Notice under Regulation 10: Key Decision where less than 28 days' public notice has been given

Pursuant to Regulation 10 of the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012 ('the Regulations'), **I hereby give Notice** that:-

The Leader intends to make a Key Decision on behalf of the Sheffield City Council during the period from 14th April 2016 to 18th April 2016 inclusive

The Key Decision will be about the Syrian Vulnerable Persons Relocation Scheme

It has not been possible to give 28 clear days' notice of the intention to make the Key Decision, as required by Regulation 9 (2) of the Regulations.

The reasons why compliance with Regulation 9 is impracticable in this matter are as follows:-

The Home Office require, early in April 2016, all local authorities in the Yorkshire and Humber region to commit to resettling a prescribed number of refugees during the course of this parliament. The timescales do not provide sufficient time to provide 28 days' notice of the decision.
