Survey

The Local Area Committee Community Survey was open digitally from 31st August to 31st October 2021. We also distributed hundreds of paper copies of the survey from September to December 2021.

Public consultations






Underrepresentation

- Some neighbourhoods and groups of people are significantly unrepresented, for example: young sheffielders, those who don't own their own home and seldom heard groups.
- We have to do things differently to capture a wider voice and inform our future planning.



What next?

- Production and start of the implementation process of the Central LAC Community Plan
- Hold four public meetings per year and provide an update on the progress of the community plan - the next one will be in March to agree the community plan.
- Hold single issue meetings on topics of local interest where and when appropriate.
- Continue to engage and consult with communities to review priorities for the area.
- Provide an annual report on the community plan and progress it to Full Council every year.
- Represent the interest of its communities with the Council and with other bodies / organisations as appropriate to achieve the objectives of the community plan.
