Notice under Regulation 10: Key Decision where less than 28 days' public notice has been given

Pursuant to Regulation 10 of the Local Authorities (Executive Arrangements) (Meetings and Access to Information) (England) Regulations 2012 ('the Regulations'), **I hereby give Notice** that:-

The **Cabinet** intends to make a Key Decision on behalf of the Sheffield City Council **23rd September 2020**.

The Key Decision will be about the re-opening of Ponds Forge

It has not been possible to give 28 clear days' notice of the intention to make the Key Decision, as required by Regulation 9 (2) of the Regulations.

The reasons why compliance with Regulation 9 is impracticable in this matter are as follows:-

The need for the decision has arisen recently and it is desirable that it is made as soon as possible by Cabinet at its next meeting so there can be certainty for the Trust of the Council's funding intentions.

The Covid-19 pandemic has had a significant impact on SCT's ability to generate income from events at Ponds Forge and without additional funding from SCC it will not be possible for re-open Ponds Forge.
