Community Plan Themes



The comments, ideas and suggestions provided at the engagement sessions held at the SW LAC Public Meeting 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2024 are listed below.

Please note, the SW LAC will work through the suggestions and look at what we can do on a local community level. Where relevant, we will raise larger items with the wider services.

## Transport & Highways Theme

#### Ideas & suggestions:

- Explore a Community Phone Watch Project (drivers using their mobiles).
- Expand the Community Speed Watch recruit more volunteers in Crookes and Crosspool and Fulwood and consider purchasing more speed guns.
- Parking around schools remains a big problem park safe is a great scheme.
- Have a cycle lane on Ringinglow Rd between Bents Green and the Norfolk Arms.
- Engage more with adults could have a network of responsible drivers.
- Introduce an App for people to discuss Transport issues.
- Community Speed Watch not in favour of this. It needs to be the authoroties who enforce and not residents.
- Something needs to be done around the state of the road surfaces.
- More enforcement of parking.
- Need to look at what can be done to tackle congestion around schools.
- Smartwatches for school pupils to encourage walking to school.
- Explore safer routes for children to walk to school dropped kerbs etc.
- More publicity around the Community Speed Watch i.e. share where the sites are.
- Promote Active Travel with schools encourage pupils to walk.
- Better enforcement of double yellows outside schools the process needs to be improved.
- Issue with Taxis parking on the pavement outside Nether Green Junior School.
- Promote Operation Park Safe we don't know about this.
- Schools should have travel plans can these be explored?
- Parking permit scheme for Crookes.

# Local Environment Theme

### a) Fly tipping ideas / suggestions

- Lack of waste refuse sites.
- Overwhelmed bring sites (Clough Road, Sheep Hill Road, etc.).
- Addressing flytipping at its source rather than reactive solutions.
- Consideration of CCTV installation.
- Sanctions and charges for offenders.
- Education and awareness campaigns.
- More awareness for Redmires bring site.
- Improved signage on the streets near to a bring site (so people know that it is there).

#### b) Recycling and Refuse ideas / suggestions

- Capacity and location of bring sites is an issue.
- Need for more recycling centres.
- Pop-up recycling sites.
- Community bin days.
- Disposal of specific items (flimsy plastics).
- Lack of recycling sites in Crookes.
- Free cycling awareness.
- Bring out your rubbish days.
- Big waste disposal vans that come round the area on a rota- current council call out cost is £80.
- Awareness of recycling sites across the LAC.
- Improve awareness of bring sites.

#### c) Public Facilities & Spaces ideas / suggestions

- Accessibility of public toilets in public areas.
- Reopening public toilets (Ecclesall Woods, Crookes).
- Utilizing and maintaining community hubs.
- Repurposing old buildings.
- Shepherd Wheel dam rewilding project- been no progress- Allotment committee want to rent land.
- Tree planting for biodiversity and air quality improvement.
- A tap for Lydgate Green.
- Bradway Ground maintenance to get to the play equipment/access.
- Can we link in with schools and try and get them to educate around pupils littering.
- Need for more wildflower planting on Redmires Rd to encourage insects and bees.

• Shephard Wheel Dam & next to the allotment – what is happening with this site? It was going to be a wildflower meadow.

#### d) Tree planting ideas / suggestions

- Public liability concerns.
- Understanding legal aspects (Section 142).
- Promote Section 142 for planting on verges outside your home, in schools, community groups and clubs.
- Questions regarding legality of actions.
- How much can residents get away with which Amey will ignore? (E.g. if you scrape top level of soil but don't dig deep).
- No tree planting in Porter Valley why not?
- Need to plant more trees in parks.
- Specific funds for tree planting for Friends of Groups.

### e) Environmental Concerns

- Air quality monitoring and information promote and improve.
- Biodiversity initiatives support them.
- Carbon reduction schemes.
- 'Low carbon community and culture project'.
- Changing behaviour on energy and water usage.
- Can LACs fund a thermal imaging camera to see how effectively houses keep in heat? Can then run a scheme to support these houses.
- Can Friends of Groups take on street art offer?

### f) Community Engagement and Support

- Establishing communication channels (WhatsApp group for LAC).
- Ground maintenance and support for community projects easy way for groups to get support.
- Need for signage at busier bring sites to direct to other sites.

### g) Infrastructure and Maintenance

- Addressing maintenance issues (e.g. with mowing).
- Support and advice for community initiatives.
- Monitoring and managing public spaces.
- Advice and support around funding streams.
- Consider what happens in Chesterfield for waste.
- Improve the condition of bring sites.
- Awareness of Officer roles and responsibilities.

### h) Specific Projects

- Status updates on various sites and projects (Old Fulwood Garage, abandoned spaces in Southwest, etc.).
- Low Carbon Community and Culture Project.
- Behaviour projects on energy and water usage.
- None of the current schemes involve carbon reduction. Could future schemes have this as a focus.

- Litter campaign with schools.
- Engage Youth Service with groups to do environmental projects.
- Inform local businesses around how they can get art on their shutters.

## Community & Neighbourhoods Theme

#### Ideas & suggestions:

- Set up a Men's Group in the Area.
- Help set up a Forum in Fulwood (like the Ecclesall Forum).
- Set up a Community Food shop in SW.
- Set up a Community Cinema, host an event for the area to bring people together (Totley Cric have one!)
- Improve the information & publicity for events happening in the area (Lunch Clubs, exercise sessions, etc.)
- Need to get better access to community transport (more flexible booking system).
- Best Practice Transport 17. Works well and should be run further into other communities.
- Being open to working across ward boundaries and multiple LACs to fund projects (e.g. St Oswalds Welcoming Space).
- LAC Seed money has facilitated one welcoming space project to get lottery funding which has given them 2 years stability and allowed additional activities to be added to the core programme.
- More welcoming places can use pubs, churches etc as venues.
- Promote welcome places in GP surgeries and post offices.
- Link in with Social Prescribing workers would like to see more support for people with dementia across the area.
- Be mindful of new groups that might need help and support with funding etc.
- What support can we give in the community for children with additional needs?
- After school clubs/activities.
- Family health support is needed.
- Health and Wellbeing how can the LAC support in the prevention sphere?
- Consider whether prevention/health concerns be at the forefront of all decisions re LAC budget allocation and spending?
- Sharing of information and contacts within the area to support new community groups to encourage best practice and collaboration.
- Could there be some encouragement to voluntary organisations that support children with autism/learning disabilities?
- Will the £13K donation to Citizens Advice be repeated?
- Share information on the success of funded projects under the Isolation and Loneliness.
- Trial a Good Neighbour Scheme.
- Improve access to Cllrs. Be more visible, engage more both ways and have surgeries.
- More of the PKW events.
- What was the outcome of the scoping for supporting local businesses?

- Not many people know about the LAC you need to be more visible. Can you get a shop?
- What is happening to support local businesses to stop them closing?
- Isolation & Loneliness funding seems to be going well but where are events advertised? How do the lonely know about them?
- Share information on how events/applications are monitored.
- Totley District Nurses are being kicked out of their office and moved to Lightwood. What can be done? It is going to cause a problem.
- Transport is an issue for people attending the welcoming places. What can be done?
- Publicity seems to be an issue for events. One website to check would be good.
