Hearing to consider a notice of objection to a Temporary Event Notice.

Dam House, Mushroom Lane, Sheffield, S3 7NZ

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider a notice of objection submitted by Neal Pates, Environmental Protection Services relating to a temporary event notice for the premises known as Dam House, Mushroom Lane, Sheffield, S3 7NZ.

2.0 THE TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE

- 2.1 The proposed premises user is Mr Kamaljit Singh Sangha.
- 2.2 The temporary event notice, which was received on 8th August 2016, along with the current copy of the premises licence is attached to this report labelled Appendix 'A'.
- 2.3 The event are as follows;

Use of outside Garden Patio area for licensable activities listed below. (Beer Festival with outdoor music).

- 2.4 The licensable activities and hours intended to be carried at the premises are:
 - The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on the premises (10:00 until 02:00 hours the following day)
 - The provision of regulated entertainment (12:00 until 22:00 hours)
 - The provision of late night refreshment (23:00 until 02:00 hours the following day)

3.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 3.1 A notice was submitted by Neal Pates, Environmental Protection Service on the 11th August 2016, objecting to the temporary event notice. The notice of objection is attached at Appendix 'B'.
- 3.2 The applicant and the objector from 3.1 have been invited to attend the hearing. Copies of the front page of the notices are attached to this report labelled Appendix 'C'.



4.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 There are no specific financial implications arising from this application. However, additional costs may be incurred should the matter go to appeal. In such an eventuality it may not be possible to recover all these costs. The impact of these additional costs (if any) will be kept under review and may be subject of a further report during the year.

5.0 THE LEGAL POSITION

- 5.1 A Chief Police Officer or Environmental Protection Service of the Local Authority may object to a Temporary Event Notice.
- 5.2 Where such an objection is received, the relevant licensing authority must -
 - (a) hold a hearing to consider the objection notice, unless the premises user, the Chief Police Officer / Environmental Protection Service who gave the objection notice and the authority agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
 - (b) having regard to the objection notice, give the premises user a counter notice under this section if it considers it necessary for the promotion of the relevant licensing objective to do so."

6.0 HEARINGS REGULATIONS

- 6.1 Regulations governing hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 have been made by the Secretary of State.
- 6.2 The Licensing Authority has provided all parties with the information required in the Regulations to the 2003 Act as set out at Appendix 'D'.
- 6.3 Attached at Appendix 'D' is the following:
 - a) a copy of the Notice of Hearing;
 - b) the rights of a party provided in Regulations 15 and 16;
 - c) the consequences if a party does not attend or is not represented at the hearing
 - d) the procedure to be followed at the hearing.

7.0 APPEALS

7.1 The Licensing Act 2003 section 181 and Schedule 5 makes provision for appeals to be made by the premises user and the chief officer of Police against decisions of the Licensing Authority, to the Magistrates' Court.

8.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

8.1 That members carefully consider the representations made and take such steps, as the Committee consider necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.



9.0 OPTIONS OPEN TO THE COMMITTEE

- 9.1 To acknowledge the temporary event notice, allowing the event to go ahead on the proposed date as per the application.
- 9.2 To acknowledge the temporary event notice, allowing the event to go ahead on the proposed date with conditions.
- 9.3 To give the premises user a counter notice if it considers it necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

Annex 1A - Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory Condition 1 (Section 19 ss 2)

Where a licence authorises the sale of alcohol then no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence –

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Mandatory Condition 2 (Section 19-ss 3)

Where a licence authorises the sale of alcohol then every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory Condition 3 (Section 20)

- 1. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence includes the following conditions relating to the admission of children to the exhibition:
 - (a) The admission of children (under 18) to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with the classification set by the film classification body (currently the BBFC).
 - (b) In a case where there is no classification given by the classification body (the BBFC) the admission of children to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation given by the Licensing Authority.
- 2. In this section -

"children" means persons aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Mandatory Condition 4 (Section 21)

Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.



Annex 1B - Mandatory Conditions effective from 6th April 2010:

These mandatory conditions apply where the licence authorises the supply of alcohol. The conditions in paragraph 1 to 3 do not apply where the licence authorises the sale by retail or supply of alcohol only for consumption off the premises.

- 1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring:
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.



Annex 1C - Mandatory Conditions effective from 1st October 2010:

These mandatory conditions apply were the licence authorises the supply of alcohol. The condition 5 does not apply where the licence authorises the sale by retail or supply of alcohol only for consumption off the premises.

- 4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that-
 - (a) Where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) Customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.



Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. There shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
- 2. A colour CCTV system to the specification of South Yorkshire Police will be fitted, maintained and in use at all times when the premises are open. CCTV images will be stored for 31 days. Police will be given access to the copies of images for purposes in connection with the prevention and detection of crime and disorder.
- 3. Alcoholic and other drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers save for consumption in any external area provided for that purpose.
- 4. No customers apparently carrying open bottles upon entry shall be admitted to the premises at any times the premises are open to the public.
- 5. Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted on the premises after 21:00 hours unless dining in the company of an adult.
- 6. A suitable member of staff must be designated with lead responsibility for issues relating to safeguarding children at the premises and this person must act in compliance with the guidance and training provided by the Sheffield Safeguarding Children Board.
- 7. The Challenge 21 scheme will be operated at the premises.
- 8. Noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises so as to cause a nuisance to nearby properties.
- 9. The Designated Premises Supervisor or a designated member of staff must take a pro active approach to noise control, checking outside the premise to ensure that noise is kept to a reasonable level from patrons using the external area and manage noise levels internally so as to be inaudible at the nearest noise sensitive property.
- 10. All doors and windows shall remain closed, save for access and egress, at all times whenever regulated entertainment is present in the premises, and after 22:00 hours on all days.
- 11. The Premises Licence Holder shall prominently display notices on all exits reminding patrons to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly fashion and to respect the local neighbours' needs.
- 12. Use of the external area is to cease entirely at 23:30 hours on each day and the holder of the premises licence or Designated Premises Supervisor is to take steps to advise persons to leave the area and return inside the building from 23:00 hours.
- 13. A satisfactory electrical certificate shall be provided for the premises.
- 14. A permanently fixed residual current device (RCD) must protect the electrical supply serving amplified music equipment.



