Notice under Regulation 11: Key Decisions taken in cases of Special Urgency

Pursuant to Regulation 11 of the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012 ('the Regulations'), I hereby give Notice that:-

The Leader intends to make a Key Decision on behalf of the Sheffield City Council about the Grey to Green project

This decision is urgent and cannot reasonably be deferred. Consequently it has not been possible to give 5 clear days' notice of the intention to make the Key Decision, as required by Regulation 10 of the Regulations.

The reasons why the making of the decision is urgent and cannot reasonably be deferred are as follows:-

The 'Grey to Green' project is expected to be funded from ERDF and SCRIF. But as timescales do not align, the Council is making a commitment to match fund the project if we don't get the SCRIF funding. This process is ongoing at present. Although we have been advised that we have been successful to obtain ERDF funding, we are still awaiting the ERDF final offer letter. We are expecting the signing of the Leader Report on w/c 25 August 14; achieving Gateway 4 at CPG on Friday, 29 August 14 and signing the ERDF agreement early September 14.
