Legal Implications

- The Council can rely upon the general power of competence under section 1 of the Localism Act 2011 to enter into the Grant Letter for the provision of this grant funding and incurring expenditure on the project deliverables. Section 1 provides the Council with the power to take reasonable action it needs 'for the benefit of the authority, its area or persons resident or present in its area'.
- The grant funding is for a maximum of £257,427 and is for the purpose of the Council submitting a Full Business Case for a cycle route in the valley of the River Sheaf integrating recently completed, currently in construction and future transport and land use investments.
- The terms and conditions of the grant are reasonably standard for relatively straightforward activities such as those covered by this grant. Officers delivering the grant funded activities must be aware of and deliver the Council's obligations. These include obligations on providing monitoring information, delivery of the outputs by the submission date and some project-specific special conditions.
- The grants can be terminated for events of default and SCC could be required to

	repay part or all of the grant in such circumstances. This includes the right for the Sheffield City Region to terminate in the event that the Department for Transport requests the Grant be withheld or repaid, which may not have any direct link to SCC's performance of the grant terms. • If the Council wishes to procure any third parties to support the preparation of the Full Business Case, the process and any contract award must be undertaken in accordance with all relevant provisions of the Council's Constitution including its Contracts Standing Orders, as well as the Public Contracts Regulations 2015 if above the estimated value exceeds the relevant financial threshold.
