Page 61	<p>Levelling Up Fund – Child Health Technology</p> <p>Background</p> <p>The CHT Project is to deliver the world’s most advanced and integrated healthcare system for children. An on-site healthcare ecosystem that will bring together industry, academia, clinicians, patients and families to create high value child healthcare products at pace. It will accelerate development of the Olympic Legacy Park, attracting national and international investment, creating high value jobs, developing new companies and generating upwards of £2 billion of GVA.</p> <p>The CCHT directly supports the NHS Long-Term Plan, addressing regional health inequalities.</p> <p>Sheffield City Council has agreed to provide funding for the construction works. The funding will be passed via a grant agreement.</p> <p>Legal Implications</p> <p>The Council has a general power under Section 1 of the Localism Act 2011 to do anything that an individual may generally do provided it is not prohibited by other legislation and the power is exercised in accordance with the limitations specified in the Act which enables the Council to provide funding for this project. The grant provided by the Council is to be used towards capital works, in accordance with the terms and conditions detailed in the Grant Agreement. Key points to note from the Agreement are: - Contract commencement 1st December 2024, Delivery Commencement – 1 February 2025 Expiry – 30 March 2026. Payment is to be made in advance on 1st December 2024. This payment should only be made once the grant agreement is entered. Payment is to be used towards construction costs for the centre. The recipient of the grant must provide financial and operational reports (including risk register and insurance reviews) on its use of the grant. Sheffield Children NHS Foundation Trust 8,848,100</p> <p>The grant can be reduced, withdrawn, suspended or require repayment in specific circumstances for example if the grant is used for purposes other than the project development works or if the Council considers that the recipient has not made satisfactory progress with the delivery of the project.
