


# **Central Local Area Committee Public Meeting 27/09/2021 – Feedback**



### Hillsborough

Hillsborough: What do you love about where you live? Hillsborough: What can be improved in your area?	Traffic	<ul> <li>Fast cars! Worried about kids, cats, foxes and hedgehogs!</li> <li>What was so wrong about turning right outside Morrisons? Current situation is 3 traffic lights, kilometre longer. TRAFFIC/AIR QUALITY.</li> <li>Traffic calming measures urgently needed</li> <li>RH slip downhill on Penistone Rd after Sainsbury's makes Penistone Rd one lane in the peak because RH light change is too long. TRAFIC/AIR QUALITY.</li> <li>Traffic turning right off Holme Lane through to North West Sheffield avoiding tram gates creates massive issues – congestion, air quality, unsafe streets</li> </ul>	

	Services	<ul> <li>Help in Hillsborough used to provide basic services. Need systems for volunteering, advertising community groups &amp; growing what's there.</li> <li>Open Rivelin Splash regularly. 	Green Spaces	<ul> <li>Interested in the wasteland near Cuthbert Bank that is always deep in littler – but would be an excellent inner city nature reserve/park/city farm</li> <li>Park lake is a mess. Fisherman overnight using illegal rods – fishing line affecting wildlife</li> </ul>



There are estimated 32000 over 50 LGBT people with no facility to get help, advise, friendship. Isolation and loneliness is their life.
