Proposal name

Food Waste Recycling Collection Trial

Brief aim(s) of the proposal and the outcome(s) you want to achieve

The Environment Act was enacted into UK law in 2021 and sets out the mandatory requirement to introduce separate, weekly food waste collections - timescale to be confirmed by Government.

Discussions are underway with Veolia to plan for the delivery of a citywide food waste recycling service. However, the wide-ranging factors and influences on scheme performance (as evidenced by other Local Authorities already collecting food waste), and lack of experience of operating food waste collections in Sheffield makes it difficult to model resource requirements, and associated costs.

The proposal is to deliver a 12-week separate food waste collection trial for approximately 8,000 households from September to December. The purpose of this trial will be to test the real-life experience of operating food waste collections in Sheffield and inform resource requirements for the future expansion of a permanent food waste collection service across the city. The duration and size of the proposed trial has been determined to provide sufficient data to inform the roll out of food waste collections citywide.

The properties included within the trial will be a from a selection of areas which make up a cross section of the City as per Acorn profiling and will include a range of different socio-demographic areas. The Waste and Street Scene Committee will decide on the areas to be included within the trial.

Initial Impact Overview

Based on the information about the proposal what will the overall equality impact?

Overall there are no significant differential, positive or negative, equality impacts from this proposal. The trial should have a positive impact by providing an improved recycling service for customers.

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Assisted collections are available for customers who due to an age related or medical reason are unable to present their wheeled bins for collection. Customers receiving an assisted collection for their wheeled bin will automatically receive an assisted collection for their food waste collection.

We are aware that the food waste caddies are smaller than the wheeled bins used for the existing waste and recycling collections. The extra container placed out for collection on the pavement, alongside the smaller nature of the caddy which may make them more difficult to see, may present an increased issue for people with visual impairments, using wheelchairs and pushchairs, when using the pavement. The impact will be assessed and feedback analysed as part of the trial, to inform any future decision to roll out permanent, citywide collections.
