I therefore recommend that a budget be given to allow the Lord Mayor to offer gifts to the visitors.
- I have concerns regarding some of the invitations the Lord Mayor's office receives. Through conversation, this is a view also held by past Lord Mayors. I therefore recommend that past Lord Mayors meet to discuss their concerns with a view to making proposals for the future management of invitations.
- 5.3 I would ask that the Council Meeting notes this report and gives consideration to the specific recommendations I have made.
