additions under the delegated authority provisions.

2.1 The proposed changes to the Capital programme will improve the schools, roads, homes, parks and woodlands used by the people of Sheffield.
