What are Local Area Committees (LACs)



Local Area Committees (LACs) are a way for people to get involved in making a difference to their local communities. Some budgets have already been devolved to the LACs for them to be used on issues and priorities that residents and communities have told us are important to them.

LACs are a chance for people to influence decision making, share their opinion and contribute positive changes in their community. They are an opportunity for people to say what they would like to see improved in their area.

Whilst LACs have some initial devolved powers, the devolution of further powers will continue to evolve.



- The North of the Sheffield is a hidden gem with beautiful countryside and a strong sense of community
- Whilst the community has many strengths it also has many needs and contains pockets of deprivation
 The outlying and rural nature of the area brings
 - The outlying and rural nature of the area brings challenges in terms of access to services and concerns about overdevelopment and local infrastructure

- Higher than average elderly population (24% aged 65+ [England 18%])
- Below average unemployment (North 4.7%, England 6.6%) but higher than average youth unemployment (North 10.8%, England 9.2%)
 - Lower than average deprivation: 16% live in an area within 20% most deprived (England 20%)
 - Lower than average crime (North 77 crimes per 1000, England 100)

- Of Sheffield's 28 wards, the North wards are ranked 17th (East Ecclesfield), 18th (West Ecclesfield), 20th (Stocksbridge and Upper Don) & 21st (Stannington) least deprived
- High Green has 2 super output areas * in most deprived 10% in England
- Stocksbridge, Chapeltown and Parsons Cross have super output areas in most deprived 20% in England

^{*} An area of approx. 1500 homes

- Largest category is 'suburbanites' * (North 46%, England 21%)
- 24.5% ** 'hard pressed' (*England 17%*)

- Above average community needs score (North 106, England 68)
 - Need of civic assets above average (North 35, England 23)
 - Need for connectedness above average (North 55, England 21)
- North has double the England average for below average broadband universal service obligation
- Below average grant funding (grant awards per head, North £16, England £34)

^{*}Located on the outskirts, in areas with high owner occupation, high numbers of detached houses, low unemployment, high qualifications and high car ownership.



What we did

- ୍କ We engaged 903 people in the North during October and November.
 - 646 filled out an on-line survey
 - 257 filled out a paper survey either by talking to the staff team or Councillor at a community venue or by talking to one of our voluntary sector partners who carried out consultation for us. These were Stocksbridge Leisure Centre and Rivelin Co








Do you feel local people can influence decision making in their local area?

How easy is it to find out about news in your local area?



Goals for the area

1. The North is a connected place where people can access what they need to play an active part in their community

We will explore:

 - Routes to share community/ service information
 - Work focussed on supporting those in greatest need

Goals for the area

2. The North is a safe place to live in and travel around

We will explore:

- ှ- People's experience of local transport routes and other options such as community transport
- ୱ- Options for road safety around schools including 20mph zones
 - Installation of a Vehicle Activated Signs in each ward to flag excess speed
 - How to promote the integration of young people who have been housed in Council accommodation

We will explore:

- How we can support local high streets
- Improving play facilities, parks and open spaces
- Work to tackle graffiti, litter & fly tipping hotspots