15. When dancing is to take place on the premises in an area not previously approved for dancing by the Authority, at least 14 days notice must be given to Environment and Regulatory Services (Health Protection Service) and the Licensing Authority, identifying the area used which should be suitable and adequate in size as the designated dance floor for the intended use and dancing must take place in that area unless approved by the authority.

16. Indoor sporting events shall be restricted to traditional pub games.



Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 1. All promotional activity, including social media, is to be approved by the DPS.
- 2. All music, including live music shall run through a noise limiter, the level of which will be set by the Environmental Protection Service so that the music is not audible at the nearest residential property on Harcourt Road.
- 3. No music, including live music is to be played outside nor are loud speakers to be placed outside.
- 4. The door to the terrace is to be shut at 22:30 hours.
- 5. At the end of every evening, the curtilage of the premises is to be cleared of litter.
- 6. The premises are not to be made available to hire in its entirety for the purpose of a private party.

This emailed representation is made in accordance with the agreement with the Licensing Authority on the 18th October 2006 to accept representations by email.

Dear Mr Sangha,

I represent Sheffield City Council and acts as Responsible Authority for the Prevention of Public Nuisance in this matter. I am hereby notifying you of my objection to the notification submitted for this temporary event (TEN).

A similar event held at the premises over the Tramlines weekend has resulted in a number of noise complaints from residents living on Harcourt Road and backing onto Crookes Valley Park (where the premises are located, off Mushroom Lane). Residents complained of very high levels of noise intrusion, audible inside their homes even with windows shut, and preventing their enjoyment of their gardens throughout the duration of the event. Residents have also complained of increased littering of the park as a result of the event.

I am also minded of the decision made by committee when the premises licence was issued to prohibit outdoor noise and restrict use of outside areas. This was made in the context of representations received from local residents concerned about noise from the premises, particularly from music events and outdoor noise. I have attached a copy of the Committee's Notice of Determination for reference. This includes these statements in relation to noise:

"The Sub Committee considered whether or not the application to grant would undermine the licensing objectives. Their view was that the application would not undermine the licensing objectives. Members then looked at the main issue of noise and how this could be minimised. They looked at the amendments to the Operating Schedule as agreed prior to the hearing and determined to grant the licence in line with these amendments and applied modified conditions to the licence namely:

All promotional activity, including social media, to be approved by the DPS

All music, including live music, to run through a noise limiter, the level of which will be set by the Environmental Protection Service so that the music is not audiable at the nearest residential property on Harcourt Road.

No music, including live music, to be played outside nor loudspeakers to be placed outside.

The door to the terrace to be shut a 22.30 hours

At the end of every evening the curtilage of the premises is to be cleared of litter"

I hope that, should this matter progress to a formal hearing, the Committee will be mindful of the intentions conveyed in this earlier Determination and will use whatever mechanisms are available to enforce them in this case.

<u>Decision of the Licensing Board – 3rd April 2012 – The Dam House, Mushroom Lane, Sheffield, S3 7NZ</u>

This was an application for a new premises licence following the lapse of the previous licence. The applicant was seeking the hours for regulated entertainment from 08:00 hours to 23:00 hours Sunday to Wednesday and 08:00 hours to 23:30 hours Thursday to Saturdays, late night refreshment from 23:00 hours to 00:00 hours Sunday to Wednesday and 01:00 hours Thursday to Saturday and for the sale of alcohol from 08:00 hours to 00:00 hours Sunday to Wednesday and 08:00 hours to 01:00 hours Thursday to Saturday.

Before the hearing the applicant agreed to amend their operating schedule and as such representations received from the Environmental Protection Service, Health protection Service, Sheffield Safeguarding Children Board and South Yorkshire Police were withdrawn.

During the hearing the Applicants amended their application for late night refreshment by 30 minutes on each day.

Written representations were received from local residents detailing a number of issues. Residents and a Local Councillor attended the hearing and made the following representations which focussed around noise nuisance and public safety:

- Concern over the nature of the premises having seen conflicting advertising and social media posts;
- The noise from the premises should it be a student bar with late night cheap alcohol and music:
- The noise from patrons as they leave the premises;
- Protecting the public park in which the premises is situated;
- Protecting the safety of patrons from the lake in the park when they leave the premises;
- Broken glass and litter in the surrounding area.

Many other issues raised are not considerations for the Licensing Committee and as such were disregarded

The applicant addressed the sub-committee and stated that:

- The premises is to be rebranded and wants to offer an affordable family setting with a lower pricing structure than previously used at the premises;
- The premises had been empty for a long time before they purchased and walls which were damp and needed replastering were also sound proofed;
- DPS and Assistant DPS will be living on the premises with their children.
- A proactive approach will be taken to problem customers;

Right of attendance, assistance and representation

15. Subject to regulations 14(2) and 25, a party may attend the hearing and may be assisted or represented by any person whether or not that person is legally qualified.

Representations and supporting information

- 16. At the hearing a party shall be entitled to
 - (a) in response to a point upon which the authority has given notice to a party that it will want clarification under regulation 7(1)(d), give further information in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable),
 - (b) if given permission by the authority, question any other party; and
 - (c) address the authority

Failure of parties to attend the hearing
