1. PROPOSAL

- 1.1 In compliance with the September 2016 cabinet report recommendations this report seeks approval for the awards in the below table.
- 1.2 Please note that the cabinet report stated that whilst the council may choose, funds permitting, to award 100% of the year 1 amount in subsequent years groups have a guaranteed minimum of 80% of the year 1 value in year 2 and 75% of the year 1 value in year 3. The annual revenue budget report will set the exact amount each year.
- 1.3 The allocation of the Infrastructure Grant is recommended by a panel that considered the applications received. The award to VAS for Lunch Club Support and New Beginnings was stated in the September 2016 cabinet report.

- 1.5 The infrastructure award recommendation is following an open and competitive grant process and a report with recommendations considered by a panel chaired by Cllr Dianne Hurst.
- The awards to VAS New Beginnings and to VAS Lunch Club Support have been negotiated in compliance with the September 2016 cabinet report.

 All grant agreements will include monitoring against outcomes and activity to ensure that the Council investment is accounted for and impact measured.

Voluntary sector infrastructure support is vital to a strong, well-managed voluntary sector that can adapt to a changing world. The Council's support for infrastructure organisations enables capacity building across the sector as a whole. The summer 2016 consultation helped to set the priorities / outcomes of this infrastructure fund as well as research in the 2016 Sheffield State of the Sector Report. The grant panel found the VAS and SYFAB partnership bid to be the most holistic offer of all the applications received.

The VAS New Beginnings is a project developed by the VAS Volunteer Centre to assist the integration of refugees and support them to contribute to the life of the city by engaging in volunteering opportunities with local community organisations. This is a Core Service grant award as stated in the September 2016 cabinet report.

The VAS Lunch Club Support grant is to support and develop the city's lunch clubs with services such as volunteer recruitment, problem solving and developing activities in clubs.

3.1 Proposals in the September 2016 cabinet report for Infrastructure Fund grants were consulted on in summer 2016.

- 4.3.3 "3) approve the list of organisations prioritised for a Core Service Grants to start from April 2017 as detailed in Appendix 4 and the process for agreeing the value and length of each grant funding agreement." Which includes the Voluntary Action Sheffield New Beginnings project.
- 4.3.4 All the grant recipients will be issued with agreements that contain the relevant Sheffield City Council Terms & Conditions for such awards.
